The following act of Congress, granting aid to the European and North American Railway Company, is considered of sufficient interest to be inserted in this report:

AN ACT providing for refunding the interest paid by the State of Massachusetts on money expended by her on account of the war of eighteen hundred and twelve to eighteen hundred and fifteen.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That there be allowed on the claim of the State of Massachusetts, for interest paid by her on money expended by said State on account of the war with Great Britain in eighteen hundred and twelve to eighteen hundred and fifteen, the sum of six hundred and seventy-eight thousand three hundred and sixty-two dollars and forty-one cents, in full of said claim; and whereas by an arrangement made by the said State of Massachusetts and the State of Maine, at the time of their separation, in eighteen hundred and twenty, the said State of Maine becomes the owner of one-third of this claim; and whereas both of said States have assigned their respective interests in said claim to the European and North American Railway Company of Maine, to aid said company in constructing its line of railway, the Secretary of the Treasury is hereby authorized and directed to pay one-third part of the said claim of six hundred and seventy-eight thousand three hun-

dred and sixty-two dollars and forty-one cents to the State of Maine, and the other two-thirds part thereof to the State of Massachusetts, by an issue to each of said States for the use and benefit of said European and North American Railway Company, of an amount of United States certificates of indebtedness equal to its share in the whole sum allowed and to be paid; said certificates to be of the denomination of one thousand dollars each, to be made and issued by the Secretary of the Treasury in such form, and signed, attested and registered as he shall direct, and with or without interest warrants as he may prefer. Each certificate to run five years from its date, to draw interest, payable semi-annually, at the rate of four per centum per annum, and to be payable, both principal and interest, in lawful money of the United States, to be hereafter appropriated and provided for by Congress.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That the acceptance by the said States of Massachusetts and Maine and the said European and North American Railway Company of the amount hereby authorized to be paid to each of said States for the use and benefit of said railway company shall be held and regarded as a full adjustment and payment of any and all claims for interest as aforesaid, and also a complete adjustment, liquidation and payment of any and all other claims of the said States of Massachusetts and Maine, and of said railway company, or either of them, against the United States for and on account of any matters arising from any money expended by said State of Massachusetts on account of the war with Great Britain, in eighteen hundred and twelve to eighteen hundred and fifteen, or any interest thereon, or on account of any matters arising out of or accruing from the treaty with Great Britain known as the treaty of Washington, or for or on account of any other matters which have been assigned by said States of Massachusetts and Maine to said railway company.

Approved, July 8, 1870.

The State of Massachusetts by authority of the 248th chapter of the acts of said State for the year 1865, having assigned her interest in the said claim ($\frac{2}{3}$) to the State of Maine in trust for the European and North American Railway Company to aid in the construction of the railroad of said company, and the Governor and Treasurer of the State of Massachusetts having given the Treasurer of this State an order, dated September 20, 1870, on the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States for all certificates of indebtedness to be issued in accordance with the provisions of the act of Congress of July 8, 1870, the Treasurer, in the month of November last proceeded to Washington and received of the Secretary of the Treasury the sum of six hundred seventy-eight thousand dollars (\$678,000) in certificates of indebtedness issued in conformity with the act aforesaid.

In compliance with an order of Council passed September 28, and another passed December 7, 1870, the Treasurer of State has

delivered to the President of the European and North American Railway Company, on an order from the treasurer of said company, all the certificates of indebtedness received by him from the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States.

At the date of my last report, the public debt of this State was \$8,100,000, and by the payment of \$25,000 to the State of Massachusetts, and \$8,000 the balance of a loan created in 1855, the debt has decreased \$33,000.

During the year 1871, there will become due \$840,000 of the public debt, viz :

\$15,000.....	March 1.
250,000.....	May 10.
300,000.....	July 1.
250,000.....	August 1.
25,000.....	October 5.

Of the above sum, \$15,000 is due on a loan created in 1856, \$800,000 for war loan created in 1861, and \$25,000 is the ninth of ten notes of \$25,000 each, given to the State of Massachusetts in 1853 for the purchase of Massachusetts lands; and by resolve of March 23, 1870, these several sums with interest are payable in coin, or its equivalent in currency, and it is estimated that it will require \$57,000 to meet the conditions of the resolve, so that the full amount of payments to be made on account of the public debt and interest during the present year in coin, will be \$624,000.

To meet this loan of \$800,000, and other loans created by the necessities of the war, the sinking fund of 1865 was established. This fund on the first day of January, 1870, amounted to the sum of.....\$972,530 00

The Treasurer will find it necessary to avail himself of the provisions of an act approved January 28, 1865, which authorizes him, with the approval of the Governor, to sell or dispose of such portion of the bonds belonging to the said fund, as may be necessary to meet the bonds as they mature, and apply the proceeds to their payment.

The sinking fund established by an act approved March 7, 1868, for the payment of the municipal war debt loan, now amounts to the sum of \$92,048.55, invested as follows :

Referring to the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States, which decided that all unsatisfied contracts for the payment of money existing prior to the 25th day of February, 1862, are payable in coin, the Legislature passed the following resolve on the 23d day of March, 1870 :

" *Resolved*, That while the said judicial opinion stands as the authoritative judgment of the said court, all such contracts made by this State prior to the date aforesaid, should be paid at matu-

rity, in coin or its equivalent in currency, and the Treasurer of State is hereby authorized to act accordingly."

Acting under this authority, the Treasurer has paid all maturing obligations of this State that came within the scope of this resolve (\$68,760) in coin, or its equivalent in currency, paying therefor in premium the sum of \$9,585.78, or about 13 15-16 per cent., exceeding the sum appropriated for the purchase of coin by \$3,085.78.

It will be seen that the resolve of March 23, 1870, contemplates a possible reversal of the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States, referred to therein, and an expectation that it would be reversed has been more or less generally entertained in the community, but it seems improbable that the State will be relieved from the operation of the resolve referred to at present, and an appropriation will therefore be necessary to meet the requirements of the resolve.

On the eighteenth day of January, 1870, all the bonds and coupons redeemed in 1869, amounting to the sum of \$350,145.00, viz: \$37,000 in bonds, and \$313,145.00 in coupons, were burnt by the Committee appointed to examine the Treasurer's accounts, and a record made thereof on the books in the Treasurer's office.

By virtue of the authority given for the registration of State bonds, the Treasurer has received \$639,000 in coupon bonds of this State, and issued in lieu thereof a like sum in registered bonds, which are represented by seventy-six certificates. The coupon bonds received have all been cancelled as provided by statute, but not destroyed, and it is respectfully recommended, that after the accounts have been examined by the Committee appointed for that purpose, that these cancelled bonds and coupons should be destroyed by burning, as provided for bonds and coupons matured and paid.

The Treasurer received of the American Bank Note Company, which was employed to engrave the Municipal War Debt bonds, 7,210 sheets of bonds with coupons attached, of the following denominations, viz:

The *ordinary demands* upon the Treasury will require the assessment of a State tax for the year 1871, of five mills on the dollar of the valuation, being a reduction of one-sixth from the State tax of 1870.
