STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT relating to fees of sheriffs and their deputies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The fees of sheriffs and deputy sheriffs

- 2 for the service of precepts hereinafter named, instead
- 3 of the fees as now fixed by law shall be as follows:
- 4 for the service of an original summons or seire facias,
- 5 either by reading or by copy, or for the service of a
- 6 capias or attachment with summons on one defendant,
- 7 fifty cents; if served on more than one defendant,
- 8 fifty cents for each; and for attachment of property
- 9 by the written direction of the plaintiff, his agent or
- 10 attorney, twenty-five cents additional to the fees for
- 11 service as aforesaid; for travel for the service of any

- 12 writ, warrant or other process, four cents a mile from
- 13 the place of service to and from the place of return by
- 14 the usual way; but if the distance for which travel is
- 15 charged as aforesaid, is more than fifty miles, only one
- 16 cent a mile shall be allowed or charged for all travel
- 17 exceeding that distance.
 - Sect. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with
 - 2 this act are hereby repealed.
 - Sect. 3. This act shall be in force from and after 2 its approval.
