*To the Governor and Council of the State of Maine:*

I have the honor to submit herewith my report of the business of this office for the year ending on this date.

The usual inquiries incident to the operation of the various departments of State have been promptly answered.

In the case of State vs. Lewis Brewster, convicted of manslaughter, in which exceptions were pending undetermined at the date of my last report, at the term of court subsequent to the date of my report, exceptions were withdrawn by the defense and a moderate sentence imposed upon the respondent. He was committed in execution thereof, has served his term, and is now at large.

The case against the Grand Trunk Railway was determined in favor of the State of Maine by the United States Supreme Court which reversed the judgment of the court below and ordered judgment for the State for the amount of the taxes demanded.

This was an important decision to the State as it involved not only the taxes in suit but all of the taxes which had been assessed against the Grand Trunk Railroad since the beginning of the suit, and the legality of the assessment upon other roads.

A brief review of the case may be pertinent as explaining its present condition and its effect upon the interests of the State. Under the provisions of the statutes of Maine which are now found in the Revised Statutes, chapter 6, sections

41, 42, 43 and 44, imposing an annual excise tax upon railroad corporations owning and operating railroads within the State of Maine, taxes were duly assessed upon the Grand Trunk Railroad of Canada and all other railroad corporations owning or operating railroads in Maine. The amount of the annual excise tax was to be determined by the average gross receipts per mile based upon the number of miles operated within the State.

The first tax assessed under the provisions of this act was assessed in the year 1881, and a similar tax has been assessed upon the Grand Trunk Railroad of Canada and all other railroad companies owning or operating railroads in the State of Maine for each succeeding year since that time.

The statute provides that if the railroad fails to pay the State the treasurer of State may proceed to collect the same with interest at 10 per cent.

The total amount of taxes thus assessed against the Grand Trunk Railway from 1881 up to and inclusive of 1891, with interest thereon at ten per cent up to October 1, 1892, aggregates \$200,327.42. None of the taxes thus assessed have ever been paid by the Grand Trunk Railroad Company of Canada, but they have refused payment on the ground that the statute under which they were assessed was unconstitutional. Other railroads within the State, notably the Boston & Maine, upon which a larger sum than ever was assessed against the Grand Trunk Railroad Company of Canada was assessed, have paid the taxes assessed regularly without raising any question as to their legality. However, they were undoubtedly waiting the result of the litigation against the Grand Trunk Railroad Company. If the result in that case had been adverse to the State other railroads situated in like manner would undoubtedly have thereafter refused to pay the taxes thus assessed. It will, therefore, be perceived that the decision in this case involved not only the case against the Grand Trunk Railroad Company of Canada but an amount of taxes considerably more than those now in arrears against that company.

In 1882, Attorney General Cleaves brought an action in favor of the State of Maine against the Grand Trunk Railroad Company of Canada to recover the tax for the year of 1881 and one half of the tax of the year 1882, the other half not then being due. The suit was removed into the Circuit Court by the defendant, and was afterwards argued before Judge Webb by Attorney General Cleaves for the State and A. A. Strout, Esq., for the defendant. Judge Webb ruled that the imposition of the tax in question was a regulation of interstate and foreign commerce in conflict with the executive powers of Congress under the Constitution of the United States and was invalid.

Attorney General Cleaves' term expiring, Attorney General Baker succeeding him, filed exceptions to this ruling of Judge Webb and carried the case to the United States Supreme Court on a writ of error, where it was finally argued by myself for the State and A. A. Strout, Esq., for the defendant.

The defense relied upon the long line of authorities which were generally assumed by the profession to sustain the ruling of Judge Webb. On the part of the State it was first endeavored to distinguish the pending case from the line of authorities relied upon, and second, claimed that the tax should be sustained upon the ground that it was a tax upon the value of the franchise, and that the method provided in the statute basing it upon the average gross receipts per mile was a proper method of determining the value of the franchise upon which the tax should be assessed and one that was eminently fair and just to the corporation; that such a method of determining its value was the only method of accurately ascertaining its value from time to time as a basis of taxation. The Supreme Court by a majority of one overruled the decision of the district judge and sustained the validity of the tax, stating among other things that the ruling of the court below, "was founded upon the assumption that a reference by the statute to the transportation receipts and to a certain

percentage of the same in determining the amount of the excise tax was in effect the imposing of the tax upon such receipts, and, therefore, an interference with interstate and foreign commerce." But the Supreme Court held that "a resort to those receipts was simply to ascertain the value of the business" done by the corporation and thus obtain a guide to a reasonable conclusion as to the amount of the excise tax which should be levied, and that there was in the case at bar "no levy by the statute on the receipts themselves, either in form or fact," and that the gross receipts as defined by the statute of the State of Maine constituted "simply the means of ascertaining the value of the privilege conferred," thus sustaining the last proposition contended for by the State.

The proposition thus announced by the United States Supreme Court for the first time in this case in clear and distinct terms, is generally recognized by the profession as at least a new and very important distinction, distinguishing this case from a long line of decisions which have arisen under the commerce clause of the Constitution. Its importance to the financial interests of the State is obvious from the reference heretofore made to its effect.

After this decision was announced, Mr. Strout for the defendant filed a petition for a rehearing, which petition was denied by the court.

The mandate which was sent down by the Supreme Court to the Circuit Court in execution of this decision ordered the Circuit Court to enter judgment in favor of the State of Maine for the amount of the tax demanded. The question then arose before Judge Webb as to the proper construction of the mandate, the State claiming that interest at ten per cent followed and was in legal effect a part of the tax as it was expressly conferred by the statute providing for the assessment, and that it was the duty of the court to enter judgment for the amount of the taxes and interest; that when the United States Supreme Court ordered judgment for the taxes demanded, in legal effect it ordered judgment for every-



thing that was incident to the tax and that interest thereon was a proper part of the judgment.

Mr. Strout for the defendant contended that judgment should be entered for the principal sum of the taxes only *without* interest. The amount of the taxes then in suit without interest was \$15,617.44. The amount of interest upon the tax at the rate of ten per cent at the time of the entering of judgment in the Circuit Court in accordance with the mandate would have been the sum of \$16,571.55.

Judge Webb construed the mandate as excluding the interest in the amount for which judgment was to be rendered and ordered judgment to be entered up for the sum of \$15,617.44 only. To this ruling, on the part of the State, I excepted and the case has now gone forward to the United States Circuit Court of Appeals upon a writ of error for the purpose of testing the correctness of this ruling of Judge Webb.

It is believed, upon reason and authority, that in the end judgment will be entered for the State for the full amount of the taxes with interest at ten per cent.

These exceptions have not as yet been argued, as they have not been reached in their order in the United States Circuit Court of Appeals.

None of the taxes assessed after the bringing of this suit have been paid by the Grand Trunk Railroad Company of Canada, and for the purpose of bringing the whole matter to a final issue and compelling the payment of the whole amount of taxes in arrears, I began a suit in favor of the State for the purpose of recovering the last half of the tax assessed for the year 1882, with all taxes assessed since that time up to and inclusive of the year 1891, with interest thereon at ten per cent. This suit was made returnable in the county of Knox. At the return term the defendant appeared, filed the proper petition and bond and removed the case to the United States Circuit Court in Portland.

No reason is perceived why this last suit should not be speedily determined in favor of the State and the amount due recovered and paid into the State Treasury.

The writ of error pending in the United States Circuit Court of Appeals will be in order for argument early in the year 1893 and will without doubt be speedily disposed of.

The only capital case tried in the State since the date of my last report was that of State vs. Gabriele De Rosa. This was an indictment for murder committed by the defendant on Middle street in the city of Portland, wherein it was claimed by the State that the defendant committed a premeditated assault with a knife upon his brother Baptista De Rosa in the public street causing the death of his brother within a short time.

The case was prepared with great skill by the able county attorney, Frank W. Robinson, who rendered very valuable assistance at the trial.

The prisoner was ably defended by George Libby, Esq. The verdict was murder in the first degree.

After De Rosa's commitment to the State prison he manifested indications of considerable mental disturbance and has since been transferred to the insane asylum at Augusta, where he is now undergoing treatment for insanity.

A statement of the criminal business is herewith submitted.
