STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX.

AN ACT to amend chapter two hundred and sixty-four of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-four, entitled “an act requiring the secretary of state to furnish the clerks of courts in the several counties, a list of all persons commissioned and qualified as justices of the peace, justices of the peace and quorum, trial justices and notaries public.”

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section first of said chapter is hereby amended by
2 inserting after the word *counties* in the second line,
3 and after the word *clerks* in the ninth line, the words,
4 *and to the judges of the several municipal and police*

5 *courts*, so that the said section as amended shall read
6 as follows :

SECTION 1. The secretary of state shall, on or before
2 the first day of June next, forward to the clerks of
3 courts in the several counties, and to the judges of the
4 municipal and police courts, a list of all justices of the
5 peace, justices of the peace and quorum, trial justices
6 and notaries public, in this state, whose qualifications
7 have been filed in his office. Such list shall contain
8 the name and place of residence of every such officer,
9 the date of his commission, and the county or counties
10 for which he is commissioned. And he shall forward
11 to said clerks and judges of the several municipal and
12 police courts, on the first day of December and of
13 June annually thereafter, a similar list of all such
14 officers commissioned and qualified during such pre-
15 ceding period of six months.
