GENTLEMEN: I have the honor to submit herewith a report of this department for the year ending December 31, 1881, showing the number of applications for State Pension received, the number allowed, and the amount expended during the year, with certain facts, conclusions and tables.

REPORT.

The law authorizing pensions for disabled soldiers and seamen residing in Maine, who served in the army or navy of the United States in the war of 1861, on the quota of Maine, and to the widows, orphan children under twelve years of age, orphan minor children over twelve years of age, who are partially or totally disabled by accident or chronic sickness, or the dependent parent or sister of any soldier or seaman deceased from wounds or other injury sustained in the service while in line of duty, does not provide that the sum of eight dollars a month shall be paid to such as may be found entitled to a pension, but only *so much*, not exceeding that sum, as will, with their own resources, including the United States pension and their own labor, be necessary for their support.

All applications made under this law must come through the municipal officers of cities, towns and plantations, who are required, each year, to make careful investigation into the circumstances of each applicant, and no pension has been allowed where it did not appear from their statement, under oath, that the applicant would be compelled to resort to public or private charity if the State pension was not granted. In fact, I have felt it my duty to reject many claims for pensions forwarded here by the municipal officers, not coming within the theory or spirit of the law; some of them *poorly* and *briefly* made up, others for want of sufficient evidence.

While it may be true that some persons whose claims are just, fail to receive this pension, by reason of not properly presenting their cases, it is also probably true that some

succeed in obtaining it by reason of false or fraudulent representation who are not entitled to it. It is quite impossible to determine with entire certainty in all cases, the justice of those presented. Municipal officers of cities and towns cannot be too careful in examining and recommending cases where the aid of the State is asked.

It is quite difficult to determine, in many cases, whether a pension should be granted or not, or, if granted, what sum should be allowed, in consequence of the want of care in making a clear, full and plain statement of the pecuniary condition of the persons applying.

The fact that a large number of the applications are so poorly and briefly made up, requires a vast amount of labor in writing for additional facts and evidence to enable the person examining the claim to understand the true condition or circumstances of the applicant, before passing upon the same; the examining and re-examining; the answering of communications from municipal officers and others; the personal appearance, in many cases, of the applicant, or some one in his behalf, urging his claim; the adjudicating upon each claim and the subsequent preparing of certificates necessary to paying by local treasurers such cases as are allowed by this office; and finally, on receipt, the examining of each voucher (some twenty-four hundred in number,) upon which payments are made in quarterly installments, and the issuing of certificates for reimbursement of towns from the State Treasurer, devolve no small amount of *work* and *care* upon the Agent.

The number of applications received at this office during the year 1881, is 87 less than in 1880. This decrease is due, undoubtedly, to the large number of United States pension claims allowed, with arrearages, under act of Congress of 1879, and the increase of pension to the soldier himself, together with the improvement in the times and the demand for all classes of labor.

Quite a number of claims for State pension were allowed and afterwards discontinued, during the year, on account of increase and receipt of United States pension, with arrears, varying in amount from *four hundred* to *four thousand* dollars, (and some cases more.)

Feeling that the business had been somewhat overdone, by reason of so many applications from some of the towns, I requested Mr. Campbell, of the Council, and chairman of the Committee on Pensions, to visit, with myself, several towns for the purpose of seeing the applicants in person, and ascertaining more fully the circumstances of each, in order that justice might be done both the applicant and the State. The result of our labors confirmed my suspicion. With but few exceptions, the cases allowed were continued at the same rate as heretofore, and where increases were asked and appeared necessary, they have been granted.

While the municipal officers are required to make, in each case, a personal investigation, and ascertain for themselves the true condition and circumstances of the applicant and his family, I find many of them are too apt to take the statement of the person applying, without a personal knowledge of the case, and recommend the applicant for a pension. It is also a fact that others make or prepare these applications for the purpose of getting a fee, and they are signed by the Selectmen without thought or consideration of the merits of the case and all the circumstances connected therewith. It also appears that many of these applications are made up at the solicitation and urgent request of the applicant, who thinks he should be pensioned by the State because some one else gets it; and other cases where the selectmen make out and forward the claim in order to please or get rid of the applicant; and still other reasons, which I might set forth, have come to my knowledge.

In conclusion, I am of the opinion that these cases should decrease instead of increase, and that there ought to be a still further decrease of applications, without injustice or

hardships to this class of our people. No doubt but what there are a great many poor people in our State and in all States, and many who get along without a pension and do not become subjects of charity. In some cases it would seem that "the more they get, the more they want;" and I am satisfied that there are those among our pensioners who will not work if they can be supported by the generosity of the State and the United States. These pensions, I am sorry to say, are inclined to make some of this class indolent. There are also a great many deserving and *needy* applicants, that a small allowance from the State, in addition to their own labor and resources, together with the United States pension, keeps comfortable and off the town. I have, during the past year, endeavored to discharge the duties of so trying and difficult a position with consistency, and do justice to both the State and that class which the law was intended to reach.
