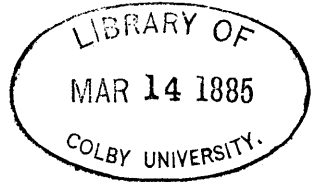

As directed by a resolve of the Legislature, approved February 14, 1883, the Treasurer of State has given School District No. 2 in the town of Madison, credit on the books in this office, for the sum of one thousand dollars, it being the proceeds of a bond for one thousand dollars (due March 1, 1883), given for the benefit of said District by Mahlan D. Spaulding, and accepted by a resolve of the Legislature, approved March 25, 1863.

The Treasurer has complied with the resolve of March 10, 1883, which authorized and directed the Treasurer of State to issue a new registered bond for the sum of two thousand dollars in favor of the State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts, payable in six years with semi-annual interest, the same to be in lieu of a bond for a like sum due March 1, 1883.

## STATE OF MAINE.

TREASURER'S OFFICE, }

*To the Honorable Governor and Council :*

The committee appointed by the Governor and Council, under authority of chapter 127, Laws of 1883, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer, as embodied in his annual report for the year ending December 31, 1883, have carefully examined the books in the office of the State Treasurer and found them correctly cast and properly vouched. His statement and account of receipts and expenditures of the public money for said year, as stated in his report, were found to be correct.

The amount of cash on hand at the close of the year was eighty-seven thousand six hundred four and nineteen one hundredths dollars (\$87,604.19), of this sum seventy-eight thousand and twenty-three and forty-five one hundredths dollars (\$78,023.45), was on deposit in sound and reliable banks, within the State, and in the Suffolk National Bank, Boston. The State receives interest on its deposits in banks out of the State; the revenue from that source last year amounted to four thousand nine hundred forty-four and ninety-four one hundredths dollars (\$4,944.94).

The committee, in compliance with law, destroyed, by burning, all coupons paid by the State Treasurer, on account of the public debt, during the year 1883, amounting to the sum of two hundred twenty-four thousand, three hundred and twenty-one dollars, (\$224,321.00), as charged on his books, exclusive of one hundred thirty-nine thousand and twenty dollars, (\$139,020.00), interest paid on registered bonds, vouchers for which were on file in his office.

The committee also destroyed, by burning, in the presence of the treasurer, the bonds of the State paid during the year, amounting to the sum of four hundred thirty-four thousand dollars (\$434,000). Of that amount, three hundred eighty-five thousand dollars (\$385,000) was the War loan, issued January 31, 1863, and due March 1, 1883; a certificate of their destruction and the number of each bond destroyed was filed with the State Treasurer in compliance with law. The committee also destroyed in a like manner all bonds and coupons thereto attached that were converted into registered bonds by the State Treasurer during the year, amounting to the sum of thirty-nine thousand dollars (\$39,000), together with registered bonds received by the State Treasurer for re-issue, amounting to the sum of one hundred three thousand dollars (\$103,000).

The sinking fund account, which is represented on the books of the office as amounting to one million seven hundred nine thousand three hundred ninety two and twenty-three one hundredths dollars (\$1,709,392.23) was found correct, the securities in which the sinking fund is invested were examined and found to agree with the treasurer's statement of that fund.

The committee find trust funds in the hands of the State Treasurer, deposited by the "Union Mutual Life Insurance Company" as required by chapter 49, section 57 of the Revised Statutes, for the benefit of all policy holders in said company, amounting to the sum of \$100,000.00, and the same is invested in U. S. registered bonds. They also find in charge of the State Treasurer trust funds held for the benefit of the Agricultural College, amounting to the sum of \$118,300.00 invested in State of Maine bonds.

The books of the treasury department are properly kept, and all papers and vouchers pertaining to the business of the office were properly filed and numbered.

The committee acknowledge, with pleasure, their indebtedness to the efficient State Treasurer and his assistants for the



aid rendered them in the discharge of their official duties, and regret that at the close of Treasurer Holbrook's official term, December 31, 1884, he will not be eligible under the Constitution of the State to a re-election.
