On the first day of January, 1880, the bonded debt of this State amounted to the sum of \$5,848,900 from which, deducting the

present amount of the sinking fund, \$1,166,159 leaves the present debt at \$4,682,741 and for this an equal amount of coupon or registered bonds are now outstanding.

There seems to be some misapprehension in relation to the "Trust Funds" held by the State, but if the subject is fully examined it will be found that no wrong has been done, and that the several acts and resolves, creating the same, have been fully carried out. The Treasurer would suggest that the Legislature give the matter a thorough examination.

The following table exhibits in detail the present amount of the bonded debt.

By an act approved February 24, 1875, and by an act to amend said act approved February 21, 1878, the Treasurer of State was authorized to renew and extend so much of the public debt (\$307,000) as matured August 15, 1880, as well as other portions of the public debt, and as no part of this debt has been presented for renewal or extension, provision must be made for the payment, provided the holders of said bonds should not wish to renew or extend. To meet these bonds at maturity, the Treasurer would recommend that authority be given the Treasurer of State to issue proposals for a ten year loan for the sum of \$307,000, or so much thereof as may be outstanding on the fifteenth day of August, 1880.

The wants of the Treasury requiring more money than the Treasurer had at his command, he procured under the authority given in the resolve approved March 3, 1879, the sum of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars, (\$125,000) and for which he gave five notes as follows :

All of which the Treasurer obtained at the rate of three and one half per cent. per annum.

The committee to whom was referred the State Treasurer's accounts for the year 1878 for settlement, having found the same correct and properly vouched, made record thereof on the books in this office, and also made record of the destruction by burning, of all bonds and interest coupons redeemed during the year 1878, amounting in bonds to \$25,000, and in coupons to \$245,184, exclusive of \$106,860 for interest paid on registered bonds. They likewise destroyed all bonds and coupons attached, that were presented for registration during the year, amounting to \$447,000, together with registered bonds received for re-issue, amounting to \$12,000, and duly recorded the same.

During the year 1879 coupon bonds to the amount of \$49,000 have been received and cancelled, and registered bonds for the same amount issued therefor, and \$194,000 in registered bonds have been surrendered by the holders, cancelled, and new bonds issued to other parties.

The Act of 1874, relating to taxation of railroads, provides that when a "tax is paid, it shall be the duty of the State Treasurer to credit to each town in which shareholders resided on the first day of April preceding, such proportion of said tax as the number of shares owned in said town bears to the whole number thereof, the remainder to be retained for the use of the State."

The State tax for 1878 and 1879 was 4 mills on the State valuation of 1870, producing in each year in round numbers \$900,000. It is very evident that under the existing rate of expenditures the State tax must be increased, but at what rate cannot be ascertained until the new valuation is completed, as upon that valuation the State tax for 1880 will be assessed.
