## Resolve in Relation to Industrial Statistics.

---

### CHAPTER 169.

RESOLVED, That under the direction of the secretary of state, there be annually collected, arranged and printed, in condensed form, statistical details, relating to all departments of labor in the state, especially in its relation to manufacturing, mining, commercial and industrial interests, together with the valuation and appropriations for various purposes, of the several towns and cities of the state. It shall be the duty of the person employed in the compilation of said statistics, to secure, by circulars to, and correspondence with assessors and other persons, as complete a compilation as practicable, of the industrial progress of the state; it shall be the duty of assessors of the several towns, to furnish the statistics called for, as completely and promptly as practicable. To meet the expenses of said compilation, the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant upon the treasury for an amount not exceeding one thousand dollars, from any moneys not otherwise appropriated.

Approved February 24, 1873.

## INTRODUCTION.

---

The plan proposed for the publication of this volume of Statistics of Maine, is to present the data collected in such order as to show, as far as practicable, the situation this year compared with that of last year, in order to ascertain and show wherein progress has been made and wherein there has been retrogression.

The results of the labors of the compiler will be found in the compilations and tables following, covering the financial standing of the State, and the several counties of the State, for the year ending December 31, 1883; the financial standing of cities, towns and plantations for the year ending March, 1884, with the number of taxable polls, valuation of estates, rates of taxation, and appropriations made by towns for various purposes, for the current year. The comparisons instituted in these matters show the reduction in State, county and municipal indebtedness, the increase of taxable polls, and the increase of taxable valuation of estates.

Tables giving information in regard to certain agricultural matters are used, also compilations indicating the condition of business in the State, as compared with that of last year, particularly manufacturing. In these the element of estimate and speculation enters somewhat, so that the information is not so nearly accurate as in the exhibit made in the tables relating to polls, valuation, taxation, finances and appropriations, and consequently are not so valuable.

The compiler takes pleasure in acknowledging the obligation he is under to the assessors of cities, towns and plantations, most of whom responded to his calls upon them with a promptness which was a great improvement upon the previous year. He also takes this opportunity to thank collectors of customs,

agents and proprietors of mills and factories, and other gentlemen, for responding to his calls upon them.

#### THE FINANCIAL EXHIBIT, ETC.

The compilations and tables showing the financial standing of the State, the counties and the towns are, so far as the State and counties go, believed to be entirely accurate, those of the towns are believed to be very nearly so, and a great improvement upon those of last year in this respect. The showing of increase of taxable polls and taxable valuation of estates, as well as the reduction of public indebtedness, is highly gratifying, and gives evidence of substantial prosperity.

#### MANUFACTURING.

Blanks were forwarded to 2000 corporations, companies or persons engaged in manufacturing in the State, calling for facts and figures to show the condition of business in 1884 as compared with 1883, covering the following items: capital, employes, wages, value of products, improvements, and losses by fire, flood, etc. Had these blanks been generally filled with reasonable accuracy, definite information could have been compiled, that would have shown the relative condition of different lines of manufacture, but returns were received from only about one-fourth of the number that blanks were forwarded to, and much the larger part of these were meagre and defective, so that they could not be used in tabulation or reliable compilation. The compiler has made a careful examination of these returns and arrives at the following conclusions:

The capital employed in the State in manufacturing has been considerably increased over that of last year. This proposition is sustained by returns received from assessors of nine-tenths of the cities and towns of the State, which gives an increase of \$158,327 in the taxable valuation of manufacturing property over that of 1883. Taking into account the towns that made no return and the low valuation placed upon this class of property, the increase of capital invested in man-



ufactures for the year, must be fully \$250,000. There has been a decrease in the items, hands employed and wages paid, but in the latter, prior to October 1st, the returns indicate the percentage to be small, not above 2 per cent on an average for the whole State.

Owing to the extensive depreciation of values of nearly all staple commodities, the decrease of value of products has been large. The quantity has held up close to that of former years in most leading lines. There have been few large buildings for manufacturing purposes erected during the year, but there have been several of respectable size, and a large number of additions have been made to buildings, and improvements in machinery, which are noted hereafter. Losses to manufacturing property by fire, have aggregated quite a large sum, but the plucky owners have generally commenced immediately to rebuild, consequently in the State, as a whole, the industries are not much the worse for fires.

The industries that show most unfavorable comparison with last year are ship building, iron manufacture, cotton manufacture, lumber manufacture, cooperage, ice cutting, corn canning, lumber cutting and the fisheries.

The industries that have held their own well are woolen manufacture, boot and shoe manufacture, lime manufacture, granite cutting, and many of the numerous minor industries of the State.

Those that have improved upon last year are pulp and paper manufacture, slate quarrying, starch manufacture and some of the minor industries.

It is believed that, as a whole, the industries have felt the business depression less oppressively in Maine than in most other States. The great variety of our industries and resources has the tendency to mitigate the evil effect of unfavorable disturbance in any one or more of them. Labor has been reasonably well employed at fairly remunerative wages. Employes who have left factories, where curtailment was necessary, have generally found other employment. In agri-

cultural districts there has at times been a scarcity of help, and in no place has labor been a drug until the present month. There have been no serious disagreements between employer and employe; they realize the situation and are disposed to make mutual concessions.

Lists of business corporations, showing the dates of incorporation by special acts of the Legislature and amendments thereto, and of corporations organized under the general law, with changes made subsequent to organization, are given in an appendix, which will be found to be convenient for reference. A fraction only of the many corporations enumerated have in reality any monetary existence, but there is no way to determine, by record or printed document, just how large or small this fraction is.
