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#### COMMITTEE ON THE JUDICIARY.

The Committee on the Judiciary, to which was referred an order of the Senate calling upon the Governor for information in relation to the employment of agents in prosecuting the claims of the State against the General Government, the compensation paid and authority therefor, together with the communication of the Governor in reference thereto, having had the same under consideration ask leave to report:

That the interests of the State appear to have been well considered and carefully guarded by the Executive action in the premises, and the same is fully approved.

### STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in relation to the claims of the State of Maine against the United States for expenses incurred in the late rebellion.

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they
2 are hereby authorized to settle the accounts of the
3 agents charged by the executive with prosecuting the
4 claims of the state against the government of the
5 United States for expenses incurred in the late rebel6 lion, allowing their reasonable expenses and a just
7 compensation for services rendered, but no charge of
8 commissions for sums obtained of the general govern9 ment for the state shall be allowed, and the governor
10 with the advice of the council shall draw his warrant
11 upon the treasurer of the state therefor.
