Under the authority of a resolve of the Legislature, approved the twenty-first day of February, 1878, authorizing a temporary loan of three hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as might be necessary to meet the wants of the Treasury the current year, the Treasurer has procured one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, for which three notes were given, as follows :

1st, September 23, 1878, for four months, \$50,000, payable January 23, 1879.

2d, October 18, 1878, for four months, \$50,000, payable February 18, 1879.

3d, November 18, 1878, for three months, \$50,000, payable February 18, 1879.

All of which draws interest at the rate of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. per annum. It will be necessary for the Legislature to provide for these notes when due.



On the first day of January, 1878, the funded debt of this State amounted to \$5,873,900. Since that date \$25,000, being balance of the Aroostook war loan, has been paid, leaving the debt at \$5,848,900, from which deducting the sinking fund of \$1,032,995, leaves the present debt at \$4,815,905.

Chapter 42 of the public laws of 1878, provides that any railroad which has omitted to apply to the Governor and Council under chapter 19 of the public acts of 1875, for abatement of valuation claimed to be excessive, and whose claim for such abatement was barred by the limitation contained in said chapter, were permitted to apply in writing to the Governor and Council at any time within sixty days from the approval of the law, for an abatement of the excess of valuation of said company for any previous year.

The Maine Central Railroad Company after contesting, without avail, before the Supreme Court of this State, the legality of the taxes assessed upon said road by the Governor and Council, appealed the case to the Supreme Court of the United States, and the decision of that tribunal being in favor of the State, the road then made application to the Governor and Council under the law of 1878, for an abatement of taxes which they claimed to be excessive.

The Governor and Council having had this matter of abating the taxes assessed upon the Maine Central Railroad under consideration, made the following report :

#### STATE OF MAINE.

IN COUNCIL, Dec. 4, 1878.

The Standing Committee on Taxation and Expenditures, to which was recommitted the accompanying papers with instructions, Report :

That in accordance with said instructions, they have made up the following statement. That the value of real estate and other property, actually subject to local taxation for the year 1874, should be fixed at \$489,100; for the year 1875, should be fixed at \$488,520; for the year 1876, should be fixed at \$493,623, according to the schedule following :

## TAXES AS ASSESSED.

No benefit of the abatement made by the Governor and Council can be taken by the railroad unless they pay all arrearages of taxes due into the State Treasury within four months after the adjudication.

Suits have been commenced against both the Dexter and Newport and the Atlantic and St. Lawrence railroads for all arrears of taxes.

The case against the Dexter and Newport road has been argued before the full court, but no decision can be expected for the present.

The Committee on Financial Affairs, to whom was referred the State Treasurer's accounts for the year 1877, having found the same correct and properly vouched, and made record thereof on the books in this office; and also made record of the destruction, by burning, of all bonds and interest coupons redeemed during the year 1877, amounting in bonds to \$46,500, and in coupons to \$257,382, exclusive of \$96,825 interest paid on registered bonds and warrant.

The same committee likewise destroyed all bonds and coupons attached, that were presented for registration during the year, amounting to the sum of \$150,000—together with registered bonds received for re-issue, amounting to the sum of \$13,000—and due record was made of said transaction.

During the year 1878, coupon bonds to the amount of \$447,000 have been received and cancelled, and registered bonds for a like sum issued therefor; and \$12,000 in registered bonds have been surrendered by the holders, and new bonds issued to other parties.

The annexed table shows the returns made to this office by the several Savings Banks of their average deposits,

"deducting an amount equal to the amount of United States bonds, and the value of real estate owned by each bank or institution," for the six months ending and including the last Saturday of April, 1878, and for the six months ending and including the last Saturday of October, 1878.

From these returns it will be seen that there was a falling off in deposits from April to October of \$3,330,729.

On the Saturday preceding the first Monday of November, 1876, the Waterville Savings Bank made returns to this office of the amount of deposits in said bank for the preceding six months in the sum of \$365,828.40. The tax on this deposit being \$1,829.14, the bank refused to pay, on the ground "that they were closed up and suspended during that period." A suit was commenced by the Treasurer, and the Court has recently rendered judgment in favor of the State, execution issued, and the amount of tax, with cost and interest due on the same, has been paid into the Treasury.

The Treasurer in his last report estimated the receipts from the Land Department for the current year at \$8,000, but for the year ending December 31, 1878, the Hon. E. C. Burleigh, Land Agent, has paid into the Treasury the sum of \$14,273.12, as follows:

## REVENUE.

The receipts from all sources for the year (less temporary loan of \$150,000) have been \$1,050,100, and the expenditures for the same time were \$1,273,376, showing a deficiency of revenue to meet the ordinary expenses of the State of \$223,276.

The estimated receipts from the tax of 1878 were \$35,000, while the large amount of \$122,630 has been received on that tax, which is not due till January 1st, 1879. If only the usual amount had been paid into the treasury the deficiency would have been much larger.

The estimated receipts for 1879 are \$1,125,319, and if the expenditures aggregate about the same as in 1878, there will be a deficiency of about \$150,000 to be provided for in addition to the temporary loan of \$150,000 contracted this year.
