To the Governor and Council, State of Maine :

I have the honor to submit my report of the business of this office for the preceding year.

CAPITAL CASES.

On assuming the duties of the office on January 8th, 1885, the case of State vs. J. Frank Walker was pending in the Supreme Court for the County of Somerset and came on for trial on January 12th, 1885. This was an indictment for murder found during the official term of my predecessor and had its first trial at the September term, 1884. The circumstances of the killing were peculiar. The respondent, Walker, had just become married, and a party of so-called serenaders, in accordance with a custom somewhat prevalent, had assembled in front of his house in the dusk of evening, announcing their presence with the noise of bells, horns and guns. One of the party was finally shot by Walker, through the sidelight of the door, and died very shortly after. At the previous trial the jury had disagreed, having stood eleven for conviction of manslaughter and one for conviction of murder in the second degree, which was all that the government claimed. The second trial occupied about one week, and as a result the jury found the respondent guilty of murder in the second degree. The defence was, first: that the shot was not fired by Walker, but by some one of the serenaders; and second: that if he did the killing it was under circumstances of such great excitement and provocation as to justify. Exceptions were filed by the respondent's counsel, which were argued at the May Term of the Law Court at Augusta. The exceptions alleged an erroneous exclusion of a piece of testimony offered by the de-

defendant. Upon this technical point a new trial was granted, and at the September Term, 1885, at the informal suggestion of the full court, a *nolle prosequi* was entered as to the charge of murder, and the defendant pleaded guilty of manslaughter and was sentenced by Judge Foster to five years in the State Prison. Walker is now serving out his term. In this case the County Attorney, Mr. J. O. Bradbury, gave most faithful and effective help, and ably co-operated in the trial. The defence was strongly presented by Hon. S. J. Walton and J. J. Parlin, Esq.

Immediately after the conclusion of this trial the case of State vs. Libby came on for trial in the Superior Court at Portland. The defendant was a man of good birth. His family was an old family in Cumberland County. The crime charged was an atrocious one and much sympathy was felt for the murderer, especially on account of an excellent and suffering wife and children. Libby was charged with the shooting of his paramour in a room in the City Hotel in Portland. The commission of the act was proved beyond question. The defence was that Libby was in a state of either alcoholic or epileptic insanity, and the respondent himself denied all knowledge of his act, and claimed to have been in a state of unconsciousness from sometime in the morning preceding the murder until sometime after its commission. The defendant urged an acquittal on the grounds stated. The trial began on the 27th of January and lasted nine days, and resulted in a verdict of murder in the second degree. Exceptions were filed by the prisoner, but they were overruled by the court and judgment rendered for the State. At the September term, 1885, Libby was sentenced to imprisonment and labor for his natural life, and is now serving his sentence. I was assisted in this trial by the County Attorney, Mr. Geo. M. Seiders, who had spent much time and labor in preparing the case of the Government. Hon. S. C. Andrews and A. F. Moulton, Esq., defended the prisoner.

The case of the State vs. Robert Grindle was pending in the Supreme Court for the county of Hancock at the beginning of the year, indictment having been found at the October Term, 1884. The murder charged was committed under circumstances of great atrocity. The respondent was an old man, and during the term of my predecessor in office, as the defence set up was insanity, the prisoner had been committed to the Insane Hospital at Augusta, under the provisions of the statute, for examination. The report of the officers of that Institution made to me from time to time in response to my

inquiries, have satisfied me that the respondent has not been sane since he was committed, and has not been in fit condition to be tried. The case, therefore, necessarily, stands upon the docket waiting trial, if the prisoner's mental condition should ever warrant it, of which the physicians in charge give little hope.

The case of *State vs. Wilbert S. Wood* arose in Kennebec County, and indictment was found at the September Term of the Superior Court, 1885. The killing was done in a brawl, and with a common pocket knife. It was claimed to have been done in self-defence; but the prisoner finally pleaded guilty of manslaughter, and under the advice of the court the Government accepted the plea, and on the 18th of September the prisoner was sentenced by Judge Whitehouse to eight years at hard labor in the State Prison. He is now serving his sentence.

The case *State vs. Hodgdon* involved a most cruel and unnatural murder, that of a mother by her son. The indictment was found in the Supreme Court for Sagadahoc County at the August Term, 1885. The crime was committed undoubtedly under the influence of drink, and the defence claimed that the circumstances under which it was done, the utter want of provocation and the abhorrent nature of the crime, entitled the prisoner to an acquittal on the ground of insanity. The Government claimed, on the other hand, that the prisoner's act and conduct were fully accounted for by his drunken condition, and that drunkenness was no defence. After a prolonged trial the jury found the prisoner guilty of murder in the second degree, which was the offence claimed by the Government. The facts clearly would not have supported any higher verdict. Previous to the trial the prisoner had been sent to the Insane Asylum, for observation. No exceptions were taken by the prisoner's counsel, and at the same December Term he was sentenced to the State Prison for life, where he now is. The County Attorney, Mr. F. J. Buker, gave active and valuable assistance throughout this trial. Wm. E. Hogan, Esq., and Geo. E. Hughes, Esq., conducted the defence.

OTHER CRIMINAL CASES.

Samuel Rounds, who had been convicted of forgery in the courts of Cumberland County, applied for a writ of error to reverse the judgment of the court, and on this full argument was had before the Law Court at the July term, 1885, at Portland. Various legal points were urged by the prisoner's counsel as the

grounds of error; but after advisement the court rendered their decision for the State, affirming the former judgment and remanding the prisoner to the State Prison to complete his sentence.

The extent and result of the other criminal business of the State will be found stated at length in tables of criminal statistics appended to this report.

TAX CASES.

The litigation of the State in the upholding of the several tax laws against railroad and other corporations has been largely settled by previous decisions of the court. Two unsettled tax cases were yet found upon the dockets of the courts at the outset of the present term of office. The first one was the State vs. The Grand Trunk Railroad, pending in the United States Circuit Court for the District of Maine, at Portland. This case was argued before Judge Webb by my predecessor in 1884, and still remains undecided. In response to a letter of inquiry sent by me a short time since, I learn that a decision will probably be shortly given. The other case referred to is that of the State vs. The Knox & Lincoln Railroad, which was pending in the Supreme Court of the State. In reply to a request from the Governor and Council I had the honor to advise them that, in my opinion, this action could not be supported, as the charter under which the Knox & Lincoln Railroad was operated expressly exempted them from State taxation, and earlier decisions in this State were, in my judgment, practically decisive of this case. But as there were several other charters similar to this of the Knox & Lincoln Railroad, and this was therefore a test case to some extent, it was thought best that the argument for the State should be presented to the Law Court, which was done at the Portland Law Term, 1885. The decision was given some time after, and was for the defendant, not unexpectedly.

Five suits during the year have been commenced against corporations located beyond the State, but organized under the laws of the State, for not making the returns required under the Revised Statutes, Chap. 46, Sec. 31 and sequel. These suits were each of them begun on complaint of the clerk himself of the corporation, who informed the Attorney General that he could not obtain from the companies the facts necessary for the proper returns, and requested that suits should be brought as directed by the statute. One of these cases was settled by the corporation making its return

under the provisions of the Revised Statutes, Chap. 46, Sec. 34. In the other four suits the State obtained judgment and execution for both the penalty and the costs.

INFORMATIONS.

By order of the Governor and Council of date October 15th, 1885, an information was drawn by the Attorney General and filed in the Supreme Court for Aroostook County, with the view to revest in the State the title to Lot No. 90, in Township 14, in the 4th Range west from the east line of the State, said lot having been conveyed to Phineas Bates September 4th, 1862, by conditional deed, the conditions of which had not been complied with. The information, when drawn, passed into the hands of the County Attorney for Aroostook County and is being prosecuted by him.
