TEMPORARY LOAN.

On January 1, 1893, a temporary loan of \$300,000.00 was one of the liabilities of the State, of which amount \$200,000.00 became payable during the year. This amount has been paid in full and the remaining \$100,000.00, which falls due during 1894, will be met at maturity.

GRAND TRUNK RAILWAY COMPANY.

The suit against the Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada for the collection of back taxes and interest, to which I referred in my last report, has now been settled in full the sum of \$182,797.01 having been paid into the State Treasury May 1, 1893, the taxes amounting to \$134,238.66 and the interest to \$48,558.35.

MAINE AND NEW BRUNSWICK INSURANCE COMPANY.

On the 22d of July, 1893, the Maine and New Brunswick Insurance Company went into the hands of a receiver, and the reserve fund deposited in this office by said company under section 4, chapter 131 of the Private and Special Laws of Maine, 1887, was delivered to John L Crosby of Bangor, as receiver of said company, on the 28th of November, 1893, by order of the Supreme Judicial Court.

TAXATION.

The rate of taxation for 1893 was two and three quarters mills on the dollar, yielding a total revenue of \$865,803.29, and the rate for 1894 is two and one half mills, giving a tax of \$787,247.98.

The tax assessed for 1893 against cities, towns and organized plantations has been paid in full, with the exception of the following amounts:

*To His Excellency the Governor and Executive Council of
the State of Maine:*

The undersigned, your committee appointed to examine the accounts of the Treasurer of State for the year ending December 31, 1893, met at the Treasurer's office on the 16th inst., and have been in session every secular day, with one exception, until this date. We have much regretted the absence of Hon. Horace C. Little of Lewiston, a member of the committee, who was unable to attend on account of illness. His assistance would have been greatly appreciated.

The transactions of the Treasurer are multifarious, requiring a very large number of different accounts, all of which must necessarily be kept with method and exactness.

Gen. Beal has afforded us every facility for a proper discharge of our duty, and after a critical examination into the details of the several accounts, we would report that we are satisfied that the receipts and expenditures of the public money for the year 1893, as stated in his report, are correct.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the year was \$304,569.68. There has been received from various sources \$1,865,028.67, making a total of \$2,169,598.35. See Table No. 2. The expenditures for the year have been \$1,833,881.71, leaving cash on hand December 31, 1893, \$335,716.64. See Table No. 3. The last item is verified by

statements of the cashiers of the several banks in which money is deposited, and a certificate of the Secretary of State to the count of cash in the office.

This shows a reduction of the bonded debt of \$53,300, and of the temporary loan of \$200,000.

Other trust funds held by the State including deposits of insurance companies, as required by law, for the protection

of their policy holders, have been examined and found to agree with the Treasurer's statement of the same. See Table No. 9.

The committee have destroyed by burning, in the presence of the State Treasurer, notes and bonds of the State paid during the year amounting to \$377,100; also they have in like manner, destroyed coupons paid to the amount of \$915.

In accordance with Resolve approved March 29, 1893, we have in like manner destroyed State of Maine bonds to the amount of \$1,200, with coupons annexed to the amount of \$1,440 that were held in the State treasury as the proportion of said bonds belonging to towns which have forfeited their claim to the same.

They also destroyed at the same time, in the same manner, registered bonds to the amount of \$500,000 for which new bonds of similar character and denomination had been exchanged during the year.

A complete record showing the number and amount of each and every bond, coupon and note destroyed is on file in the office of the Treasurer.

The State is fortunate in having for so many years the invaluable services of chief clerk Charles B. Caldwell, and to him and clerks Lyman S. Fogler and Daniel W. Emery, the committee desire to make acknowledgment for many courtesies.
