#### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to protect the rights of Indians of the Penobscot tribe in certain islands.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Whenever any damage is done directly
- 2 or indirectly to the grass or crops on any island within
- 3 the limits of the Penobscot Boom, which has been duly
- 4 assigned to any of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, or
- 5 is in the occupancy of any of said Indians, or when-
- 6 ever any other damage is done to the land of any such
- 7 island directly or indirectly, by any act of the Penob-
- 8 scot Boom Corporation which said corporation is not
- 9 authorized by law to do, the party so injured may
- 10 maintain an action of tresspass therefor against said

- 11 corporation in any court proper to try the same, to the
- 12 same extent as though the fee were in the plaintiff, or
- 13 plaintiffs; provided compensation for such damage has,
- 14 previous to the commencement of the action, been de-
- 15 manded by the agent of said tribe of the treasurer of
- 16 said corporation, and payment been neglected or re-
- 17 fused for the term of fifteen days.
  - Sect. 2. This act shall take effect upon its approval.
