HOUSE. No. 73.

Amendment to resolve (House, No. 58,) in behalf of the gratuitous instruction of the children of fallen and disabled heroes of the state, proposed by Mr. Farrington of Fryeburg.

Amend by striking out all after the word resolve and insert:

That whenever any of the poor and needy children of

- 2 those soldiers and seamen of this state, who have died
- 3 or been disabled in the military or naval service of the
- 4 country during the late war, shall apply to the gover-
- 5 nor and council for aid for the purpose of procuring
- 6 text books and paying their tuition at such literary
- 7 institutions as they see fit to attend, they shall cause
- 8 to be paid to such designated institutions, sufficient
- 9 sums for that purpose; provided, the amount shall not
- 10 exceed the sum of two thousand dollars.
