## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter fifty of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-six, so as to allow county treasurers a compensation for services rendered under said statute.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section two, chapter fifty of the public 2 laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-six, entitled "an 3 act relating to hawkers and pedlers," is hereby 4 amended by inserting in the tenth line of said section, 5 after "treasury of the state," the following words: 6 excepting five per cent. thereof, which is hereby fixed 7 as the compensation receivable by them for services

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8 rendered under this law, so that said section as amen-9 ded shall read as follows :

The county commissioners may license for Sect. 2. 2 the purpose aforesaid, any person who proves to their **3** satisfaction that he sustains a good moral character, 4 and has been five years a citizen of the United States, 5 and such licenses shall expire in one year from their 6 date, and shall not be transferable; and the person 7 receiving such license shall pay therefor to the county 8 treasurer, if he is to sell or offer to sell by retail, ten 9 dollars; if by wholesale, twenty-five dollars; and 10 said county treasurers shall pay all moneys received 11 by them for such licenses into the treasury of the state, 12 excepting five per cent. thereof, which is hereby fixed 13 as the compensation receivable by them for services 14 rendered under this law; but nothing herein shall pre-15 vent any citizen of this state from selling any fish, 16 fruit, provisions, farming utensils or other articles 17 lawfully raised or manufactured in this state.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its approval.
