I would state that during the year 1890, a temporary loan of \$300,000 was negotiated, as authorized by chapter 246 of the Resolves of 1889, it being found that the receipts would not meet the expenditures, owing to the extraordinary appropriations which were necessary to be made by the last legislature. Of the above loan, \$250,000 was negotiated with the German Savings Bank in the city of New York and \$50,000 with the German Savings Bank of Brooklyn, both loans bearing interest at the rate of four per cent per annum, payable semi-annually.

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

The Committee appointed by the Governor and Council, according to chapter 2, section 71 of the Revised Statutes, "to carefully examine the accounts of the State Treasurer as embodied in his annual report" have attended to their duties and submit the following as their report for the year ending December 31, 1890:

The Treasurer's account of what he has received and expended for the year 1890, we find to be correct, vouchers being produced for every item expended and proper books of account for all moneys. We find all the books and accounts kept in a very orderly and systematic manner, so much so that the humblest citizen of the State can easily ascertain the true status of its financial condition, and we congratulate the State upon the efficient management of this department and feel that the Treasurer and his efficient clerks are worthy of highest praise.

The amount of cash on hand December 31, 1890 was \$175,-466.17; of this sum \$10,580.79 was in currency and \$164,-880.38 was on deposit in this State and in the Suffolk National Bank of Boston, proper certificates of which deposits were examined by your committee.

The bonded indebtedness of the State January 1, 1891, as appears by the Treasurer's report, was \$2,619,300, and of

this there were \$17,000 in bonds due but not presented for payment. In addition to the above, to meet the demands upon the treasury, a temporary loan of \$300,000 was negotiated by the Treasurer in accordance with a resolve approved March 13, 1889.

In accordance with the statute, your committee destroyed by burning, in the presence of the State Treasurer, all State of Maine bonds redeemed during 1890, amounting to the sum of \$129,500 to wit :

Public debt, loan of June 1, 1864	\$12,000 00
“ “ October 1, 1869.....	67,500 00
“ re-issue of loan June 1, 1864	33,000 00
“ “ “ October 1, 1869..	17,000 00

Your committee also destroyed by burning in presence of the State Treasurer, \$190,000 in registered bonds for which new registered bonds had been exchanged and are now outstanding, and in like manner destroyed coupons paid during the year 1890 to the amount of \$2,601.

Your committee found in the hands of the State Treasurer trust funds, amounting in all to the sum of \$194,097.30 deposited with him by the following named associations, in accordance with law, for the benefit of certificate holders, and the kind, character and amount of the securities so deposited, we found to agree with the Treasurer's report of the same, to wit :
