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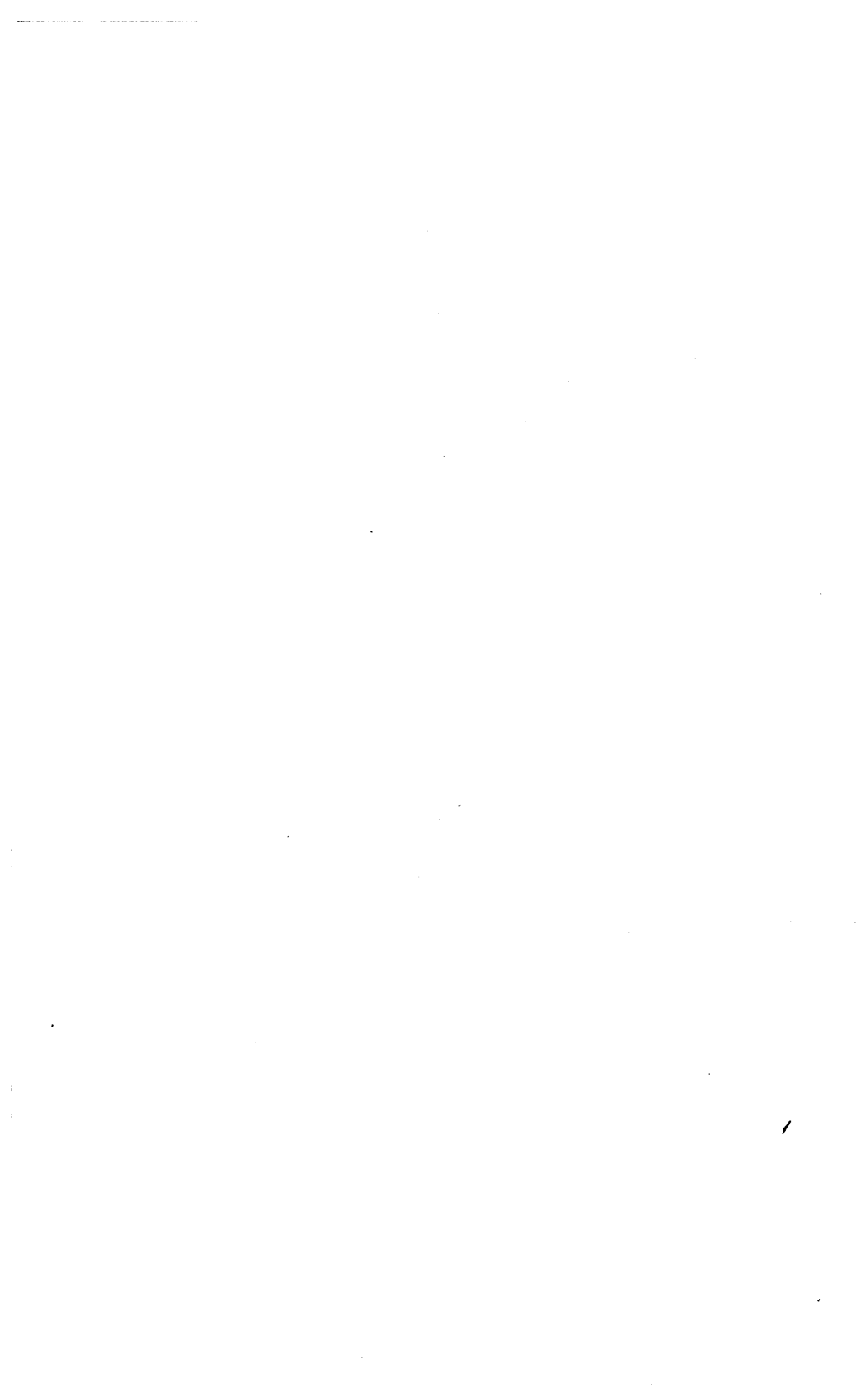

# REPORT.

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LAND OFFICE, December 1, 1867.

*To the Governor and Council of Maine:*

I have the honor herewith to submit the Annual Report of the operations of this department, which with the schedules annexed, exhibits the operations of the Land Office for the current year.

Agreeably with the conditions of the resolve entitled, "Resolve to carry into effect chapter two hundred eighty-four in favor of Bates College," approved February 28, 1867; townships numbered 8 and 10, range 17, W. E. L. S., were advertised to be sold on the 11th day of September, A. D. 1867, at auction; said townships were offered as advertised and sold to Messrs. Stetson & Co., for the sum of \$23,000.00, realizing a sum sufficient within 488.89 to answer the requirements of the resolve, being for the sum of \$20,000.00 and interest accrued thereon since the date of conveyance by the State to said college.

After the sale the cash payment and notes received were passed into the hands of the president of said college and his conveyance made in form to the purchasers, thereby relieving the State from all additional liability, on account of the grant made for the object named in the resolve referred to and others of a previous date.

After repeated but ineffectual attempts to realize fully the sums contemplated by resolves entitled, "Resolve appropriating the "timber and lumber" on a township of land for educational purposes, approved March 23, 1864; and resolve entitled, "Resolve in favor of Westbrook Seminary," approved March 23, 1864; by advertising agreeably with the provisions of the several resolves of dates referred to and of resolves passed subsequent thereto; I have followed the proposals made in 1866, and closed sale for "timber and lumber" for the term of ten years, upon township number 3, range 5, N. B. K. P., with Maj. Charles E. Dole and another for the sum of \$5,000.00, subject however to existing rights acquired by him under an unexpired permit for cutting

lumber upon said township; for which the sum of \$1,000.00 has been fixed upon for terminating the same, and added to the sum of \$5,000.00 named, making the amount to be realized to the fund under the resolve \$6,000.00; and being the ultimatum that could be reached by reason of the limitation contained in said resolve.

And have likewise under resolve last named in favor of Westbrook Seminary, advertised for proposals for the purchase of the "timber and lumber" upon the east half of township number 9, range 3, W. E. L. S., and the highest price named at the sale August 11, 1867, being \$3,150.00.

At the earnest request of friends who had given assurance that the sum of \$6,000.00 could be realized from the sale of lumber upon the half township for the term of ten years, in order that such assurance should as nearly as could, be realized, the purchaser waived his right to purchase into the hands of parties more immediately interested in the pledge in behalf of the seminary; and the sum was increased to \$4,000.00 by Hon. Samuel F. Hersey, and paid by him to the treasurer of said seminary as appeared by letter of advice and filed in the Land Office.

Thereupon a permit in due form has been made to said Hersey, and the matter closed, in so far as the same has devolved upon this office. Instructions have been given during the season for purposes hereinafter named, in order that information be furnished to facilitate the business of this office, the more effectually to accomplish it agreeably with the requirements of law, viz.:

John B. Hayes, Esq., to locate roads in 14, range 3; Mr. M. L. Durgin, for making examination of Kingsbury and Blanchard road, for the purpose of placing same under contract; roads in Aroostook, Canada road, and others; B. H. Stuart, for exploring lands upon the upper Saint John, preparatory to selling same, attending to expenditure of money contemplated in resolve for opening out from Seven Islands, and scaling lumber the ensuing season; Mr. Cyrus Arnold, for making repairs on the military road, contracting for the erection and repairs of bridges, and repairs upon roads in Aroostook; Hon. David Dudley, to examine and locate the proposed bridge at Fort Fairfield over Aroostook river, and accepting the bridge erected in township G, range 1; Ziba Haley, for repairing road across Indian township; Mr. L. B. Ricker, for building a bridge at Shin Pond in Mount Chase, and repairing road leading over same; J. D. Teague, Esq., for looking after the expenditure upon road leading from Caribou towards Fish river road; Mr.

James Cunningham, for laying out a road in Crystal plantation; Messrs. Jonah Hilton, J. Smith Spaulding, Joseph Clark, for repairing the Canada road; Messrs. L. Gowen, Daniel Barker, John T. Goss, John C. Carpenter, William Coburn, L. B. Ricker, Geo. W. Lunt, for protecting the public lands and scaling lumber cut thereon during the season of operations.

In pursuance of resolves passed at the last session of the Legislature, I have expended \$6,037.45 in the construction and repairing of bridges, making and repairing roads in the counties of Aroostook, Penobscot and Washington,—\$1,558.65 on the Canada road,—\$554.55 for miscellaneous repairs and services on roads and bridges,—\$1,736.32 on the road leading from Kingsbury Mills to Blanchard Mills, east of Russell Mountain, and contracted for completing said road to, and the erection of a substantial bridge over the Piscataquis river at Barrows falls; and from said river to intersection with the road leading from Blanchard to Abbott village, the entire expense for completing the road and constructing the bridge is not to exceed the sum of \$4,000.00 appropriated for this purpose, and is to be all completed ready for travel on or before July next.

The bridge built by W. C. Hammond, Esq., on township G, range 1, is reported to be a very substantial structure for the amount of its cost to the State, and it is well to note in this connection that the travel on the road leading from Grand falls on the Saint John river over this bridge to Violette brook through Hamlin and Van Buren plantation, through the French settlements to Fort Kent is constant and heavy.

The amount of business done on the route indicated is large, the population increasing, agricultural prospects very good, with a general appearance of thrift, all of which can be kept up, and made yet more successful by moderate appropriation for bridges requiring larger outlays of money than the inhabitants can command at the present time.

The bridge over east branch of Mattawamkeag is 141 feet long, 21 feet wide, with middle pier 15 feet 9 inches high, the abutments about 14 feet high with a fill of gravel. At each end of the bridge, say 100 feet west, and 500 feet east, filled with gravel from 2 to 14 feet in depth. Hemlock used for the pier and abutments 14 to 18 inches thick; five stringers to each span 45 feet long, with truss sills of ash 10 by 12 inches in size. The covering of the centre of the bridge is of cedar and hemlock 6 inches thick.

All completed under the supervision of Mr. Cyrus Arnold; the wood work by contract with Messrs. Joseph Libby and McLain of Molunkus; and have no doubt of the needs of the bridge to facilitate and encourage travel through from the Aroostook road to Houlton the shire town of the county.

The bridge built over the Macwahock stream on the Military road convenes a large amount of public travel, including the mail transportation, daily between Mattawamkeag Point and Houlton.

The bridge at Shin Pond, constructed by Mr. L. B. Ricker, is required for citizens engaged in lumbering on the east branch of Penobscot river, enabling them with greater facility to procure the products of the farmers in Mount Chase, thus by the improvement made creating new facilities of mutual and lasting advantage.

It might be supposed without due examination of the matter, that the citizens of Aroostook were as a mass dependent upon State beneficence for their success in unfolding the forests.

To the extent that every new enterprize requires a lift, is true and applicable as a rule to Aroostook.

But, when we examine beyond this point, and find town after town in the county never asking or expecting money to be appropriated for improvements in any form, indicates at once the internal strength and vigor which has enabled the "settlement" to assume the additional responsibilities of the town government.

It does not occur that a dollar has been expended by the State in money either upon roads or bridges since their organization, in the towns of Fort Fairfield, Lyndon, Presque Isle, Easton, Ashland, Littleton, Houlton, Linneus and other towns; excepting upon permanent and heavy work, in constructing bridges to connect points where the travel was largely from outside of such towns and extending far beyond their limits.

In pursuance of the provisions of the law contained in section 32, chapter 5 of the revised statutes, favorable sales have been made during the year of townships set apart for the Permanent School Fund, amounting to \$53,507.47. This sum added to \$31,747.33, received during the preceding year (1866) reaches the total amount of \$85,256.80, and with moderate efforts this fund may be increased to one hundred thousand dollars within the periods of time from the source indicated, and it is further recommended that sales of the lands set apart for this object be continued.

Seventeen thousand ninety-one acres have been conveyed upon



surrender of Land Certificates where settling duties have been completed, details given in table marked A.

Twenty thousand six hundred six eighty-two one-hundredths acres under Resolves and Acts of the Legislature, table marked B.

One hundred thirty thousand six hundred fifty-five acres conveyed for cash and cash securities, \$53,753.47, see table marked C.

Seven thousand four hundred thirty-four forty-six one-hundredths acres contracted for road labor and performance of other settling duties, table marked D.

Payments into the State Treasury have been as follows, viz.:

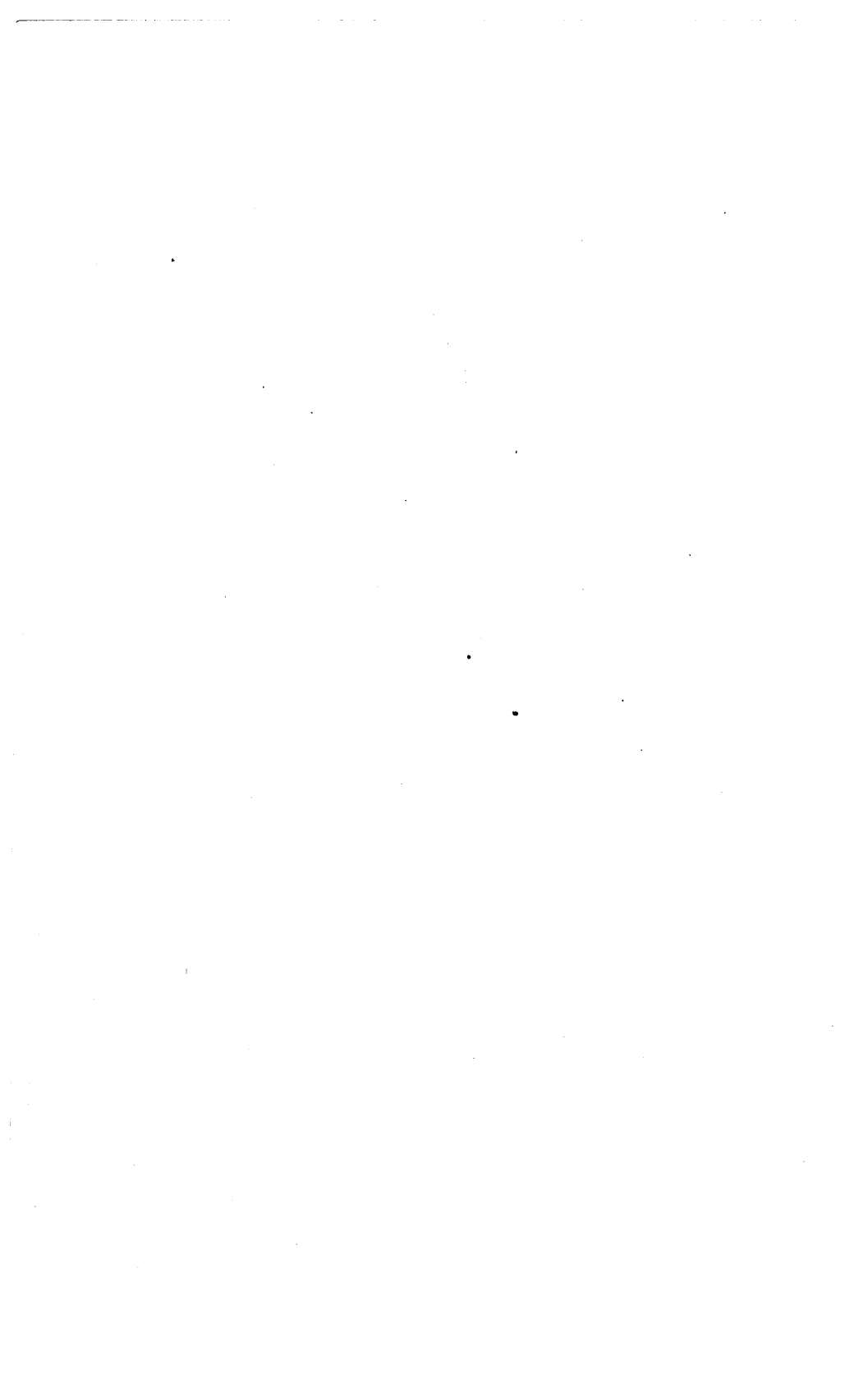
