To the Governor and Council:

I herewith submit my report of the business of this department for the year ending November 1, 1876.

REVENUE CASES.

Several of the Railroad Corporations in this State have claimed exemption from the operation of the act of 1874, authorizing a tax on railroad franchises. They based their claim on certain provisions concerning taxation in their charters, that they contend are contracts which the act of 1874 impairs, contrary to the Constitution of the United States. The Maine Central Railroad Company, the Atlantic and Saint Lawrence Railroad Company and the Dexter and Newport Railroad Company, have for this reason refused to pay the taxes assessed upon their franchises.

The Maine Central, being the largest corporation, and owning more miles of road than all the others, the State Treasurer in 1875 proposed to issue his warrant of distress against that corporation for the unpaid tax of 1874. One of the stockholders, Mr. Ward, residing in another State, applied to the U. S. Circuit Court and obtained a temporary injunction upon the Treasurer. The Attorney General, being engaged at the time in the trial of cases, Hon. Rufus P. Tapley was employed by the Governor and Council of that year to appear for the Treasurer. This suit was pending when the present Attorney General came into office, and at his request Mr. Tapley was continued in the case.

When the question of the collection of the tax of 1875 came up, I was of the opinion that the corporations named were sincere in

their claim of exemption on constitutional grounds, and that it was advisable, both for the State and the corporations, that this claim should be passed upon by our own courts in the first instance. I therefore advised a waiving of the summary process, and a resort to an action in the Supreme Judicial Court. A suit was begun against the Maine Central R. R. Co. in Cumberland County at the April Term. I was met in a liberal spirit by the defendants, and with the kind assistance of their counsel, Hon. J. H. Drummond, a case was at once made up for the Law Court, presenting the decisive issue, shorn of all technicalities. The cause was argued at Portland at the July Term. In addition to my own argument for the State, Hon. R. P. Tapley, who was present, also made at my invitation an able and forcible argument. Mr. Drummond argued ably for the corporation.

No decision has yet been announced but one may be expected soon. We hope it will be favorable to the State, in which event, unless an appeal is taken to the Supreme Court of the United States, I assume that the other companies will at once pay the arrears of taxes. In the meantime I have advised against a multiplicity of suits, when the one already before the Court may render other suits unnecessary. For the reason that the issues are so nearly alike, the injunction case in the Circuit Court has not been pushed by either side, and no decision has been rendered.

The Winthrop Savings Bank went into the hands of a Receiver prior to Nov. 1, 1875, and the Receiver refused to pay the tax payable within forty-five days thereafter, claiming that there was nothing to tax, the bank having ceased to exist. I advised that the amount be proved before the Commissioners as a preferred claim. This was done, and the Commissioners declined to allow it. William P. Whitehouse, Esq., Attorney for the State for Kennebec County, at my request objected to the acceptance by the Court of the report of the Commissioners. The objection was overruled and exceptions taken. These were argued at the May Term by Mr. Whitehouse and myself for the State, and by Mr. Bean for the Receiver. In behalf of the State it was contended that the tax was on the deposits and that the tax lien followed them into the hands of the Receiver.

The decision was adverse to the State. This may necessitate the refunding by the State of taxes paid by Receivers of other Insolvent Banks. Applications will undoubtedly be made for that purpose to the Legislature.

I would recommend that the law in relation to the tax on Savings Banks be amended by providing a penalty upon the officers of the bank for neglecting to make the required returns, and also enlarging the remedies for the collection of the tax. As the Savings Banks usually possess but little property which can be reached by the Sheriff, a warrant of distress may often be ineffective. A thoroughly efficacious remedy would be a forfeiture of the charter for the non-payment of the tax.

I would also recommend an amendment to meet and remedy the difficulty caused by the adverse decision of the Court. This might be done by an act declaring the tax to be on the deposits and to be paid by whatever corporation or person held the assets of the bank.

CAPITAL CASES.

I have not been informed of any indictment found in any County during the year for any capital offence, or offence heretofore called capital. There have been several homicides of different degrees of turpitude in the State. Some were apparently cases of manslaughter, and in some others the offenders were committed to the Insane Hospital for inquisition upon the question of their sanity. These may result in indictments. One case, however, unquestionably will result in an indictment for murder. That case is the horrible murder of the Trim family in Bucksport in October last. One Edward M. Smith has been committed to await the action of the Grand Jury. George P. Dutton, Esq., Attorney for the State for Hancock County, is preparing the evidence for the Grand Jury with commendable skill and industry.

While the local officers have been diligent in working up these cases, and are deserving of much praise, I am convinced by observation that the Governor or Attorney General should have power to detail officers from any part of the State to investigate the facts in such cases. Such officers should have the power to obtain the assistance of chemical and other experts. Their compensation and expenses should be paid by the State after the bills are properly audited. I would urge the enactment of a law to that end. It might be well to extend it also to cases of burglary and some other offences.

A case of arson has also arisen in Hancock County which will undoubtedly result in an indictment.

THE LAW COURT.

I have personally attended all the sessions of the Law Court during the year. Tables A and B, annexed, give the details of the business of the State at those sessions. In this list of cases, besides those already mentioned, the only cases of peculiar interest are what are known as the "*venire* cases" in Penobscot County, and the Portland Liquor Agency case in Cumberland County. The *venire* cases were pleas in abatement to several indictments, alleging the want of the seal of the court on the venires for grand jurors. The Legislature had passed a statute making the venires valid, and this statute, the defendants contended was unconstitutional. Jasper Hutchins, Esq., attorney for the State for Penobscot county, assisted me with a very able and exhaustive argument in support of the statute. John Varney, Esq., and F. H. Appleton, Esq., argued for the defendants very ably and elaborately.

The Cumberland case involved the question of the authority of the Mayor to nominate a liquor agent. The defendant was appointed by the Board of Aldermen without the concurrence of the Mayor. I have not learned of a decision in either case.

BUSINESS IN THE COUNTIES.

From the reports of the County Attorneys I have prepared tables which will show the amount and kinds of business done in the several counties, and also the present state of the business. These tables are appended. It is evident from them, that the County Attorneys are busy in the enforcement of the laws. The great bulk of the prosecutions are for violations of the liquor law, which, in my judgment, is enforced as faithfully and diligently as any other statute.

The great proportion of convictions over acquittals in the counties, and the trifling number of adverse decisions in the Law Court (less than half a dozen, so far), attest the great care and discretion with which the County Attorneys have performed their delicate and important duties.

Several of the County Attorneys have also rendered the State most valuable service before the Law Court. I think it important that the County Attorneys should attend the Law Courts in person, and assist in the presentation of the cases from their county.

They would be familiar with the history and character of the case, and could for that reason often render valuable assistance. I would recommend that the necessary expenses of the County Attorney in attending the Law Court in his District, be paid him by the State, and would urge legislation to that end.

I have also tabulated the reports of the County Treasurers that I have received, but the majority of the County Treasurers have neglected compliance with the law. This disobedience of the County Treasurers has become too common. Every Attorney General, for years, has urged the imposition of a penalty for such disobedience. I urge it in my turn, and trust the Legislature will take some action.

The other business of this office, in the way of advising the different departments in matters of law, will appear from the records and files of those departments.
