REPORT.

LAND OFFICE, December 1, 1885.

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

The undersigned, Land Agent, has the honor to make the annual report of the operations of the Land Department for the year ending November 30, 1885.

Schedule A exhibits the conveyances made to actual settlers under the act regulating the sale of lands for settlement. It also includes conveyances to the Sweedish settlers.

Schedule B shows the conveyances of land for cash under direction of the Governor and Council.

Schedule C exhibits the conveyances made in accordance with resolves of the last Legislature.

Schedule D exhibits the sales of islands for cash by order of the Governor and Council.

Schedule E contains the names of "Revolutionary Soldiers" and "Widows of deceased Revolutionary Soldiers" who are entitled to deeds of 200 acres of land under Resolve of March 17, 1835. Four hundred and eighty-one certificates were issued and all but eighteen have been returned and deeds issued.

Schedule F contains the number of lot under contract to settlers and also the township, and date of the certificate issued under the act regulating the sale of lands for settlement.

LAND AGENT'S REPORT.

TREATY LOTS.

Maine and Massachusetts, in 1844, appointed a joint commission of three from each State "to locate grants, and determine the extent of possessory claims under the late treaty with Great Britain." The treaty referred to was the treaty of 1842, called the "Treaty of Washington" or "Webster Ashburton Treaty." This commission made an examination, heard the statements and proof, and made a survey of the lots they awarded to the claimants under that treaty. In 1854, after Maine had bought all the Massachusetts lands, another commission was appointed "to examine all claims under the treaty of Washington, to lands lying in this State which were not finally examined and adjudicated upon" by the prior commission. This commission also made quite an elaborate report.

These reports have been published recently and are important documents.

The Hon. Noah Barker was appointed, under Resolve of February 27, 1873, Commissioner, among other things to "inquire what settlers upon treaty lots have not been quieted in their possessions." His report which was very full and clear is printed with this report. In the controversies that arise in relation to the treaty lots these reports are very valuable.

REPORT.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, A. D. 1874.

The undersigned, Commissioner appointed pursuant to the Resolve approved February 27, 1873, entitled "Resolve relative to the claims of settlers upon proprietors' lands in the county of Aroostook," in compliance with the requirements of said resolve, asks leave to submit the following

REPORT:

On the 12th day of May, 1873, the undersigned commenced his labors under this commission at Fort Kent, in said county, at which place he had been otherwise employed, and thence proceeded to the town of Madawaska, formerly known as township No. 18, R. 4, where, in accordance with a previous arrangement, he was met by P. C. Keegan, Esq., who had been engaged as an assistant; and having given due notice to all concerned to meet at convenient places in the vicinity of the claimants, as designated and set forth in said notice, where their several statements and proofs in regard to their said claims would be heard and investigated, immediately entered upon the examination of said claims of settlers in the several townships named in the Resolve.

It was found, however, upon examination of the premises, that "in township number seventeen, range six," being one of the townships named in said Resolve, no lands "claimed by or belonging to proprietors," had ever been "in the possession or occupation of settlers;" and on consultation with Mr. Keegan, by whose efforts, as a member of the last Legislature, the initiatory steps of legislation had been taken on the subject, it was found that an error had somehow occurred, either in the drafting or engrossing of the Resolve; and that, instead of township number "seventeen, range six," township number eighteen in the same range was undoubtedly intended, the lastnamed township being one of those set forth in the settlers' petition to the Legislature. And although fully aware that the Resolve, aforesaid, had conferred no power upon the Commissioner to investigate the claims of settlers in townships not distinctly specified therein, yet, at the urgent request of the settlers, and believing it would be a saving of expense to the State to comply with their request, and thereby avoid a similar appeal to the Legislature for additional legislation on the subject, he has taken their statements and the proofs of their several claims, and respectfully submits, whether the same provision should not be made for them by the State as if they had come strictly within the provisions of the Resolve, inasmuch as they all stand in the same category with those already And while this extra service may be considered provided for. a work of supererogation, still, it is believed that the additional information thus obtained will be regarded as a valuable acquisition to the report, and that the primary intentions and objects of the Resolve could not have been attained without it.

Having been faithfully assisted about three weeks during the time by Mr. Keegan, who is familiarly acquainted with the larger portion of these French claimants, and understands their language, situation and wants better, perhaps, than any other man in the State, your Commissioner was enabled to complete his preliminary investigations on the premises, and the collection of such data as were needed for the schedules of this report, ending that part of the service on township Letter K, range two, in said county, on the 27th day of June last, and thence proceeded on his way to Bangor, where he obtained at the Land Office such additional information relative to the title, situation, &c., of certain lots known as "Treaty Lots," as was necessary for the completion of his report. In several of the townships, coming within the scope of this report, no allotments had been made of the lands claimed by the settlers, excepting in some instances a measurement on the front of the tracts, or parcels of land claimed, in order to make the partition fences between their adjacent possessions; hence it was impracticable to report the exact quantity of land claimed by these settlers. But in most cases the extent of the *improvements*, and the width of each of the lots, or parcels of land claimed, have been given, with such a description thereof as would lead to their rightful location.

And while no exact computation of the quantity of land claimed, either separately or in the aggregate, can be made without a previous survey, still it may be safe to say that the average quantity cannot exceed one hundred acres to each of the claimants named in the accompanying schedules, to be hereafter laid out and described so as best to include the improvements made upon each of the lots, provided the settlers are to be quieted in their possessions.

Among these claimants are to be found, in many instances, different persons whose names are *identical*, and in order to prevent any confusion, or future misunderstanding as to the particular person meant, it was thought best to add to the name of each claimant having a family the name of his wife, as well as the number of persons comprising each family. In this way we are enabled to ascertain the present number of inhabitants resident upon lands the fee in which has passed from the State, or from Maine and Massachusetts, to land proprietors.

By the schedules hereunto annexed it will be seen that upon lands of this description in the county of Aroostook, there are located about four hundred and fifty families, averaging nearly seven persons in each family, being a population of nearly three thousand in all.

With the French people residing in what was formerly known as the "disputed territory" (or Madawaska territory), your Commissioner has had an acquaintance extending back to the time of their coming under the jurisdiction of the United States, by the Treaty of Washington, in 1842; and although perhaps not coming strictly within the scope of his official duty, yet he feels impelled to bear testimony, from personal knowledge, to the general good character of that community.

They are peaceable, industrious, benevolent, and intelligent in proportion to their advantages of education. It must be remembered that the settlement of this territory commenced about the time of the American Revolution: that this people was a remnant of that once happy community which had been driven from their beautiful homes, and their diked farms, extending along the sea-board in Acadia, to prepare for themselves new homes in this isolated territory, then an unbroken wilderness, to which, as a place of refuge, they were obliged to flee from British oppression; and that no public schools had ever been established among them up to the time of the establishment of the North-eastern Boundary under the Treaty of Washington, being a period of more than sixty years from the date of their settlement here. Since the pen of the historian has already portrayed the oppressions, persecutions, privations and hardships of these people, it is unnecessary here to repeat the story of their wrongs.

It has, however, been a source of gratification to mark the steady advancement and progress of these Madawaskans, although under adverse circumstances, during the past thirty years. In 1843, your Commissioner had occasion to spend some four months in their midst, while engaged in the survey of the townships on which their lots were laid out and assigned them under the provisions of the fourth article of the Treaty.

At that time there were no turnpiked roads nor bridges in that part of the country, from the East line of the State westerly to the mouth of the Little Black River, at which point was then the uppermost settlement on the river St. John, a distance of nearly a hundred miles from the eastern boundary. As a means of communication with the "outside world," the people at that time had recourse to the river St. John, as a highway, making use of the "*pirogue*" in summer, and the "*traineau*," or sledge, on the ice in winter. In 1843, there were no public schools within the entire Madawaska region.

Now, their roads and bridges, from the eastern boundary of the State to the mouth of the St. Francis River (some twenty miles above Fort Kent), compare favorably with those of the earliest settled portions of the State; and the people have become so thoroughly Americanized, that they are substituting "Yankee carriages" for their old fashioned, stubborn, two-wheeled vehicles, in which (as a quaint writer has observed of the Canadians) they formerly had "the whole farm loaded into the body, and the whole family on the seat." And a similar advancement is observable in regard to the interest manifested in the education of their children. The younger portion of this community are becoming thorough scholars, and well versed in English grammar, and other branches pertaining to an English education.

Still, the traveler, on visiting this region for the first time, will undoubtedly observe many things to excite his curiosity. Some few of the old thatched-roofed buildings, so plentiful there thirty years ago, yet remain, as relics of the olden time; and there are many other things among them which are altogether different from what we are accustomed to see in "Yankeedom."

For instance, they have queer looking cottages with windows that open and shut like doors, their roofs and piazzas being broken, projected, picturesque, and often ornamented with trellises, cornices, and fanciful adornments, so that their solid homeliness is often fringed with elegance. Inside their houses will be seen the inevitable big black stove ("*Cuisinier Canadien*"), and the women buisily at work at the foot-wheel and hand-loom, engaged in the manufacture of cloth from the wool and flax which they grow in abundance upon their farms, while others assist in the performance of out-door labor. Nor are the men less busy in their several avocations. On the whole, we find in Madawaska, the home of a real peasantry, a contented class, comfortable, and in many cases looking for no higher lot. Of their morals, a whole volume may be compressed into a single sentence, to wit:

"A case of divorce, or illegitimacy, has very rarely, if ever occurred among these people." What a comment! One great reason of this probably is, that their young people are encouraged to marry early. In conclusion, we would say for the people of Madawaska, that, with their primitive style of living, they enjoy the priceless blessing of health, which more than compensates for the absence of modern luxuries, and are doubtless much happier than millions who live in rich mansions and roll in luxury. But these remarks apply more particularly to the settlers who have been quieted in their possessions under the provisions of said Treaty, and have "none to molest," or make them "afraid."

We find, however, that, in addition to the lots and parcels of land described in the schedules hereunto annexed, there are still other lots known as "Treaty Lots," which were taken up and improved by settlers prior to the date of the Treaty, in regard to which, doubts are entertained as to whether the settlers upon said lots have been guieted in their possessions in accordance with the fourth article of said Treaty, inasmuch as the townships, in which said lots are situated, have been conveyed by the States of Maine and Massachusetts, either by joint or separate deeds of conveyance, to the purchasers, without making any reservations therein of these Treaty lots ; notwithstanding, Commissioners acting under authority of the State, had reported that the settlers upon these lots were entitled to deeds thereof under the provisions of said Treaty. and before these lands were conveyed by the State to the proprietors.

This may have been, and probably was, an oversight of the Land Agents in making out said deeds of conveyance to the proprietors.

A list of the Treaty lots above alluded to, may be seen by reference to pages 22, 23, 24 and 25 of the "Report of the Commissioners, appointed under Resolve of April 12, 1854, to locate grants, and determine the extent of possessory claims, under the late Treaty with Great Britain."

By that report we find that in Township No. 9, Range 5, there were reported by said Commissioners four lots, containing in all, five hundred and sixty (560) acres; in Township No. 12, Range 6, four lots containing four hundred and twenty-eight, and ninety-five hundredths (428.95) acres; and West of the 7th Range of Townships, eight "River lots North of the St. John," containing nine hundred and sixty-five, and seventy-eight hundredths (965.78) acres; twenty "River lots South of the St. John," containing two thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, and fifty hundredths (2,859.50) acres; and six lots on islands of said river, containing one hundred and twenty-six and thirty hundredths (126.30) acres; making, in the aggregate, four thousand nine hundred and forty, and fifty-three hundredths (4,940.53) acres. For these lands the United States Government has paid over to the European and North American Railway Company the sum of six thousand one hundred and seventy-five dollars and sixty-six cents (\$6,175.66), on the Land Agent's certificate to the effect that the settlers upon these lots had been quieted in their possessions.

But after having executed deeds of these lots to the settlers, and reported the same in his annual Reports for the years 1870 and 1871, as appears in "Schedule C," and under the head of "Lands conveyed under the Treaty of Washington, * * *" the Land Agent discovered, from the Records in his office, that prior deeds had been given of the townships, as before stated, without making reservations of said lots. It follows, therefore, that if the fee of these lands vested in the prior grantees, then the above sum of \$6,175.66 should have been paid to them, instead of being paid to the Railway Company.

This mistake having been ascertained by the Land Agent before the delivery of the settlers' deeds, he has very prudently withheld them, or a part of them at least, awaiting legislation on the subject. In accordance with the Resolve, your Commissioner has endeavored "to ascertain upon what terms such of the lands referred to belonging to proprietors may be purchased," but, with one exception, he has been unable to obtain definite proposals, although these proprietors appear to be willing to sell such lands as may be needed by the State to quiet the settlers thereon, at fair prices, and in no case to exceed the price paid by Government for similar lands.

George Seely, Esq., of Fort Kent, who claims to be the owner of Township No. 18, Range 6—excepting the Treaty lots therein—proposes to sell to the State all such lands in said township as may be wanted for settlement, at the rate of fifty cents per acre, or to sell *the whole* of said township, excepting the Treaty lots, for the sum of eight thousand dollars.

The proprietors of the other townships named in the accompanying schedules, were not inclined to name the terms upon which they would part with their lands, until an agent is duly authorized by the State to negotiate with them for the purchase, inasmuch as a public declaration of their prices for the *settling lands* wanted for these settlers might prove prejudicial to the sale of their *timber lands*, which may hereafter be put into the market.

There is no doubt, however, that in case the Legislature should authorize the purchase of these lands, and fix upon a *maximum* price to be offered for them, a purchase might be made which would be entirely satisfactory to the State, and all concerned.

All that is demanded, or expected on the part of these settlers, who find themselves thus unfortunately situated upon lands which the State once owned, but perhaps through *unwise legislation* in the past may have parted with its title, is, that they shall be dealt with fairly and impartially, and be treated in all respects as other settlers upon the State domain have been treated.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

APPENDIX TO THE REPORT OF COMMISSIONER

While the foregoing Report embraces a list of the claims of settlers on lands, the fee in which is supposed to be in the proprietors of the several townships set forth in the Resolve under which this Commission was instituted, yet, inasmuch as the settlers upon lands in a few other townships-such as No. 18, R. 3; 17, R. 4; and 17 and 18, R. 7, neither of which was specified in said Resolve-find themselves laboring under similar difficulties in regard to acquiring titles to their lands, as those already named, the Commissioner has, at the earnest solicitation of the settlers themselves, as well as of P. C. Keegan, Esq., their Representative, (who had already, in some instances, taken down their statements,) concluded to extend this report by way of an appendix, so far, at least, as to allude to some of the cases which have come under his observation; and to make a tabular statement thereof.

The first township claiming attention under this head, is No. 18. Range 3, now the town of Grand Isle. The following extract from the annual report of the Land Agent, for the year ending November 30, 1869, may serve to throw some little light as to the ownership of said township; or, at least, to show that the Land Agent apprehended a difficulty in the way of making legal conveyances, in behalf of the State, of lands to the settlers on said township. For, after alluding in his report to the subject of making partition of "Settling lands owned in common with Proprietors and Corporations," the Land Agent adds, as follows:

"It is found, however, that an exchange of other State lands was made by the Land Agent for the proprietors' interest in 18, R. 3, now Grant Isle, which interest was conveyed to the State by deed, dated December 18, 1865. This township has been lotted for settlement, at the expense of the State, in 1864-5, and was thereafter regarded in the land office as a 'settling township.' But as the *interest* in the land, *thus acquired of the proprietors*, seems not to have been *formally* designated and set apart for settlement, the question arises whether this interest in the land may not have been conveyed to the 'European and North American Railway Company' in the deed of lands made to that company by the State in the year 1868. If so, the State again becomes a joint owner in these lands with said railway company. This is a subject that may require legal investigation."

Now, it will be found by reference to the annual reports of the Land Agent, (during the past six years, at least,) that no conveyances of lands in said township have, during that time, been made to the settlers; and no wonder, therefore, that these settlers, who entered in good faith upon their lands, which were at that time owned by the State, and lotted and offered for settlement, should begin to feel alarmed in regard to acquiring a title to their lands. In justice to these settlers, and for the honor of the State, it is to be hoped that the Legislature will take the matter under serious consideration, and take such action thereon, as in its wisdom shall be deemed proper.

During the past season, on petition of the Land Agent, in accordance with the provisions of a legislative resolve, a Commission was appointed by order of the Supreme Judicial Court, holden at Houlton, in and for the county of Aroostook, to make partition of lands owned in common and undivided between the State and Proprietors in townships Nos. 17 and 18, Range 7, known as Wallagrass Plantation, and Fort Kent, and in making said partition, it was found that on nearly every lot in the list to be divided, or partitioned, there were from one to three, or four families, residing upon Hence the Commissioners had no alternative in making it. said partition, but to turn many of the settlers over to the tender mercies of the proprietors, notwithstanding these settlers had in many instances paid the State, in road labor, for their land !
