#### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT additional to chapter six of the revised statutes, in relation to the collection of taxes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Every collector, or constable, or other
- 2 person required to collect state, county or town taxes,
- 3 in cities and towns containing more than twenty-five
- 4 hundred inhabitants according to the next preceding
- 5 United States census, shall collect interest on taxes
- 6 remaining unpaid at the expiration of four months
- 7 from the time of the commitment. The interest is to
- 8 commence at said expiration.
  - Sect. 2. The mayor, aldermen and council of cities,
- 2 and towns at their annual town meetings, may in any

- 3 year by vote suspend the operation of this act so far
- 4 as relates to the collection of taxes assessed in such
- 5 city or town during the year ensuing.
- Sect. 3. This act shall not apply to taxes already 2 assessed.
  - SECT. 4. This act shall take effect on its approval.
