STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES relating to reconstruction.

Resolved, That the permanent peace of the nation

- 2 can be secured only by a firm adherence to the self-
- 3 evident truth that all men are created equal.

Resolved, That political power being an inherent right

- 2 of the citizen, impartial suffrage should be made the
- 3 uniform rule of all the states of the Union, either by
- 4 the authority already possessed by congress or by the
- 5 necessary amendment of the constitution of the United
- 6 States.

Resolved, That the present state governments of the

- 2 recently rebel states of Virginia, North Carolina, South
- 3 Carolina, Georgia, Mississippi, Alabama, Louisiana,
- 4 Florida, Texas and Arkansas, were established outside
- 5 of the legal authority of the nation and without the
- 6 sanction of the people whom they assume to represent,

- 7 and that it is the duty of congress to annul them and
- 8 adopt the necessary steps for instituting loyal state
- 9 governments which shall afford liberty and protection
- 10 to all the people over whom they exercise authority.
