IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX.

AN ACT additional to provide for vaccination.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Every city, town and plantation in this
- 2 state, shall provide for the inoculation of its inhabi-
- 3 tants with cow-pox, and raise all necessary sums of
- 4 money to defray the expense thereof; and it shall be
- 5 the duty of their municipal officers to employ some
- 6 competent physician in the county, who shall keep on
- 7 hand, good vaccine matter, and who shall vaccinate at
- 8 public charge all children or scholars who shall require
- 9 the same to be done; and he shall, before the thirty-
- 10 first of December of each year, return to the clerk's
- 11 office a true and proper list of persons vaccinated by

- 12 him during the year, and shall append thereto his cer-
- 13 tificate that he has ascertained by personal inspection
- 14 that the vaccination was successful.
 - Sect. 2. It shall be the duty of superintending
 - 2 school committees to exclude from schools under their
 - 3 supervision, all scholars who have not been vaccinated.
 - SECT. 3. If the municipal officers of any city, town
 - 2 or plantation shall neglect or refuse to comply with the
 - 3 provisions of this act, they shall forfeit and pay not
 - 4 less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dol-
 - 5 lars for such offence, to be recovered by indictment on
 - 6 complaint to the supreme judicial court, one half to
 - 7 the use of the complainant and the remainder thereof
 - 8 to the use of the county in which the offence was
 - 9 committed.
 - SECT. 4. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with
 - 2 the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.
 - Sect. 5. This act shall take effect from and after
 - 2 its approval by the governor.
