IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to remove the disability to marry between persons of different race.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section third of chapter fifty-nine of
- 2 the revised statutes, in relation to marriage and its
- 3 solemnization, is hereby amended by striking out the
- 4 following words, viz: "No white person shall inter-
- 5 marry with a negro, indian or mulatto; and"
 - SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its approval
- 2 by the governor.

AMENDMENT "A" PROPOSED BY MR. CROSBY.

Amend by inserting the following section between the first and second section:

Sect. 2. When the marriage ceremony has hereto2 fore been solemnized between such persons by a person
3 duly authorized to solemnize marriages, such marriage
4 is hereby declared to be valid; and if the husband is
5 living at the time of the approval of this act by the
6 governor, the laws of descent and distribution applica7 ble to legitimate children are applicable to the children
8 of such marriage; but so far as relates to the laws
9 applicable to paupers, the validity of such marriage
10 shall be considered as commencing at the time of said
