After deducting resources, the total net indebtedness of the State January 1, 1886, amounts to \$3,458,616.65.

The total bonded debt of the State after deducting the sinking fund at par value, is \$3,255,721.59.

The public debt of the State has been decreased during the year as follows :

By resolve approved February 27, 1885 (chapter 188), the Treasurer was authorized to procure on the faith of the State, if he should deem it necessary, at any time during the year, a temporary loan of three hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as might be needed. I have found it unnecessary, however, to avail myself of the authority granted by this resolve and all demands upon the

treasury have been promptly met from the current receipts of the office.

The rate of taxation for 1883-4 was four mills, and for 1885-6 three and three-quarters mills, on the dollar of the State valuation.

**Suits at Law.**

The suit brought by the State in 1882 against the Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada, to recover the amount of taxes then due from that corporation is still pending in the United States Circuit Court at Portland. The case has been argued but not decided.

The suit against the Knox and Lincoln Railroad Company commenced in 1884 to recover a tax levied by the Governor and Council against that corporation, under the statute of 1881, is pending in the Supreme Judicial Court. The case was argued for the State before the Law Court by Attorney General Baker in July last. No decision has as yet been announced.

**State Taxes Against Gorham and Gray.**

On the eighteenth day of February last, the House of Representatives passed an order authorizing the Committee on Ways and Means "to assess the State tax on the State valuation as established by the Legislature of 1881, for the years 1885 and 1886 at "three and three-quarters mills on a dollar of said valuation " Acting under this authority, two bills of assessment, one for 1885 and the other for 1886, were reported to and passed by the Legislature and approved on the fifth day of March following.

So far as these Acts of assessment relate to taxes against the towns of Gorham and Gray, they are erroneous. The polls and estates in these towns were fixed by chapter 27 of the Resolves of 1881, as follows :

The matter was submitted by me to the Attorney General, who recommended that the town of Gray assess the sum which would equitably be due the State for 1885, to wit, \$2,149.64, and that the town of Gorham assess \$2,153.02, the amount specified in the Act of the Legislature, and that a special town meeting be called under a proper warrant for that purpose, and a vote passed to raise the balance due the State, viz., \$3,099.01.

The town of Gray has complied with this recommendation.

By a letter received from Lewis McLellan, Esq., Chairman of the Selectmen of Gorham, I was informed that a special town meeting was called as proposed by the Attorney General, at which only eleven persons were present, nine of whom were town officers, and that after the matter had been discussed, it was "voted to refer it to the town at the next annual March meeting."

The assessment by that town as returned to this office was for the sum of \$2,153.02, leaving a balance of \$3,099.01 due the State for 1885 and a like sum for 1886 in addition to the sums erroneously assessed by the Legislature.

Under chapter 231 of the Special Laws of 1883, entitled "An Act to amend chapter one hundred and fifty-two of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-one, entitled 'An Act to provide schools for the training of teachers in Madawaska Territory,'" the sum of seven hundred dollars was deducted from the gross amount of the State school funds apportioned to the towns of Grand Isle, Frenchville, Madawaska, Fort Kent and Van Buren, and the plantations of Hamlin, Connor, Cyr, Saint Francis, Saint John, Wallagrass and Eagle Lake.

It seems eminently fitting that in the pages of this report some tribute should be paid to the memory of one who, for nearly half a century, was closely connected with this office; whose face had grown familiar to thousands of people in Maine, and whose death is sincerely mourned by a large circle of friends.

On Saturday evening, February twenty-eighth, at the close of the week's work, Hon. William Caldwell, who had been connected with the Treasury Department for forty-two years, left the office never to return. He was troubled at the time with a slight cold, which rapidly assumed the form of pneumonia, and on Sunday, March eighth, one week later, he passed peacefully away.

Mr. Caldwell was born in Ipswich, Massachusetts, January 17, 1811, of sturdy old Puritan stock. He came to Augusta June 20, 1825, and entered the store of Benjamin Davis as a clerk, and subsequently became his partner in mercantile business. In December, 1841, he entered the State Treasury Department as a clerk under Treasurer Sanford Kingsbery, and his service in the office was continuous from that time up to February 28, 1885, with the exception of a portion of the year 1856. He was Treasurer of State from 1869 to 1873, inclusive, and Deputy Commissioner of the Sinking Fund in 1874. From the founding of the Granite National Bank he was one of its directors.

Mr. Caldwell was a man of rugged integrity of character and scrupulous fidelity to any trust, however small, imposed upon him. His manners were simple and kindly, and he possessed a keen sense of humor. With a heart that never felt the touch of age, he went in and out among us in his quiet unostentatious way, extending his friendships on every hand and making his name a veritable synonym for honesty. His habits were frugal. He was, indeed, a true type of the ideal economic man, for although possessed of a liberal income, yet for every cent of it he had given the world an equivalent

value in his own industry. He was a devoted husband and father, a good neighbor, and took a keen interest in the affairs of the community about him.

His records in the Treasury Office are models of accuracy and neatness, and will ever remain as a monument to his industry and faithfulness.

For more than forty years he was a member of the South Parish Congregational Church, and a regular attendant upon its services. At the close of a long and busy life, with years crowned with peace and plenty, in the midst of family and friends, he passed quietly away

# STATE OF MAINE.

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TREASURER'S OFFICE, }  
AUGUSTA, January 25th, 1886. }

*To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council:*

The Committee appointed by the Governor and Council, under authority of section 71, chapter 2, Revised Statutes, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer, as embodied in his annual report for the year ending December 31st, 1885, have carefully examined the books in the office of the State Treasurer and found them correctly cast and properly vouched.

His statement and account of receipts and expenditures of the public money for said year, as stated in his report, were found to be correct.

The amount of cash on hand at the close of the year was three hundred eighteen thousand five hundred sixteen and fifty-two hundredths dollars (\$318,516.52); of this sum, three hundred twelve thousand five hundred ninety-six and sixteen hundredths dollars (\$312,596.16) was on deposit in sound and reliable banks, within the State, and in the Suffolk National Bank, Boston, and five thousand nine hundred twenty and thirty-six hundredths dollars (\$5,920.36) in the safe in the office of the Treasurer. The State receives interest on its deposits in banks out of the State; the revenue from that source last year amounted to eighteen hundred forty-six and ninety-seven hundredths dollars (\$1,846.97).

The Committee, in compliance with law, destroyed by burning, in the presence of the Treasurer, all coupons paid

by the State Treasurer, on account of the public debt, during the year 1885, amounting to the sum of one hundred sixty thousand eight hundred and ten dollars (\$160,810) as charged on his books, exclusive of one hundred fifty-six thousand two hundred and fifty dollars (\$156,250) interest paid on registered bonds, vouchers for which were on file in his office.

The Committee also destroyed, by burning in the presence of the State Treasurer, the bonds of the State paid during the year, amounting to the sum of forty-eight thousand dollars (\$48,000); a certificate of their destruction and the number of each bond destroyed was filed with the State Treasurer in compliance with law.

The Committee also destroyed in a like manner all bonds and coupons thereto attached that were converted into registered bonds by the State Treasurer during the year, amounting to the sum of forty-eight thousand dollars (\$48,000), together with registered bonds received by the State Treasurer for re-issue, amounting to the sum of sixty-two thousand dollars. Registered and coupon bonds amounting to eighteen thousand dollars received and cancelled by the Treasurer of State in November and December, 1884, and new registered bonds issued therefor, were also destroyed by burning, in the presence of the Treasurer for 1885, and a record made in the Treasurer's office of their destruction.

The sinking fund account, which is represented on the books of the office as amounting to one million nine hundred sixty thousand two hundred seventy-eight and forty-one hundredths dollars (\$1,960,278.41), was found correct. The securities in which the sinking fund is invested, were examined and found to agree with the Treasurer's statement of that fund.

The Committee find trust funds in the hands of the State Treasurer, deposited by the "Union Mutual Life Insurance Company," as required by chapter 49, section 57, Revised Statutes, for the benefit of all policy holders in said company, amounting to the sum of one hundred thousand dollars

(\$100,000.00), and the same is invested in United States registered bonds.

They also find in charge of the State Treasurer trust funds held for the benefit of the "Agricultural College," amounting to the sum of one hundred eighteen thousand three hundred dollars (\$118,300.00), invested in State of Maine bonds.

There is also on deposit with the State Treasurer five thousand seven hundred dollars (\$5,700.00) cash, placed there during the year by the "Maine Benefit Association" for the protection of its certificate holders, as provided in section 6, chapter 504, laws of 1885.

The books in the Treasury Department are properly kept, and all papers and vouchers pertaining to the business of the office were properly filed and numbered. The Treasurer has been, the past year, very successful in his efforts in the collection and settlement of taxes assessed by the State upon corporations which have, for several years, neglected or refused to pay the tax assessed against them by the Governor and Council.

In the discharge of their official duties the Committee received valuable aid from the State Treasurer and his assistants.
