The commissioners appointed by authority of an act approved March 7, 1868, to adjudicate upon the claims presented by the several cities, towns or plantations, on account of their "municipal war debts, and a limited assumption and re-imbursement thereof by the State," have completed their labors, and issued to the State Treasurer certificates of the sum awarded each city, town or plantation in this State, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of three millions one hundred five thousand one hundred and eighty-three dollars thirty-three cents, (\$3,105,183.33) and bonds for the payment of this award, dated October 1, 1869, payable in twenty years, with coupons attached for the semi-annual interest, have been prepared, and will be ready for delivery on and after January 1, 1870. The fractional excess less than one hundred dollars, amounting to twenty thousand seven hundred eighty-three dollars thirty-three cents, (\$20,783.33) will be paid in currency.

There is presented in the following Schedule the amount to be reimbursed to each city, town or plantation, arranged by counties.

Although at the time of writing this report the municipal war debt bonds have not been delivered to the cities and towns, the treasurer treats the loan as an indebtedness outstanding, as the bonds are all dated October 1, 1869. Thus it appears that as the result of the war, the funded debt has been increased \$7,716,900, but the sinking fund established for the payment of this debt will be ample to meet it as it matures.

The funds held in trust by the State now amount to the sum of \$1,691,283.81, and I herewith give a brief summary of each.

SINKING FUND.

The Governor, in his Address to the Legislature of 1865, and the Treasurer in his annual report of the transactions of the treasury department of the preceding year, called the attention of the legislature to the establishment of a sinking fund looking to the gradual payment of so much of the public debt as was incurred for war purposes—and in accordance with their views “an act to create and establish a sinking fund,” was passed January 28, 1865. This act provides for the raising by taxation each year a sum equal to three-quarters of one mill on every dollar of the valuation as then established, to be applied for the payment of the principal of the bonds of this State issued by authority of the several resolves, approved,

In addition thereto, an act was approved February 15, 1866, “to provide for the payment of the war loan of 1861,” which provides that all sums of money that may be reimbursed by the United States in liquidation of claims for advances made by the State of Maine for the outfit furnished to troops raised in this State for the service of the United States in the year 1861, be set apart for the payment of the principal of the war debt negotiated under a resolve approved April 25, 1861, for the sum of \$800,000, and if the fund provided for by said act prove insufficient to pay all the bonds issued under the resolve aforesaid, payment thereof may be made from the fund created under the act of January 28, 1865, to the extent of such deficiency.

The sinking fund now amounts to nine hundred and seventy-two thousand five hundred and thirty dollars (\$972,530.00), and is invested in bonds of the State of Maine to the amount of nine hundred and forty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$942,500), and in registered five-twenty bonds of the United States, thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000), and thirty dollars (\$30) in cash.

The bonds of this State, with the coupons attached thereto, are

To meet the payment at maturity of the bonds issued by authority of the act and resolves of March 7, 1868, provision was made in the fifth section of the act for a sinking fund to be raised by taxation each year,—and in accordance with the provisions of said section, a tax of one half mill on the dollar of the present valuation was included in the tax levy for 1869.

PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND.

The money received from the land agent derived from the sales of land appropriated for the support of schools, constitutes the "Permanent School Fund," and a sum equal to six per cent. of the amount of such fund is annually appropriated to the support of common schools, and distributed among the several towns according to the number of children therein between four and twenty-one years of age.

LANDS RESERVED FOR PUBLIC USES.

This fund now amounts to one hundred and twenty-four thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars forty-one cents, (\$124,750.41) being amount received by land agent for sales of timber and grass on reserved lots in unincorporated places, and from time to time paid to the State treasurer, as required by chap. 5, sect. 12 of the revised statutes. When any township or tract is organized as a plantation, the interest on the fund belonging to said plantation is paid annually by the Treasurer of State to such plantation to be applied for the support of schools, according to the number of scholars in each district. When any such township is incorporated as a town, said fund belonging to it is to be paid over by the treasurer of

State to the treasurer of the ministerial and school funds in such town, to be added to the funds of that corporation to be held and managed as other school funds.

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE FUND.

From the sale of land scrip apportioned to the State of Maine by the United States under "an act donating public lands to the several states and territories which may provide colleges for the benefit of agriculture and mechanic arts," approved July 2, 1862, there has been received the sum of one hundred and four thousand six hundred and ninety-four dollars seventy cents (\$104,694.70), and this amount (less \$194.70) has been invested in Bonds of this State, the interest of which is to be "inviolably appropriated to the endowment, support, and maintenance" of the college. "No portion of said fund nor the interest thereon, can be applied to the purchase, erection, preservation, or repair of any building or buildings."

BATES COLLEGE.

There are now deposited in this office ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in bonds of this State redeemable in twenty years, in trust for the "President and Trustees of Bates College," being for scrip donated by the State to the "Maine State Seminary," (now Bates College,) by authority of an act approved March 16, 1855, which act provides that the scrip shall be placed to the credit of the institution in the books of the treasurer, and also deposited in the treasurer's office in trust, and the interest paid them semi-annually—at the expiration of the twenty years the scrip is to be surrendered and cancelled, and new scrip for same amount to be issued for a second period, and so on from one period of twenty years to another, "until such time as the Governor and Council shall determine that it will be for the interest of the State and the college, that the same shall be invested in some other manner, which the Governor and Council shall have authority to cause to be done."

SCHOOL DISTRICT No. 2, TOWN OF MADISON.

This item of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) is derived from a bond of the State of Maine, which by resolve of March 25, 1863, the Treasurer of State was directed to receive of Mahlan D.

Spaulding of Boston, and safely keep and pay to the legal agent of school district No. 2 in the town of Madison, the coupons on said bond as they become due till the maturity of said bond, (1883,) "and after that time to pay to said school agent five per cent. interest on the amount of said bond for all time to come."

MADAWASKA TERRITORY FUND.

The sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) was set apart by act of March 16, 1861, for the benefit of the inhabitants of the Madawaska territory, as their share of the surplus revenue, distributed to the inhabitants of this State in the year 1837, and to remain in the treasury as a permanent fund, the interest of which is to be annually paid for the support of schools in said territory.

PENOBSCOT INDIAN FUND.

The amount to the credit of this fund is the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) received from sales of four townships of land purchased by the State of Maine of said tribe of Indians in 1833, and the receipts from leases of the shores of several islands in the Penobscot river now occupied by said tribe.

PASSAMAQUODDY INDIAN FUND.

This fund is derived from proceeds of sale in 1853, of timber and grass on Indian township, and receipts from Land Agent, under resolve of February 29, 1868. Present amount of fund, \$25,613.71

SANFORD LEGACY.

The sum of thirteen hundred dollars (\$1,300) was paid into the State treasury in 1854, under the will of Isaac Sanford. The sum of \$700 was bequeathed to the State Reform School, and \$600 for the benefit of indigent blind and deaf and dumb mutes, natives of the State of Maine, the interest of which is to be expended under the direction of the Governor and Council.

UNION MUTUAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

Is an institution chartered in this State in 1848, and organized in 1849, and as a prerequisite to the establishment of agencies in other States in compliance with the laws thereof, has deposited with the treasurer of this State, in bonds of this State, the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in trust for the benefit of all the policy holders in said company under the provisions of the 49th chapter of the revised statutes of this State.

SOLDIERS' ALLOTMENTS.

The sum of \$3,261.59 stands credited on the books in the treasurer's office to soldiers' allotments. This sum is the balance of \$815,189.62, deposited with the State Treasurer by authority of "an act relating to the receipt and disbursement of funds of the Maine volunteers," approved March 18, 1862.

The above balance is due to the persons mentioned in the schedule annexed, in which is given the sum credited to each, the company and regiment to which they belonged, and place of residence as far as known :

In consequence of the numerous successful burglaries in all parts of the country, the holding of coupon bonds has become very hazardous, and application has frequently been made at this office by holders of the coupon bonds of this State, to have them exchanged for registered bonds; but the treasurer under existing laws has no authority to make the exchange, and it is therefore

recommended to the legislature, that upon such terms and under such regulations as they may think advisable, authority be given the treasurer to exchange when desired by holders, coupon for registered bonds.

The treasurer has had no occasion to avail himself of the provision of a resolve approved March 13, 1869, authorizing a temporary loan in case the wants of the treasury should render it necessary.

The maturing obligations of the State for 1870 are the balance of loan negotiated in 1855, (\$8,000,) and the seventeenth yearly instalment due on notes given to State of Massachusetts in 1853, for purchase of lands (\$25,000).

During the past year the receipts from the land office have been twenty-nine thousand seven hundred twenty-four dollars forty-eight cents (\$29,724.48,) and of this sum \$14,110.28 was on account of the permanent school fund and \$15,614.20 on general account.
