IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN. \bullet

AN ACT amendatory and additional to chapter three of the revised statutes in relation to towns, their meetings, powers and duties.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Section ten of chapter three of the re-
- 2 vised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the
- 3 words "five or seven" in the third line, and the words
- 4 "or more" in the fifth line.
 - Sect. 2. The selectmen, assessors and overseers of
- 2 the poor respectively, at their first meeting, shall des-
- 3 ignate by lot one of their number to hold office three
- 4 years, and another two years, and certify such desig-
- 5 nation to the town clerk, to be by him recorded. The

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- 6 third member shall hold office one year; and each
- 7 member elected to fill the place of one whose term
- 8 expires, shall hold office three years.
- Sect. 3. When by reason of non-acceptance, death
- 2 or removal, or by reason of insanity or other incompe-
- 3 tency, there is a vacancy, the person chosen to fill the
- 4 place shall hold office during the unexpired term of
- 5 the person whose place is vacated, and no longer un-
- 6 less re-chosen for another term.
 - Sect. 4. This act embraces organized plantations so
- 2 far as applicable, and shall take effect and be in force
- 3 in each town and organized plantation on and after its
- 4 annual meeting in March, in the year of our Lord one
- 5 thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
