To the Honorable Governor and Council:

As required by section seventy of chapter two of the Revised Statutes of 1863, I submit herewith my annual report of the condition of the State treasury for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1891, which for convenience and ready reference, I have tabulated as follows:

VALUATION AND TAXATION.

The new valuation of the State, as taken by the Valuation Commission in 1890, amounts to \$309,096,041.00, making an increase of \$73,117,325.00 over the valuation of 1880. The Legislature of 1891 made the rate of taxation two and three-fourths mills, which restores it to where it was previous to 1890, it being found that the rate of two and one quarter mills which prevailed during that year, was insufficient to meet the ordinary expenses. The increase in valuation and rate, caused an advance in the State Tax of \$320,044.73, of which amount \$73,117.32 is returned direct to the various towns for the benefit of the common schools, as the amount of mill tax to be apportioned, is figured at one mill on each dollar of valuation.

DIRECT TAX.

By an act of Congress approved August 5, 1861, a direct tax of \$20,000,000 was levied against the several states, payable June 30, 1862, the proportion due from the State of Maine being \$420,826. The Act provided that any state might assume its portion of the tax, and assess, collect and pay into the treasury of the United

States, its quota of the direct tax, in its own way and manner, by and through its own officers, with a deduction of fifteen per cent if assumed and paid on or before the last day of June, 1862; it further provided that any state might be allowed the amount of any liquidated and determined claims against the United States, in payment of the direct tax, and be allowed the same deduction as if paid in money.

This tax was settled by the State of Maine on or before June 30, 1862, by crediting \$357,702.10 on claims against the United States government for uniforming, arming and equipping troops sent to the field, such arms and equipments having been purchased and paid for with monies out of the treasury of the State.

Congress passed an act approved March 2, 1891, to credit and pay to the several states and territories, all monies collected under the direct tax levied by the act of Congress, approved August 5, 1861. In compliance with the above act, the assistant treasurer of the United States paid to the Governor of this State, the sum of \$357,702.10, he being authorized to receive the same by a resolve passed by the last legislature, approved March 27, 1891. The amount was placed in the State treasury April 6, 1891, and accounted for in the receipts of the year, and applied to the general expenses of the government.

TEMPORARY LOAN.

A temporary loan of \$300,000 was negotiated during the year 1890, as provided for by chapter two hundred and forty-six of the Resolves of 1889, and of this amount, \$200,000 became due October 1, 1891, which was paid at maturity, but as the State Tax receipts during the year 1891, were in payment of the tax of 1890, (which was assessed on a basis of two and one quarter mills) the amount received, together with the "Direct Tax" paid by the United States, was only sufficient to meet the ordinary expenditures, and consequently a new loan of \$200,000, as authorized by chapter one hundred and sixteen of the Resolves of 1891 was found to be necessary.

Of this new loan, \$150,000 was placed with the German Savings Bank in the city of New York, and \$50,000 with the German Savings Bank of Brooklyn, both being on eighteen months time and bearing interest at the rate of four per cent per annum.

RAILROAD TAXES.

The suit brought by the State of Maine against the Grand Trunk Railway of Canada in 1882, to recover taxes claimed to be due, has recently been decided by the United States Supreme Court, in favor of the State, the total amount assessed against this company to date, being \$122,792.44.

For a detailed statement of all taxes assessed against railroads and remaining unpaid, I would refer you to Table No. 16 of this report.

To the Honorable Governor and Executive Council:

The committee appointed by the Governor and Council, under authority of section 71, chapter 2, Revised Statutes, to examine the accounts of the State Treasurer as embodied in his annual report for the year ending December 31, 1891, have made a thorough examination in detail of the accounts in the office of the State Treasurer for the year aforesaid and find them correctly cast and accompanied by requisite vouchers for every item charged in the account.

The Treasurer's accounts of receipts and expenditures of the public money for said year as stated in his report, we find to be correct, and all papers and vouchers relating to the account examined by us, were properly filed and numbered and the books neatly and systematically kept.

The amount of cash on hand at the close of the year 1891 was \$199,603.60, of this sum \$31,061.83 was in cash in the hands of the State Treasurer and \$168,541.77 deposited in various banks in this State and the Suffolk National Bank of Boston. The amount received for interest on deposits in the banks for the year was \$2,577.86.

The bonded indebtedness of the State January 1, 1892, as appears by the Treasurer's report was \$2,558,500, and of this sum there were bonds due to the amount of \$6,200 which were not presented for payment. In addition to the above amount there is outstanding a temporary loan of \$300,000 of

which sum \$100,000 was negotiated in 1890 and the balance of \$200,000 in the year 1891.

The committee, in compliance with the requirements of the statutes, destroyed by burning in presence of the State Treasurer, the bonds and notes of the State paid during the year, amounting to \$260,800, and of that amount \$60,800 were in bonds and the balance of \$200,000 in notes of the temporary loan of 1890.

The committee in like manner destroyed registered bonds to the amount of \$200,000 for which new registered bonds had been exchanged in the year 1891 and are now outstanding, and have also in the same manner destroyed coupons paid by said Treasurer during the year, amounting to the sum of \$1,335, as charged by him on his books, exclusive of interest paid on registered bonds to the amount of \$100,623.44. A record of the foregoing bonds, coupons and notes destroyed as aforesaid, and the number and amount of each are on file in the Treasurer's office.

The committee examined carefully the trust funds in the hands of the State Treasurer, amounting to the sum of \$240,-602.96, deposited by various associations in accordance with the requirements of the statutes for the benefit of certificate holders, and found that they agreed in character and amount as shown by the Treasurer in his report.
