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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX.

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AN ACT to extend the act entitled “an act to authorize the city of Bangor to aid the construction of the European and North American Railway.”

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. The act entitled “an act to authorize  
2 the city of Bangor to aid the construction of the Euro-  
3 pean and North American Railway,” approved March  
4 twenty-fifth, eighteen hundred sixty-four, is hereby  
5 extended for the further term of two years, so that the  
6 provisions of said act shall continue in full force and  
7 apply to the grant of aid from said city, in case the  
8 line of said railway is extended to Lincoln within three

9 years from the time of the approval hereof by the  
10 governor.

SECT. 2. This act shall not take effect until it shall  
2 have been duly accepted by the said city of Bangor,  
3 by a vote of the legal voters thereof voting in ward  
4 meetings duly and legally called within eleven months  
5 from and after its approval and by a majority of at  
6 least three-fourths of the legal voters of said city,  
7 present and voting at said meetings as aforesaid. The  
8 returns of such ward meetings shall be made to the  
9 aldermen of said city, and by them counted and de-  
10 clared, and the clerk of said city shall make record  
11 thereof, and if the act shall be accepted as aforesaid,  
12 then after such acceptance and record thereof, all the  
13 parts of this act shall take effect, and be in full force  
14 thereafter.

SECT. 3. This act will take effect on its approval by  
2 the governor.
