STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to authorize the Leeds and Farmington Railroad Company to make a lease and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. The Leeds and Farmington Railroad
- 2 Company is hereby authorized and empowered to make
- 3 a lease of its railroad extending from Leeds crossing
- 4 to Farmington, with all its rolling stock, tools and
- 5 other tangible personal property appurtenant thereto,
- 6 with the franchise of said company, to the Androscog-
- 7 gin Railroad Company for a term of years.
 - Sect. 2. The Leeds and Farmington Railroad Com-
- 2 pany is hereby authorized to sell and convey its
- 3 said railroad, with all its rolling stock, tools and other

Stevens & Sayward, Printers to the State.

- 4 tangible personal property, appurtenant thereto, with
- 5 the franchise of said corporation, to the Androscoggin
- 6 Railroad Company; provided that the directors of said
- 7 company shall have no power to make such sale unless
- 8 authorized to do so by a vote of the stockholders in a
- 9 meeting legally called for that purpose, but such sale
- 10 shall not impair any rights or take away or diminish
- 11 any remedies of the creditors of either of said cor-
- 12 porations.
