To the Governor and Council of the State of Maine:

I have the honor to submit herewith my report of the business of this office for the year ending on this date.

I have had occasion during the year to submit to the various departments quite a number of written opinions which are not of enough general interest to require detailed notice in this report.

In the case of State vs. Rice K. Smith, convicted of murder in the second degree, in which exceptions were pending, undetermined, at the date of my last report, upon a careful examination of the case, with all of the circumstances connected with the commission of the offense and the trial, and after a full conference with the court, it was considered proper and expedient to *nol pros* the charge murder in the indictment and accept a plea of guilty of manslaughter, which was done by the County Attorney of York county with my consent. Smith was then sentenced to a term of five years and six months imprisonment in the State Prison.

The case of State vs. Lewis Brewster was an indictment for murder in Waldo county, and was tried at the October term of the Supreme Judicial Court for that county. He was skillfully and ingeniously defended by Hon. Wm. P. Thompson and R. F. Dunton, Esq. The circumstances attending the homicide tended somewhat to palliate the offense. The verdict was manslaughter. Exceptions were filed by the defense, which are still pending.

The case against the Grand Trunk Railway was argued by me in the United States Supreme Court when it was reached in its order. A result favorable to the State is hoped for.

A statement of the criminal business is herewith submitted.
