## STATE OF MAINE.

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SLXTY-SEVEN.

AN $\Lambda \mathrm{CT}$ providing for the appointment of weighers of coal.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Anthracite, bituminous or mineral coal, 2 shall be sold by weight, and two thousand pounds 3 avoirdupois shall be the standard for the ton by which 4 the same shall be weighed.

Sect. 2. The municipal officers of cities and towns 2 may annually appoint weighers of such coal, who shall 3 be duly sworn, and receive such fees as said officers 4 may establish, to be paid by the buyer.

Sect. 3. The seller of such coal, when not sold by 2 the cargo, shall cause the same to be weighed by a

[^0]3 sworn weigher, who shall make a certificate of the 4 weight thereof, and the seller shall not be entitled to 5 rccover or commence any action for the price of such 6 coal, until he shall deliver or cause to be delivered to 7 the buyer such certificate ; provided however, that it 8 shall be competent for the parties to agree upon the 9 quantity of coal without such survey or liability.
