REPORT.

LAND OFFICE, December 1, 1890.

To the Honorable Governor and Council:

In compliance with the provisions of law the land agent herewith submits his annual report of the operations of the land department during the past year.

Schedule A exhibits the sales of land by order of the Governor and Council. Four of these lots were located in Indian township, Washington county. The lots sold S. L. Peabody, W. R. Dresser and Nathaniel Phelps had been previously paid for, but no conveyances made, and the land agent was directed by the Governor and Council to convey to them without consideration.

Schedule B contains the sales of islands made by direction of the Governor and Council. The conveyance to the United States was made without consideration as it was to be used for a light-house.

Schedule C exhibits the conveyances to assignees of soldiers of the Revolutionary War or their heirs or widows.

Schedule D contains the names of Revolutionary soldiers or their widows who were entitled to two hundred acres of land under resolves of March 15, 1835 and March 26, 1836. Certificates have been issued to these parties, who are now deceased probably, but have never been returned to this office for deeds. Some of these lots are held by heirs of the original owners that are scattered all over the country and it is almost impossible to get a title if you wish to do so. In all probability these certificates, after a lapse of more than half a century, will never be seen at this office.

Schedule E exhibits the land now under contract to settlers who are entitled to deeds when they comply with the conditions of the act regulating the sales of land for settlement.

The surveys of the Madawaska lands that were purchased under a resolve approved March 8, 1889, have been completed, and the

commissioners have directed the land agent to make conveyances upon the terms and conditions named in their instructions to me under date of December 27, 1889. In accordance with their advice I have made deeds of all the lots named in those instructions, and have delivered them to such as have complied with the terms named. The terms named were a small sum to be paid in cash upon delivery and was barely enough in most cases to pay for surveying and making deeds. At the time the commissioners visited the premises and fixed upon the prices of the land nearly all the settlers were pleased with the terms and said they would pay for their land, but when they were visited with the deeds a change had come over them, either from bad advice or some other reason they did not appear satisfied and acted as though they expected the land to be given them and surveyed and deeds made free of expense to them.

Schedule F shows the deeds that have been delivered and paid for and the date of delivery. It is to be desired that this matter should be closed up as soon as may be, and to the satisfaction of all the parties interested.

The work of copying plans is being prosecuted as fast as it can be done in the thorough manner Maj. J. H. Cochrane is doing it. It will be found when completed to be a very excellent work and very useful in deciding the titles to land wherever the question of boundaries is in dispute.
