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## STATE OF MAINE.

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### **RESOLVES** relative to the Assumption by the State of the Municipal War Debts.

WHEREAS, The question of the assumption and equalization of the war debts of the cities, towns and plantations of this State has received the attention of several legislatures, and has the approval of a joint select committee of this legislature, provided the same be practicable, having a due regard to the principles of justice to all parties interested therein :

*Resolved*, That the Governor and Council be, and they are hereby, authorized and directed to apply to the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court for their opinion upon the constitutional right and power of the State to assume and equalize such expenditures or any part of them, and the Governor and Council shall appoint a commission of five persons who shall have full power to investigate and obtain all requisite information in regard to the expenditures of cities, towns and plantations for war purposes, with power to send for persons and papers, and shall thereafter establish some equitable basis for the assumption thereof, having due regard as far as practicable to the circumstances and considerations which have attended or affected the amount of said indebtedness, such as private contributions and donations, and the furnishing of representative substitutes, so called, and other similar causes which may have lightened the burdens of cities, towns and plantations, and such disadvantages as may have increased the burdens of towns. They shall also make particular inquiry in regard to cases in which extravagance or lack of patriotism, or both, may have materially affected the amount of such expenditure, and shall exercise due regard to those cities, towns and plantations which have paid no bounties, or have furnished a larger relative proportion without bounties.

*Resolved*, That said commission be and is hereby directed to consider the propriety of an equitable equalization of such expen-

ditures, by designating a specific sum, (not exceeding in the aggregate the gross amount of such expenditure as ascertained by the commission,) to be allowed for each man furnished from the several cities, towns and plantations upon their respective quotas, or such other basis as said commission believe to be most equitable.

*Resolved*, That said commission shall give a full account and report of said inquiry, and furnish all the data whereby they are able to arrive at an equitable plan for assumption and equalization, and shall report the same for the action of the next legislature.

*Resolved*, That to defray the expenses incurred in the execution of the above resolves, the Governor be and is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant from time to time, for said expenses, provided they are audited and allowed by the Governor and Council.

*Resolved*, That one thousand copies of the opinion of the Supreme Judicial Court and the report of the commissioners be printed, and each member of the present legislature shall be entitled to one copy, and the remaining copies shall be reserved for the use of the next legislature.

# REPORT.

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*To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of  
Maine, in Legislature assembled:*

The undersigned, a commission appointed by the Governor and Council under the Resolves of March 1, 1867, "relative to the assumption by the State of the Municipal War Debts," have the honor to submit for your action the following report, as required by said resolves.

Your commission met and organized April 8, and at once entered upon their duties, at the capital. In order to obtain the "requisite information in regard to the expenditures of cities, towns and plantations for war purposes," and other subjects specified in the resolves, a blank, designed to embrace the necessary inquiries was prepared, and early in May, sent to the authorities of every city, town and plantation in the State, accompanied by a circular directing attention to the resolves, a copy of which was inclosed, and requiring "prompt, full and accurate answers, under oath, on or before June 10."

Many of the municipalities, however, failing to reply, a second circular was addressed to them in August, and a third to those still delinquent, in September.

Many of the returns received were found imperfect, or more or less inconsistent and erroneous, requiring special, and in some cases, repeated inquiry and correction.

By these means, and by an examination and comparison of the Adjutant General's reports, and the records of his

office, and other documentary evidence at the State House, aided by personal inquiry, we were enabled to bring this branch of our labors to a close, Nov. 15.

The returns, as received, revised and corrected to that date, are annexed, comprising nearly the entire State; they have been arranged by counties, and are followed by a recapitulation and summary, and it is hoped that they will be found to contain as full and accurate information upon the desired points as perhaps could reasonably be expected in view of the somewhat complicated nature of the investigation, the imperfection and confusion of many of the municipal records, the change of town officers, and the lapse of time since the commencement of the war.

For convenience, the returns were classified with reference to the different calls of the President. The first division comprises all the men furnished and moneys expended from the commencement of the war until July 2, 1862. The second begins with the call of that date, and extends to Oct. 17, 1863. The third contains the men and money raised in obedience to the call of Oct. 17, 1863; and the fourth embraces the call of Feb. 1, 1864 and subsequent calls to the end of the war. The fifth division contains the aggregate of interest and of recruiting expenses, also the grand total of men furnished during the war and of expense incurred for war purposes. And the last gives the whole amount reimbursed by the State for over-payments of bounty on account of enlistments in excess of the quotas of Oct. 17, 1863, and for advances of State bounty made by towns on and after Feb. 1, 1864.

Your commission was directed to "make particular inquiry in regard to cases in which extravagance, or lack of patriotism, or both, may have materially affected the amount of such expenditures, and to exercise due regard to those cities, towns and plantations, which have paid no

bounties, or have furnished a larger relative proportion without bounties."

The returns show a wide difference in the comparative war expenditures of different municipalities, but we are not prepared to charge the inhabitants of most of those cities, towns and plantations which have paid the largest sums in proportion to the number of men furnished, with "extravagance," and still less with a "lack of patriotism." Differences of location, and the inevitable variety in the experience, foresight, shrewdness, prudence and financial ability of municipal officers are sufficient to explain most, but not all, of these inequalities.

One of the items of expenditure revealed by the returns is the amount paid by cities and towns for the commutation of such of their citizens as were drafted into the military service of their country.

The aggregate of town commutations returned is only \$113,955, representing 380 men. But it is probable that this falls short of the amount actually paid, for several towns which return commutations, fail to state whether the money was paid by the persons drafted or by the town.

It is believed, however, that the whole amount thus paid in the State does not exceed \$150,000, and that no more than 500 men were thus kept out of the army during the war.

We have not deemed it necessary to make particular inquiries into the various motives which induced the payment of commutation by different municipal corporations. While some of them may have been influenced by improper and unpatriotic considerations, others no doubt supposed they were acting in accordance with the law of Congress, and no reproach should be cast upon their fidelity to the government, or their patriotic efforts in furnishing men and means for its support.

But the obvious and inevitable tendency of such a measure, to borrow the language of the Supreme Judicial Court, was to defeat the object for which the act of Congress was passed, namely, to raise soldiers, not money;—a measure by which, if it had become general, the government would have been left without a soldier for its protection, and the nation surrendered into the power of those who were warring for its destruction,—the wealth and taxable property of the community would have been diverted from the defence of government, and the resources of the State turned to its destruction, by thus depriving it of the means necessary for its protection. The unanimous opinion of the justices, to which we refer, is published in the Maine Reports, volume 52, and has been sustained by successive Legislatures in their repeated refusals to legalize such proceedings.

Concurring with these Judicial and Legislative decisions, we have not included any town commutations among the municipal expenditures to be assumed.

The amount of individual commutations paid is returned at \$405,645, representing 1352 men; it is believed that the amount cannot in fact exceed \$450,000, paid as commutation by 1500 drafted men. This amount also is excluded from any assumption proposed in the resolves.

Your commission was also instructed to have “due regard, as far as practicable, to the circumstances and considerations which have attended or affected the amount of said indebtedness, such as private contributions and donations, and the furnishing of representative substitutes, so called, and other similar causes which may have lightened the burdens of cities, towns and plantations, and such disadvantages as may have increased the burdens of towns.” The amount of “private contributions and donations” returned is \$843,230. But this is evidently an underesti-

mate, because in very few cities or towns do these gifts appear to have been a matter of official record, and a multitude of individual contributions, amounting in the aggregate to very large sums, must have escaped the knowledge or memory of the municipal officers when preparing their returns. It is believed that the amount of "private contributions and donations" by citizens in aid of the war must exceed \$1,000,000. It is proper to remark that in this sum are included moneys voluntarily paid by persons not subject to draft for "representative substitutes, so called," of which, according to the records of the Adjutant General's office, nearly 100 were furnished for the service of the country. Some of these "representative" recruits were put into the service by loyal and patriotic ladies, and the remainder by gentlemen of liberality and wealth, who had passed the military age, but refused to avail themselves of their exemption.

Your commission next proceeded to examine the various propositions which offered themselves or were suggested, in order to "establish some equitable basis for the assumption" of the municipal war expenditures. This question was found to be involved in serious difficulty, and its investigation has received the careful consideration of your commissioners, but they have finally arrived at the conclusion that the basis least objectionable, most simple, and by far the most "equitable" of any to which their attention has been directed, is "an equitable equalization of such expenditures, by designating a specific sum, (not exceeding in the aggregate the gross amount of said expenditures as ascertained by the commission,) to be allowed for each man furnished from the several cities, towns and plantations upon their respective quotas" on an equal basis of *years of service rendered*, being substantially the plan recommended in the second resolve.

Returns from the 12 cities, 375 of the towns, and 70 of the plantations, exhibit the following items of "expenditure for war purposes:"

It is found that the municipalities from which these returns have been received, 457 in number, have a population of 608,254, and a valuation of \$159,267,051, comprising  $96\frac{76}{100}$  per cent. of the inhabitants and  $98\frac{2}{100}$  of the property of the State.

As quotas were assigned in direct proportion to the population, it would not be unreasonable to assume that the 16 towns and 69 plantations which have failed to make seasonable returns, have expended for war purposes sums not in excess of the ratio of their population. This would give for

While we have endeavored to ascertain and report approximately the amount of "*private* contributions and donations," your commissioners do not feel authorized by the resolves to add this sum to the aggregate of *municipal* expenditures. Nor have we included the items of interest and recruiting expenses. In some towns a tax was assessed for the payment of a large part of their war expenses, at the time the bounties were paid or soon after, and such towns have therefore been subjected to the payment of less interest, while others which have paid less of their indebtedness, have of course paid more interest. Hence it would be unjust to include in the expenditures which it is proposed to assume, any items of interest paid, unless interest were also calculated upon all payments of town war indebtedness, which would be impracticable. It is believed that both the interest and recruiting expenses are now perhaps more equitably distributed among the cities, towns and plantations than if those sums were included in the amount to be reimbursed.

As against the national government, it is not perceived why the amount of private contributions and donations, as well as all recruiting expenses not already reimbursed by the United States, should not be added to the sum of town bounties paid and not reimbursed by the State; upon this aggregate, as well as upon the amount expended by the State for war purposes, interest should be reckoned from the time when the several sums were contributed, paid, or expended, up to the date of future national adjustment.

Our *municipal* claim against the nation will be found already to approximate \$12,000,000.

But, if for the purposes of the resolves, we confine our attention to the single item of town bounties, a glance at the wide variation in the sums expended by different muni-

cipalities in proportion to the number of men furnished and the years of service rendered, will suggest the difficulty and complication of any system of assumption which contemplates the reimbursement to each city, town and plantation of its full expenditure for war purposes. The glaring inequality of *such* an assumption, even after the labor, delay and expense of a strict investigation into each item of expense presented by the several municipalities, would alone endanger the adoption of such a scheme. Cities, towns and plantations whose favorable locality, or the patriotism of whose citizens, or the energy, forecast, and liberal economy of whose officers had filled their quotas in advance with acceptable recruits at moderate expense, could hardly be expected willingly to co-operate in a plan which proposes to tax them in order to contribute to the relief of other municipalities whose unfortunate location, or whose opposition to the war, or the apathy or inexperience of whose authorities had involved them in large, if not unnecessary expense. But the basis suggested would seem to obviate this difficulty. It has been observed that the primary and especial object of the call of the United States government was men, and bounties were paid only as a means to that end. Hence the true measure of service rendered by any city, town or plantation to the country is *the number of men* actually furnished, *multiplied by the number of years* for which each man entered the army or navy.

If this basis is correct in principle, it admits of almost perfect accuracy in practice, excluding not only the inequalities, but avoiding the inaccuracies and uncertainty inseparable from any other scheme of which we can conceive. In the application of this plan, your commission was at first naturally disposed to begin with the first regiment of volunteers, and to include in the estimate every



man who entered the service of his country from the State. But in this direction we at once encountered difficulties which will be readily understood. It is a matter of public notoriety that the early regiments were filled by loyal and patriotic young men who rushed at their country's call from all parts of the State and enlisted at Portland, Lewiston, Augusta, Bangor and other large centres without notice to and in many cases without the knowledge of the authorities of the remote towns or plantations where they had a legal residence. The war, it was confidently believed, was to be short; no draft was thought of, with its quotas, substitutes, commutations and bounties.

Accordingly the early volunteers were careless as to their residence and many of them were enrolled as citizens of the cities or large towns where the regiment was raised, and therefore serious difficulty is to be anticipated in settling the true residence of many of such volunteers.

Besides, a proposition looking to an equitable equalization of actual municipal expenditures for war purposes upon the basis of men, ought, it appears to us, to be limited to the number of men furnished after these expenditures commenced, which, as the returns show, was, substantially, July 2, 1862, when the call of that date made them necessary. For as no considerable expenditures were incurred by towns before July 2, 1862, there can be no propriety in paying to *towns* any sum for volunteers entering the service before that date, because their enlistment was not attended with material expense to their towns.

Any such payments ought to be made to the brave *volunteers themselves*, or their representatives, but that is a question involving, not an assumption of *municipal war debts* but *the equalization of bounties*, a subject not submitted to your commission by the resolves, which limit our

authority to an investigation of "the expenditures of cities, towns and plantations for war purposes," and the consideration of an equitable equalization thereof.

After weighing the whole matter, your commission recommend, substantially, that the "*specific sum*" of \$100 for each man furnished by any municipality on and after July 2, 1862, for three years military service of the United States, and a proportionate sum for every man furnished for a shorter period, be assumed by the State and reimbursed to each city, town and plantation so furnishing, towards an equalization of the municipal "expenditures for war purposes."

We are aware that such an assumption will relieve the cities, towns and plantations to the extent only of  $38\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. of their average corporate war expenditures for unreimbursed bounties alone, (indeed less than  $33\frac{1}{3}$  per cent., if we include interest,) but we offer some reasons for the recommendation of this limited reimbursement upon the compound basis of men and service. In the first place it effectually disposes of "cases in which extravagance, or lack of patriotism, or both, may have materially affected the amount of such expenditures." Municipalities which have paid unnecessarily large bounties will not be reimbursed the full amount of the same.

If each town were allowed the full amount of its expenditure, or even a given percentage thereof, prudent, patriotic and economical towns would be taxed to relieve those that have been unpatriotic, indifferent or extravagant. If it were proposed to obviate this manifest injustice by the rejection of all unnecessary expenditure, then the claim of each of the 542 municipalities would require a separate adjustment upon its own merits, and the attempt to reduce the expenditures of each to a just basis would involve interminable delay and vast expense both

to the claimants and to the State. But upon the proposed plan, all these perplexing questions are at once adjudicated and settled. The only inquiry then would be as to the number of men actually furnished by the municipality since July 2, 1862, and the term for which they entered the service; of this and this alone rigid proof should be required.

If a certain sum were to be paid for each man without regard to the term of service, then a town which saw fit to enlist its men for a single year, would receive from the State as much as others with similar quotas that enlisted their men for three years, while the government had received only one-third as much service, thus rendering the assumption and reimbursement grossly inequitable. It will also be observed that \$100 is the minimum bounty paid by most of the cities, towns and plantations to men furnished by them for three years service, since July 2, 1862.

If a larger sum than \$100 a man were reimbursed, then municipalities which paid only \$100 for each man would receive more than they have actually expended for bounties, which, if the cases were numerous, might involve serious opposition on the part of other cities and towns.

Finally, the returns show that the sum assumed by the State even upon this limited basis of \$100 will exceed \$3,000,000, and is as large an amount as is believed advisable for the State to add to its present indebtedness.

This is indeed only a fraction of the aggregate indebtedness which our cities, towns and plantations patriotically incurred in defence of the Union, a grievous burden under which they continue to groan. It was virtually a loan required by the short comings of Congress and the deficiencies of the national and State treasuries, and we con-

tend that justice demands of the national government a prompt assumption of the entire sum, as well as of the whole amount expended by the State for the same great purpose, with interest.

Justice to Maine and to every loyal State demands the assumption of each of their necessary war debts, State and municipal, because otherwise the States lately in rebellion will escape payment of their equal share of the expense of subduing their causeless revolt. But, until this is done, the burden must rest upon our various cities, towns and plantations, except so far as they may be relieved by the State.

For the convenience of the Legislature the data for the proposed "plan for assumption and equalization" have been compiled in tabular form and appended to the returns. This compilation is arranged by counties, and gives in separate columns the number of men furnished by each municipality for nine months, one year, two years and three years, and the town bounties paid to each class. Another column exhibits the total service rendered by each city, town and plantation reduced to a uniform basis of three years, and others the total amount of town bounties paid, also the balance of town bounties not reimbursed by the State, with the population and valuation of each municipality in 1860.

The aggregate service of the returned municipalities, reduced to a three years' basis, is given in the summary 31,602. This number will be found slightly to exceed that derived from the full returns of men enlisted on and after July 2, 1862, because it was deemed "equitable" so far to qualify our general recommendation as *to allow one man for every \$100 bounty actually paid by any municipality to three years' men enlisted prior to July 2, 1862,* in order to 'make a more perfect "equalization of the war

expenditures." The whole sum thus paid is \$191,880.82, representing 1919 men.

Adding to the 31,602 men returned, the proper percentage for the unreturned towns and plantations, we have for the entire State 32,660 men, reduced to a uniform basis of three years, requiring, at \$100 each, the assumption and reimbursement of \$3,266,000, being exactly two per cent. of the State valuation of 1860.

This is a large sum, but its assumption is believed to be equitable, wise and necessary. The war was waged by Southern rebels in the interest of slavery and for the overthrow of the national government; it was the manifest right of that government to protect itself at all hazards and to the last extremity. Unquestionably it was the duty of Maine and of every other loyal State to contribute all its blood and treasure, if need be, to the preservation and defence of the nation. Equally clear is the obligation of the national government to reimburse to Maine and every other loyal State the money advanced to the nation in the hour of its peril and weakness. So with our State and its municipalities. Not only was the nation in danger, but the very existence of civil government was threatened and anarchy impended over the country.

The draft was no respecter of persons nor occupations, but swept remorselessly through the State, sparing none. In all ages, the average expenses of a people have fallen but little short of their average earnings. The pay voted by Congress to the soldier was notoriously far below the average earnings of drafted men in Maine, and totally inadequate to the maintenance of their families. Hence bounties became necessary to the enlistment of men, and therefore to the prosecution of the war and the salvation of the nation. The State found itself unable to furnish sufficient bounty to supply the rapidly repeated demands

of the President for additional recruits, and imperious necessity compelled the several cities, towns and plantations, in their corporate capacity, to meet the exigency by town bounties.

While, therefore, it was the duty of each loyal municipality to supplement the temporary inability of the State in the critical hour, by corporate loans, it is incumbent on the State to assume, at the earliest practicable moment, as large a part, at least, of the municipal expenditures thus necessarily incurred, as the ability of the State permits. Under the call of July 2, 1862, and all subsequent calls, quotas were assigned and men required in the exact ratio of population without regard to locality or wealth. No allowance was made to the remote and sparsely settled towns and plantations. The quotas could not be filled, and the demands for men supplied, by the various cities, towns and plantations, unless they offered to volunteers inducements equal to those presented in other States. It became necessary, therefore, to pay large bounties or to fill the several quotas by draft. The State neglected, except for a short period, to make provision for adequate bounties. Thus the entire responsibility of filling quotas devolved upon the municipalities. For the double purpose of furnishing the army with recruits and protecting our citizens from draft, bounties to volunteers were paid by cities, towns and plantations, in their corporate capacity, and they are now burdened with large debts incurred for this purpose, debts which the very necessities of the case forced them to contract.

Our men went to the war, and the country was saved. Cheerfully they fought, heroically they endured the slaughter and wounds of battle, the more terrible diseases of the camp and the swamp, the pestilential climate of the Gulf States, and worst of all, the barbarities and starvation of the rebel prisons.

Each city, town and plantation was required to contribute its equal quota to the Southern graveyard and the Northern hospital, and each to-day has its numerical share of cripples and disabled men, each its just proportion of widows, orphans, and dependent sufferers. Is not this enough?

Yet, under the operation of town bounties, both *men* and *money* have actually been raised from the people of Maine on the basis of population, without regard to their ability to bear the tax. For, quotas having been assigned on the sole basis of population, towns and plantations of small valuation have been required to furnish as many men, and therefore to pay as much for bounties, (in fact more, usually, as the returns prove,) in proportion to their inhabitants, as the wealthiest cities of the State. Hence the returns show the burdens of the war to be grossly unequal, being oppressive in the poorer towns and plantations, while in the cities and wealthy towns they are comparatively light. But these burdens can be equalized and the smaller towns and plantations relieved from their unequal embarrassments, only by an equitable assumption by the State, whereby the property within its limits can be subjected to an equal contribution towards defraying the expenses incurred in its protection. Otherwise, the whole of this enormous sum, the annual interest of which alone exceeds \$500,000, must continue to rest, as between cities, towns and plantations, like a gigantic poll-tax upon the people per capita, without regard to poverty or wealth. Already the interest of these debts (not less than \$1,500,000) has been borne for three years upon just such a basis, with a patience only exhibited by the people of a republican State, who realize that relief is within their own power, and therefore sure. We confess that to us the argument in favor of assumption is irresistible. Was not the property of the State in as

much hazard as the lives of its people? Was it not even in greater danger? And of all our property, was not the wealth of the cities and large towns along the seaboard as much exposed, to say the least, as the country farms, where a rebel would hardly have ventured? Was not all this wealth protected by the army and navy, and what would be its value to-day if the rebellion had prevailed?

Then if the *people* of Maine have been compelled to furnish *soldiers* for the defence of life and property in exact proportion to population, without regard to wealth, why, on any principle of equity or sound political economy, should not the *property* of the State be required to pay the necessary *expense* of their enlistment, without regard to population? Would not such an "equalization" of necessary war expenditures harmonize with the spirit of our Constitution and laws, which contemplate a moderate poll-tax and the equal assessment of all other State taxes upon the real estate within its limits and the personal property of its inhabitants on a uniform valuation made for the purpose at stated periods? And yet what is the present relative situation of the different municipalities of Maine? Compare, for example, the returns from the 21 towns in Piscataquis, containing all but 377 of the population and the whole valuation of that county, with those of the six wealthiest cities in the State, as shown in the following table, on a three years' basis :

It will be perceived that the percentage of the entire population furnished for service is nearly uniform, varying from one in 17 to one in 23 of the inhabitants of those cities (the average being one in 19), while in the towns of Piscataquis it averages one in 20. The bounty returned varies pretty widely in the different cities, but, in the six, averages \$207 to every three years' man, while in Piscataquis it ranges as high as \$273, showing that it cost considerably less to fill quotas in the cities than in that county. The average cost to each inhabitant for bounties varies in about the same proportion, averaging \$10.96 in the six cities, and \$13.70 in Piscataquis.

But the most striking inequality is in the *last column*, which exhibits the relative percentage of valuation paid, or rather hired, by the several cities, and by the towns of that county to provide bounties for their men. This varies from less than  $1\frac{1}{3}$  per cent. in Portland to almost  $8\frac{2}{3}$  per cent. in the Piscataquis towns, being more than six and a half times heavier in that county. In the six cities it averages  $1\frac{9}{10}$  per cent., or a little less than two-ninths of the average in Piscataquis. Examples might be multiplied indefinitely, but they are needless. These enormous inequalities are the unavoidable result of a national levy upon the inhabitants of our State on a basis of population, without the offer of adequate compensation. For of the 542 municipalities of Maine, 38 contain a valuation exceeding all the rest, while they number only 30 per cent. of the population of the State. The average wealth of these cities and towns is \$432 to each inhabitant, while in the State at large it is but \$260, and in the county of Piscataquis only \$159. The 12 cities, with a population of 106,606, less than 17 per cent. of the whole State, have a valuation of \$54,626,392, which is over one-third that of Maine.

The grave importance of the subject must be our apology for the introduction of these few statistical details into the text of our report.

Although it may be conceded that the gross inequality of municipal burdens demands immediate relief from the State, and that the plan indicated is best adapted to that end, still it may be objected that its adoption will largely augment the State debt, and therefore tend to depreciate our State credit. We reply that if the proposed equalized assumption of municipal debts contemplates an increase of the State debt, it will not add to the indebtedness of the people, for every dollar assumed by the whole State is lifted from the burden which presses immediately on the inhabitants of our cities, towns and plantations. A sovereign State, clothed with the requisite legislative and constitutional authority, ought to command a credit at least as favorable as either of the 500 municipalities now struggling under their unequal taxes.

The objection is fallacious, for the State debt thus occasioned could and would be funded at greater advantage than is possible with the towns.

And after experiencing all the relief proposed by your commission, a weight of debt will still hang upon most municipalities quite sufficient to tax their best financial ability.

Such are the principal reasons which have led us to recommend the assumption by the State of a little more than three millions of the war debts of the several cities, towns and plantations upon the basis of equalization hereinbefore indicated.

But a serious difficulty presents itself at this point, for the Justices of the Supreme Judicial Court, in reply to the application of the Governor and Council directed by the resolves, in an opinion published in the fifty-third vol-

ume of the Maine Reports, have decided that the State is prohibited by amendment VI of the Constitution, from incurring any debt towards the equalization of the municipal war expenditures. But the proposed assumption may be made by a constitutional amendment, initiated by two-thirds of each branch of the Legislature, and ratified by the people at the September election, according to article X, section 4, of the Constitution, or by a direct tax. A direct tax is objectionable, because it would require the early assessment of the whole amount upon the people. This would involve a tax of two per cent., which might, it is true, be levied equally in three years, without carrying the amount beyond the State tax assessed and collected in 1865, while in most municipalities it would diminish the town taxes in a still greater degree, but such a method is not recommended. A constitutional amendment is preferable, because its adoption requires the popular approval and demands no immediate special tax, leaving the State full liberty to borrow on the most favorable terms and collect payment of the people at their convenience.

The amendment should be distinctly limited to the special purpose of the desired assumption, excluding in express terms all other loans or debts.

Your commission has thus endeavored to discharge the duties required by the resolves, as thoroughly as time, ability, and the nature of the subject have permitted.

It is not supposed that the information contained in the returns is in its varied items strictly accurate, but it is believed that it will be found sufficiently reliable for the purposes of the resolves.

It is thought that the main facts, (the only ones absolutely essential,) the number of men actually put into ser-

vice, and the term of each man's service, are substantially correct.

For, on the basis of limited assumption recommended, an error, even of large amount, in the sum of expenditures or any of the items that compose it, becomes comparatively unimportant, because the reimbursement proposed falls in any event so far short of such expenditures.

But even in regard to the number of men and terms of service, the returns ought not to be considered conclusive.

In case of assumption and reimbursement, satisfactory evidence and unquestionable vouchers should be furnished, in each case, in such mode and before such tribunal as the wisdom of the Legislature may prescribe, of all the facts necessary to be proved in order to establish a claim upon the basis proposed.

Every city, town and plantation should be required to appropriate the amount reimbursed by the State towards the payment or in extinction of its municipal indebtedness.

To raise the amount of money required, State bonds may be issued for such sums and on such time as may be deemed expedient, and an annual tax (not exceeding two mills on the dollar of the State valuation if the bonds are made payable in twenty years,) assessed, in order to pay the interest on said bonds, and to accumulate a sinking fund sufficient for the payment of the principal at maturity. Any money that may be received by the State from the United States on account of the war claims of Maine, or its municipalities, or through the scheme suggested by the Secretary of the Treasury in his recent report, should be added to such sinking fund for the purpose indicated, in which event the necessity of further taxation for the payment of interest and for an addition to the fund would probably cease.

In closing their work, your commission are happy to be able to agree with entire unanimity upon the plan recommended, and venture to hope that something of that character may be found "practicable and just to all parties interested therein," and may meet the approval of your honorable body and the ratification of the people of the State.

If any of the foregoing suggestions, or the statistics on which they are based, should thus contribute to the satisfactory adjustment of this difficult and complicated question, your commissioners will have occasion to regard the result of their labors with peculiar pleasure.

All which is respectfully reported for the action of the Legislature.
