To the Governor and Council of the State of Maine :

I have the honor to submit herewith my report of the business of this office for the preceding year.

Whenever called upon I have advised the Governor and Council and the officials of the various State departments, with reference to routine matters.

CASES FORMERLY CAPITAL.

In the cases of State vs. David L. Stain and Oliver Cromwell and State vs. Charles L. Beal, in which appeals were pending, from decisions overruling motions for new trials, at the date of my last report, the appeals have been dismissed and the respondents in each case have been sentenced to State Prison for life and are now serving their sentences.

In State vs. Rice K. Smith, exceptions were argued in July last, and still remain in the law court undetermined. Two indictments for murder have been found and tried during the year. The case of State vs. John McWilliams, was an indictment for murder found at the January term, 1890, of the Supreme Judicial Court for Androscoggin county. The defense was insanity, and the case occupied nearly a week with trial. The respondent was ably defended by Hon. D. J. McGillicuddy and Wallace H. White, Esq. of Lewiston, county attorney, Hon. J. M. Libby, prepared the case with great thoroughness and assisted very efficiently in the trial.

The verdict was murder in the first degree, and the respondent was sentenced to State Prison for life and is now in prison in execution of the sentence.

The case of State vs. Micah Norton was an indictment for murder found at the September term of the Supreme Judicial Court for Somerset county. The defense relied mainly upon the proposition that the person alleged to have been murdered committed suicide. The trial occupied eight days. The defense was ably conducted by Hon. S. J. Walton of Skowhegan and S. S. Parlin, Esq. of North Anson. E. F. Danforth, the county attorney, discharged his duties in the preparation and trial in a most conscientious, diligent and capable manner. The verdict was murder in the first degree. Norton was sentenced to State Prison for life and committed in execution of the sentence.

I have been advised by the clerk of the United States Supreme Court that the case against the Grand Trunk Railway Company will not be in order for a hearing until October next.

A statement of the criminal business is herewith submitted.
