STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES in favor of the Northern Pacific Railroad Company.

WHEREAS, the construction of a railroad to the Pacific 2 ocean by the northern route is an enterprise of great 3 national importance, opening for occupation, as it will, 4 a vast extent of our richest and most productive agri-5 cultural and mineral lands, and providing a thorough-6 fare across our continent in a location most favorable 7 for health and convenient for the travel and commerce, 8 not only of this country, but of Europe and Asia; and 9 WHEREAS, the legislature and people of Maine have 10 long deemed the construction of this road a matter of 11 special interest to this state, as well as of national 12 importance, for both commercial and military pur-13 poses, therefore

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Resolved, That our senators in congress be instructed 2 and our representatives be requested to use their best 3 efforts to procure such aid from the general govern-4 ment as will secure the construction of this road at the 5 earliest practicable time.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to transmit 2 a copy of the foregoing preamble and resolution to 3 each of our senators and representatives in congress, 4 and also to the president of the United States.
