REPORT.

LAND OFFICE, December 1, 1878.

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

In compliance with the provisions of law, I herewith present the Annual Report of the operations of the Land Department during the past year.

SALES OF LAND.

By reference to the schedules annexed to this report, it will be seen that there have been conveyed of the public lands during the year under acts and resolves of the Legislature, for cash, 4,886.85 acres, for \$1,113.13; also at public auction in Bangor, November 21st, for cash, 9,133.86 acres for \$2,563.01; also the right to cut timber on two townships of land until 1884, for \$1,001.35; also one island for \$11.50, and one other sold under the act of 1877, for \$15.00; under special resolves of the Legislature, 3,815.83 acres; to actual settlers on the surrender of outstanding land certificates, 28,924.31 acres; to Swedish immigrants, 7,493.29 acres; under the Treaty of Washington, 277.00 acres, and to actual settlers by conditional deeds, for road labor notes, under resolve entitled "Resolve in relation to township fourteen, range four, in Aroostook county," (Perham plantation,) approved March 15, 1861, 3,634.33 acres. There have also been contracted to actual settlers, by land certificates for road labor notes, 13,889.06 acres for \$4,915.99, as shown by schedule H annexed to this report.

By reference to schedule L, it will be seen that there are now under contract to actual settlers, 71,975.48 acres. I would call particular attention to this as showing a very

important item in the work of closing up the affairs of the office. A year ago there were under contract to settlers 112,805.04 acres.

SUMMARY.

In accordance with the provisions of statute of February 22, 1876, chapter 119, it has been the endeavor of the Land Agent, under the direction of the Governor and Council, to bring to a termination all unsettled business connected with the office relating to the lands belonging to the State, as speedily as the public good would allow, in order that the office might be discontinued at the earliest practicable moment. To this end every reasonable effort has been made to bring to the attention of the public the opportunities afforded for settlers, under the act of February 23, 1876, by a wide-spread circulation of circulars prepared for the purpose, as also by information through the public press and by private correspondence. Efforts have also been made to bring to a close all outstanding contracts with settlers, by urging prompt performance of settling duties, and thus securing unconditional titles to their selected lands.

The islands along the coast belonging to the State have been sold and conveyed, except in some unimportant cases, and where serious doubts exist as to the right of the State to interfere. Moneys due the State from land sold or otherwise connected with the office have been, as far as possible, collected. The plans in the Land Office have been carefully arranged, repaired and neatly bound, and all put in proper order and form for future preservation and use, leaving but little more to be done in that direction. In a word, every branch of business connected with the office has received the most careful attention and oversight.

In obedience to the provisions of chapter 51 of the public acts of 1878, "relating to the public lands," the Land Agent, under the direction of the Governor and Council, has made a careful investigation of all titles held by the State, and during the past year all the lands not taken up by settlers in townships appropriated for settlement, have been sold as

appears by schedules annexed to this report, thus leaving the State devoid of all its once rich and extensive landed possessions. As many of the deeds have been conditional in their nature, and many of the settlers have no other than certificated titles as yet, it is very probable that there will be more or less forfeitures, in which cases the lands will necessarily be again for sale.

There will always remain, however, a very important duty to be performed in the care and custody of the archives, now so well arranged. It is to be remembered that the plans and records alluded to cover almost every square mile of the whole territory of our State. They are of course constantly sought for, and their contents inquired about. Such calls come from every part of the State, and the convenience of the people demands that they be put in charge of an officer ready to give information and certify copies.

PERHAM.

Under the Resolve, chapter 64 of 1878, "relating to Perham plantation," proceedings have been had by the Land Agent, under the instruction of the Governor and Council, which have resulted in a favorable and amicable settlement of the disputes existing between certain proprietors on the one side and the State and settlers on the other, whereby all difficulties in the future are prevented and the settlers all quieted in their respective possessions. The proprietors having released all their claim to all the lots taken up or fit for settlers, the State released to them its title to other lots declared unfit for that purpose, and thus a bargain made really advantageous for both parties.

LOTS RESERVED FOR PUBLIC USES.

The constitutional provision, in the articles of separation and the laws passed in obedience to it, have left in the hands of the State in all conveyances of townships made by it, lots reserved for public uses or schools. In respect to such as lie in incorporated towns the fee has vested in the town, and

the care and sale of them devolved upon the trustees of the Ministerial and School Fund of the towns, respectively. In all other cases the care is devolved on the land agent, no authority existing for their sale, but only for the sale of the timber and grass growing upon them. With reference to those townships far removed from settlements, no questions can probably arise for a long course of years, if indeed ever. With another, and numerous class, where settlements have already commenced and plantation organizations have been perfected, a duty is devolved on the land office to care for and protect them and see that the income from stumpages is properly secured and paid into the State treasury. This duty for the few past years has been quite burdensome, calling for a great deal of labor and attention. A large number of disputes arising from this source have been adjusted, leaving at present very few unsettled. As, however, these disputes are constantly liable to arise, it becomes necessary to make provision for them.

TRIP TO AROOSTOOK.

In anticipation of the closing up of the land office, and to acquaint ourselves as fully as possible with the present condition of the places with which the office has had and still has so much to do, the land agent with Hon. Mr. Lacy of the Executive Council, during the last autumn made a tour through the northern part of the State. Passing up the State road, through Patten, Masardis, Ashland, to Fort Kent, and thence down the border to Houlton, we visited most of the towns and places which have grown up under the settlement laws of the State, including Caribou, Fort Fairfield, Presque Isle, and a score of other places already so well known for their progress in wealth and population. From personal observation and careful inquiries, we find ourselves able to report along our whole journey, and all over that portion of the State, a degree of success and contentment attendant upon the efforts and enterprise of the settlers that could not have been reasonably anticipated. Abundant crops

have everywhere compensated the labors of the husbandman, fairly vying with those of all and any other parts of New England, if not of the whole country. It may indeed be justly called the garden of Maine, if not of a very much wider sphere.

Of the very many townships which in years past have been set apart for settlement, all the lots have been taken up by actual settlers which are regarded as suitable, and all or very nearly all are now actually occupied and tilled by active and industrious agriculturalists. As a result of this, thriving villages have grown up to vie with those of older parts of the State, and a degree of prosperity is found to prevail, giving the greatest encouragement of future permanence and growth. A railroad is already built several miles into the northern part of the county, connecting through the Province with the European and North American Railway, which passes through and along its southern limit, and the prospect is now flattering that another road connecting immediately with Bangor is an enterprise of the near future.

During the few past years, the progress of settlement has been comparatively rapid and permanent, giving the country a remarkable appearance of prosperity and active enterprise. The wilderness is fast giving place to the demands of settlement; and farms and households are rapidly taking the place of the forests and the lumber camps. Settlers once established seldom quit their locations, thus evidencing the true character of the country as one desirable for homes and rich in agricultural wealth and enterprise. The quantity and quality of agricultural products produced are excelled by those of few other places, while the present facilities for reaching a market give an advantage enjoyed by few places equally remote from the great centers of trade and commerce.

At the colony of New Sweden we found every evidence of prosperity and contentment. The township, six miles square, is all taken up, every lot suitable for settlement being occupied, and many lots taken in adjoining townships. New accessions are being made of inhabitants, and new buildings

are of frequent occurrence. The State must ever feel under peculiar obligations to Hon. William W. Thomas, Jr., for the initiation and continued progress of this enterprise, as without him it would never have been conceived or undertaken. It cannot now fail of being regarded as a success, and as seed for future harvest we may justly prize it as containing the elements of a rich growth to our State. The immigrants are all persons of hardy, temperate and industrious habits, well inclined to our government and institutions, and desirous of making of themselves citizens as soon as the law admits. These qualities all commend the colony as highly worthy of our best wishes and support.

SETTLEMENTS.

With reference to the matter of settlement in our wilderness domain, it may be proper to note the fact, for general information, that all the public lands of the State having been disposed of, no further favors are now within the power of the State to grant for homesteads to settlers. All lots suitable for settlement, the title of which is in the State, amounting to 71,975.48 acres, have been taken up, and all others have been sold, leaving none for future applicants. But still, there remain large tracts of land in Aroostook and other counties belonging to private owners or proprietors, of the same general productive character as those already spoken of, which the owners are ready to sell for homes and farms, and, too, at prices which give purchasers advantages over other and less favorable localities.

LAW SUIT.

Among the unsettled affairs of the land office is a suit at law against John J. Haley, in the Circuit Court of the United States, to recover about \$1,800 due for stumpage of logs cut on the State's land and run to St. John, at which place it is alleged they were taken by the defendant. The suit will probably be tried in April next.

LOCAL AGENTS.

Under the provisions of section twenty-eight, chapter five of the Revised Statutes, the following persons residing in the vicinity of the public lands, were appointed "to superintend the location of settlers, the payment of their road labor, and the performance of their several duties :"
