STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT to incorporate the Knox Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. N. A. Farwell, C. W. Snow, John P. 2 Wise, S. N. Hatch, Geo. W. Kimball, junior, S. I. 3 Lovejoy, M. C. Andrews, Leander Weeks, O. J. Co- 4 nant, C. G. Moffitt, W. H. Titcomb, Freeman Harden, 5 M. W. Farwell, Geo. S. Wiggin, John T. Berry, G. 6 W. Brown, I. K. Kimball, Alden Ulmer, J. A. Ingra- 7 ham and Wm. Wilson, their associates, successors and 8 assigns, be and they are hereby created a corporation 9 by the name of the Knox Agricultural and Horticul- 10 tural Society, with power by that name to sue and be

11 sued ; to have and use a common seal ; to make by-
12 laws and all necessary regulations for the management
13 of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this
14 state ; and to have all the rights and privileges, and
15 be subject to all the liabilities of similar societies in
16 this state.

SECT. 2. Said society is hereby established within
2 the towns which comprise the county of Knox, and
3 may take and hold real estate at a cost of five thou-
4 sand dollars, (including grounds for fairs and race-
5 course,) and personal property to the amount of five
6 thousand dollars.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of said corporation may
2 be called by any three of the persons named in the
3 first section of this act, by giving such notice of the
4 time, place and objects thereof, as they think proper ;
5 and at said meeting, the officers of said corporation
6 may be chosen, and such other corporative business
7 done as may be deemed proper.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
