*To the Governor and Council of the State of Maine:*

I have the honor to submit for consideration, my report of the business of this office for the preceding year.

### TAXATION.

The Legislature of 1880, having in view a more equal distribution of the burdens of taxation, and believing that fairness and equality required the imposition of a reasonable assessment upon corporate wealth, and corporations doing business in this State, thereby compelled to bear their fair proportion of the public burdens, passed several acts relating to the subject, calculated to secure new sources of revenue. The subjects embraced in the different statutes, were railroad corporations, telegraph and express companies.

These artificial persons, created and doing business in this State by authority of the Legislature of Maine, have property extending over a considerable portion of its territory, and should pay their just and equal proportion of the expenses of the government which granted their privileges and guarantees to them security in the exercise of their rights and enjoyment of acquired property.

In nearly all the States of the Union, there has been difficulty in devising a method for taxing property of this character, which, in its application, would be equitable towards the corporations, and secure to the State such portion of its revenues as should be realized from such source. The systems adopted by the several States are varied, and in many instances, serious obstacles have been encountered in the practical application of specific statutes. The act of

1880, called for a new method of assessing the railroad tax. The Governor and Council, in applying the law, were without the aid of a judicial interpretation, but in the performance of the difficult and arduous duties assigned under the provisions of the statute, there was a manifest determination to deal *justly* and administer the law *impartially*.

By virtue of the statute authorizing the assessment, the tax against the various railroad companies not exempt therefrom by their charters, became due, one-half on the first day of July last, and the balance on the first day of October following. Certain companies having declined to pay the assessment, claiming that the act under which the levy was made, was in contravention of the Constitution of the State, suit was at once commenced against the Maine Central Railroad Company for the first instalment, returnable at the October term, A. D. 1880, of the Supreme Judicial Court in Cumberland county. Under the rules of procedure in the Supreme Court, the case would not be reached for trial before the January term following; and questions of law arising, it would not, except by the consent of the defendant corporation, get before the full Court for determination, before July, A. D. 1881. The President of the Maine Central Railroad Company, Hon. George E. B. Jackson, and Messrs. Drummond and Drummond, counsel for the company, expressed a desire that the validity of the act should be speedily determined, and consented to make up a case in which the constitutionality of the statute should be the *sole question* submitted; the regularity of the proceedings of all State officers in the assessment of the tax, being admitted. The case is in order to be argued and submitted to the Court for determination.

Suits have also been commenced against the Boston and Maine Railroad, and Portland, Saco and Portsmouth Railroad Company, for the recovery of the tax assessed against them.

The principal portion of the tax assessed upon telegraph lines, is against the Maine Telegraph Company, the International, and Western Union. The lines of the Maine and International are under lease to, and operated by the Western Union. The tax against the Maine has been paid, but payment on the part of the International and Western Union is resisted. Suits have been commenced against the two last named corporations, returnable at the January term of the Supreme Court in Cumberland county.

## LIFE SENTENCES.

At the March term, A. D. 1880, of the Supreme Judicial Court in the County of Knox, Hannah Thorndike was sentenced to the State Prison for life, for the murder of Honora Sullivan. The crime was committed on the second day of October, A. D. 1878.

James J. Norris, of Bradley, in the County of Penobscot, was murdered on the night of November 7, 1879. At the time of his death he was Treasurer of the town of Bradley, and held the position of Clerk and Treasurer of the Cutler and Eddy Saw Mill Company. He was a gentleman of great respectability, of excellent business capacity, and enjoyed the confidence and esteem of the entire community. The murder was committed in the evening, while Mr. Norris was returning from his place of business to his boarding-house. The circumstances attending the commission of the crime, were most brutal and barbarous. The entire community was shocked, and feelings of alarm pervaded every household. Prompt and efficient measures were at once taken by officers and citizens, for the discovery of the perpetrator of this inhuman offence, and suspicion was directed towards one Joseph Bolduc, a Frenchman, who had previously been in the employ of the deceased. Bolduc was arrested at Newport, while endeavoring to make his escape to Canada; was returned to Bangor, and committed to await the action of the grand jury. An indictment against him was found at the term of the Supreme Judicial Court, held at Bangor, in February, A. D. 1880. The respondent pleaded guilty, and a life sentence in the State Prison was imposed.

Jason Scribner, in October, 1879, at a term of the Supreme Judicial Court, held in the County of Kennebec, was convicted of the murder of his child, and sentenced, January 27, 1880, to imprisonment for life.

At the last September term of the Superior Court in Cumberland county, James M. Lowe was sentenced to imprisonment and labor in the State Prison for the term of his natural life. He was adjudged guilty of the murder of his own brother. It appeared that, on the 26th of September, 1879, in the evening, the accused left the New England House, in Portland, walked to Cumberland, a distance of ten miles, secreted himself about the premises of his brother, Joseph A. Lowe, and awaited his return from West Cumberland, where he had been in attendance upon a fair. His

murderous purpose was carried into execution upon his brother's return; and James, after the commission of the crime, returned on foot to Portland, arriving there about four o'clock the following morning. While he was by some suspected of the offence, evidence of the fact was unattainable. His subsequent pretended anxiety to discover the murderer of his brother, volunteering his assistance to the officers, advancing theoretical propositions as to the manner of the commission of the crime; while intended by him to disarm the officers of all suspicion against him, really confirmed them in the belief of his guilt; and he was arrested on the 28th of November following, and committed without bail. He subsequently made a voluntary confession of his crime.

Jennie Fraser, indicted at the January term, 1880, of the Superior Court for Cumberland county, for the crime of arson, was sentenced, at the September term following, to imprisonment for life.

In the case of Patrick Hurley, charged with a similar offence, the exceptions filed by the counsel for respondent, were overruled by the full Court, in July last, and a life sentence was imposed at the September term, 1880, of the Superior Court in Cumberland county.

Sarah Morrissy was sentenced, at the same term, to imprisonment for life, for the murder of her infant child.

#### CRIMINAL BUSINESS IN THE COUNTIES.

From the carefully prepared reports of the prosecuting officers of the different counties, I have completed and annexed tables, showing specifically the amount and nature of the business in the several counties.

I have attended the sessions of the Law Court, and table "A" will give a list of the State cases there disposed of.

Table "F," prepared from the reports of the county treasurers, shows the amounts paid out for costs of prosecutions, etc.

The business of this office, in connection with the various departments of the State Government, will appear on the files of the different departments.
