STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes relating to auctions and auctioneers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Section third of chapter thirty-four of
2 the revised statutes is hereby amended in the third
3 line by striking out the words "to whom sold," and
4 inserting the words "the prices for which the same
5 were sold," so that as amended that clause shall read,
6 "every person licensed shall keep a fair and particular
7 account of all goods and chattels by him sold, stating
8 of whom received and the prices for which the same
9 were sold.

SECT. 2. Section five of said chapter is hereby

2 amended by striking out in the third line the words
3 “of his own,” so that amended it shall read, if any
4 auctioneer receives any goods for sale at public auction
5 of any servant or minor, knowing him to be such, or
6 sells any goods before sunrise or after sunset at public
7 auction, he shall forfeit a sum not less than fifty nor
8 more than one hundred and seventy dollars for each
9 offence.

SECT. 3. The municipal officers of any town may
2 license any duly licensed auctioneer specially, to sell
3 goods and chattels after sunset, and demand and re-
4 ceive therefor a sum not exceeding twenty dollars for
5 each license so granted.
