STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in behalf of the gratuitous instruction of the children of fallen and disabled heroes of the state.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be authorized and

2 directed to pay annually to the trustees of Gorham
3 Seminary and of the three other literary institutions in
4 this state, to be designated by the governor and coun5 cil, which shall comply with the terms and conditions
6 hereinafter named, the interest of ten thousand dollars
7 each, for the gratuitous instruction therein (including
8 all necessary text books) of the poor and destitute
9 children of those soldiers and seamen of this state who
10 have died or been disabled in the military or naval
11 service of the country during the late war; and when-

12 ever the number of such pupils availing themselves of 13 the benefits hereby provided for them shall not be suffi14 ciently large to exhaust the interest as aforesaid, the 15 same shall be applied to the gratuitous instruction of 16 indigent and meritorious persons to be selected by the 17 governor and council; and that in lieu of said interest 18 the sum of ten thousand dollars be paid to the trustees 19 of each of said institutions for the purposes and objects 20 hereinbefore named, when the state shall have received 21 the first instalment of the amount claimed from, or 22 which may be paid by, the United States on account 23 of military service during the late war; provided and 24 upon condition that, before payment to either of said 25 institutions of the interest or principal as aforesaid, 26 satisfactory evidence shall be furnished to the governor and council that the trustees of the institutions asking 28 such payment have actually raised and safely invested 29 the sum of twenty thousand dollars, inclusive of all 30 funds, donations or subscriptions heretofore raised or 31 obtained for other purposes than those contemplated 32 by this resolve, the interest of which shall also be ex-33 pended for and in furtherance of the objects aforesaid; 34 and provided also, that said trustees, upon the receipt 35 from the state treasurer of said principal sum, shall, 36 in each instance, safely invest the same to constitute a 37 permanent fund for the aforesaid objects, the interest 38 only to be expended therefor; and provided also, that 39 the institution claiming the benefit of the provisions of

40 this resolve shall raise the amount required as aforesaid

41 within one year from the approval thereof by the

42 governor.
