To the Governor and Council, State of Maine:

I have the honor to submit my report of the business of this office for the preceding year.

CAPITAL CASES.

The case *State vs. Mrs. Lydia Larrabee* arose in Waldo County, and an indictment was found at the January Term, 1886. The prisoner was accused of having negligently permitted the death of a mother in childbirth, whom she had undertaken to attend as midwife. The Government claimed that she either wrongfully assumed to act in this capacity lacking the proper knowledge and skill, or that, having requisite skill and knowledge, she wrongfully neglected to use them to save the life of her patient. The indictment as found by the Grand Jury was for murder, but the circumstances of the case clearly warranted nothing more than manslaughter, and the defence strenuously insisted that the accused must be acquitted. After nearly a week's trial the jury found the respondent guilty of manslaughter. Exceptions were filed and allowed, but at the April Term, 1886, the exceptions were withdrawn and the prisoner was sentenced by Chief Justice Peters to six months' imprisonment in the county jail. The County Attorney, Mr. R. W. Rogers, labored zealously in the preparation of this case. The defence was conducted by W. H. Fogler, Esq., and W. P. Thompson, Esq.

The case of the State vs. — Foss cross in Oxford County, and the indictment was found at the February Term of the Supreme Judicial Court, 1886. The respondent was an old man and had gone to the house of one Wentworth, the deceased, to get his wife who was the deceased's cousin. An altercation ensued the result of which was that the respondent was dragged out of the dooryard by the deceased, and at once turned and stabbed him with a knife, causing speedy death. The deceased was a man much respected in the community, but there had been for some time ill-feeling between the two men, growing out of Foss' ill-treatment of his wife. The prisoner was ably defended by Hon. D. K. Hastings and Hon. J. P. Swasey, and the trial lasted nearly a week. The respondent pleaded self-defence, and pressed his case with much persistence. The Government claimed that the prisoner should be convicted of manslaughter, and the jury so found. Exceptions were taken by the prisoner's counsel and argued at the July Term of the Law Court in Portland, where they wait decision of the court. I was efficiently assisted in the conduct of this trial by Mr. James S. Wright, the County Attorney.

I am glad to be able to report that, so far as I am aware, there is now no capital case pending and untried, in any court in this State. Verdicts have been rendered by juries promptly, and in favor of the State, in every capital case where an indictment has been found by the Grand Jury, during the two years of my administration.

I am not aware of any case of murder where an indictment is now likely to be found, save that of McFarland, in Washington County. McFarland is expected to be presented to the Grand Jury at their next session in that county in January.

The extent and result of the other criminal business of the State will be found stated at length in tables of criminal statistics appended to this report.

TAX CASES.

In addition to the suits above mentioned, there have been recently put into my hands by the State Treasurer, a number of delinquent taxes, chiefly against railroad and express companies. Upon this my opinion was requested, and has been rendered to the Governor and Council, and I now await their direction, and that of the State Treasurer, as to the action to be taken.

I am informed by the Hon. Mr. Burleigh, the State Treasurer, who has been diligently endeavoring to obtain payment of these taxes, in behalf of the State, that such action is likely to be taken at the beginning of the coming year.

In reference to the taxes against the American Bell Telephone Company, which is trifling in amount and was assessed for a single year only, 1883, I have been compelled to advise the Governor and Council that in my opinion the tax could not legally be collected.

In all the other tax cases referred to, aggregating \$12,217-.64, I have advised the Governor and Council that, in my opinion, it was the duty of the State to press the collection of the taxes, and, if not paid, to submit the matter to the court.

In the suit for taxes pending at the date of my last report vs. the Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada, the decision of the court has not yet been announced.
