STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES providing for the publication of the statutes
of this state.

Resolved, That Eugene Hale of Ellsworth, and Edwin
2 B. Smith of Saco, are hereby appointed commissioners
3 to edit a new edition of the revised statutes in one vol-
4 ume, and to edit and embody in another volume all
5 the public laws of this state since eighteen hundred
6 fifty-seven ; said commissioners shall carefully prepare
7 and incorporate into said new edition of the revised
8 statutes marginal notes containing references to all
9 public statutes enacted since eighteen hundred fifty-
10 seven, and also to any such decisions as shall be in the
11 judgment of the commissioners advisable, and said
12 references shall be placed on the margin of the chapter
13 and sections affected by such subsequent legislation or
14 decisions, and the second volume provided for in this

15 resolve shall also contain marginal references to sec-
16 tions and chapters of the revised statutes or any sub-
17 sequent public law affected by any of the provisions of
18 any statute embodied in said second volume.

Resolved, When the commissioners named in the first
2 resolve have completed the edition of the revised stat-
3 utes and the subsequent laws therein provided for, the
4 governor and council are hereby empowered to contract
5 with some suitable person or persons for the publication
6 of volumes of said edition of the revised statutes
7 and volumes of the subsequent laws as edited
8 under the provisions of the first resolve, and the gov-
9 ernor and council are hereby authorized to examine
10 and audit the account of said commissioners for their
11 services, and the governor may draw his warrant on
12 the treasurer for the same.
