STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE relating to national affairs.

WHEREAS, the loyal people of Maine believe and will

- 2 never cease to insist that equal justice and equal lib-
- 3 erty and equal legal protection are the inalienable
- 4 right of all men of whatever race or color, that there
- 5 should be no restraints but those laws that are common
- 6 to all citizens, and no denial of political rights to male
- 7 citizens of the age of twenty-one years or upward,
- 8 except in punishment of treason or other crime, that
- 9 loyal men must rule our national destinies; and
- 10 Whereas, treason and rebellion deprived the people
- 11 of ten of the lately rebellious states of all civil gov-
- 12 ernment; therefore

Resolved, That those states should now be re-organ-

2 ized under authority of the congress of the United

- 3 States, through the action of the loyal people of those
- 4 states, under organic laws that fully guarantee and
- 5 secure the full benefit of these great principles to all
- 6 the people thereof, and withhold political power from
- 7 traitors therein, before it is proper to re-admit those

- 9 the United States.
