REPORT.

LAND OFFICE, December 1, 1866.

To the Governor and Council of Maine :

I have the honor herewith to submit the Annual Report of the operations of this department, which with the schedule annexed, exhibits the operations of the Land Office for the current year.

The attention of the State has been occupied these many years to bring from its abnormal condition, the territory embraced within the six easterly ranges, and with marked success.

The liberal measures at the start, about the year 1839, indicated by wise and discriminating legislation, have been continued from year to year by judicious appropriations in lands and money as required by the expansion and settlement upon the public domain. And her policy has been accepted and appreciated, as is evinced by the growth and prosperity of a population covering thousands of acres of well tilled land in organized towns, containing thriving villages acting with force and harmony each upon the other, creating by the process, new elements for penetrating further into the primeval forest.

These accumulating forces have been organized by persistent effort and toil, and for continued success, very much will depend upon enterprises in process of development, to enable the citizen of Aroostook to enjoy communication with the older sections of the State.

The system of settlement as originally inaugurated, fails to supply the growing wants of a people whose associations were homogenous with the early settlements of the State, from whence they have gone to participate in opening up our new territory in the northern part; and the restless desire for social intercourse, and transit for their products, will press upon the attention of the State, in proportion as these wants accumulate, with remote prospects for relief.

Fortunately however, by individual effort, continued with the assurance given by the Legislature of our State in 1864, and measures now pending in Congress, there is about to open a new era to our people, by furnishing railway facilities to the towns of Winn and Mattawamkeag on the Penobscot river ; and the magnitude of this enterprise must be more than realized in its effects upon industrial pursuits in all the territory lying north and east of the termini at these towns.

The inhabitants along the eastern border would gladly avail themselves of the markets in their own State, but by force of circumstances are compelled to seek an outlet through the Province of New Brunswick ; a condition of things requiring, and which doubtless will receive, the earnest attention of the Legislature, now that the enterprise has assumed such proportions as will insure success.

In pursuance of the provision of law contained in section 32, chapter 5, revised statutes, parcels of the public lands were set apart " under the direction of the Governor and Council " in February last to be offered for sale, care being exercised to offer such tracts as would in the sale command the attention of purchasers by reason of proximity to proprietary lands ; and in other cases where the tract was exposed to trespass requiring extra expense for protection ; and the sales were made on the first day of September at prices exceeding the minimum.

Judicious sales from the land set apart for the Permanent School Fund is recommended to be continued, as there cannot be realized from the sale of lumber upon them, any very considerable sum annually.

Conveyances by deed have been made of 15,114 acres of land taken up for settlement, upon surrender of the Land Certificates ; three thousand eight hundred fifty-nine (3,859) acres under resolves ; nine thousand four hundred eight (9,408) acres have been contracted and Land Certificates issued for performance of settling duties ; one hundred nineteen thousand six hundred thirty-four (119,634) acres conveyed for cash and cash securities.

For details and description, reference to schedules marked A, B, C and D is made, containing the names of grantees, numbers of lots, quantities and amounts received for sales.

Allusion was made in my last annual report to the " Act for the establishment of Normal Schools," and in conformity to a resolve

entitled, "Resolve authorizing the Land Agent to convey certain lots of land and timber to M. S. Drummond and David Fuller," approved February 26, 1866, a deed has been executed to the parties, and the further sum of \$3,180 00 paid into the State Treasury in aid of the schools as contemplated in the Act approved March 25, 1863.

In conformity with the requirements of the resolve appropriating the "timber and lumber" on a township of land for "educational purposes," approved March 28, 1864, efforts have been made by advertising for proposals as prescribed in the resolve referred to, without success until the present season.

Following the terms of an additional resolve for the same object, approved February 26, 1866, proposals were invited during the present year and received for the sum of \$8,500 00, made conditionally and submitted to the Executive for advice, with other bids made in various forms.

If upon further examination of the matter it shall be deemed for the interest of the State to accept the proposition, additional authority will be required to enable the Land Agent to execute a permit in form and receive the funds to be applied for purposes specified in the resolve of 1864.

The condition of the roads through the more important parts of the county has been much improved, and with moderate expenditures of money, mixed with road labor due from settlers, the public will continue to be favored with easy approaches to many points.

The bridge over Fish river on the road leading to Fort Kent had become dangerous, but has been placed in safe condition at a moderate cost; that also at the mouth of Fish river has been repaired during the season by Col. David Page and Mr. Harper Allen at the reasonable sum of \$600 00, and will require no additional repairs to protect the public against accident. Slight repairs have also been made upon the bridge over little Madawaska.

The road from Limestone plantation through township F, R. 1, has been grubbed out, and will be further improved as the public travel presses through. The road from Caribou to township 14, R. 4, has received an expenditure of \$400 00 under the direction of J. D. Teague, Esq., and with assistance of Mr. M. L. Durgin, the road is made passable, leading through an excellent township (14, R. 3,) towards the Fish river road; a moderate expenditure for further repairs upon the same is very desirable.

That part of Fish river road leading through the French settlements in townships 16, R. 7 and 17, R. 7 has been much improved; and the settlers upon the road leading easterly into Township No. 17, R. 6, towards Eagle and Cross Lakes, have been very active and made creditable improvement.

The business marts of the northerly part of the county, viz: Ashland, Fort Kent, Presque Isle, Caribou, Fort Fairfield and Van Buren, exhibit activity and thrift, clearly indicating a steady material progress and success of the people in the communities about them engaged in agricultural pursuits.

The sum of \$44,180 00 has been paid into the State Treasury; and indications are favorable for additional collections and payments the coming year.
