To the Governor and Council of the State of Maine:

I have the honor to submit herewith my report of the business of this office for the two years ending on this date.

I have had frequent occasion to advise the various departments of State, but do not deem the opinions given of sufficient public importance to incorporate them in this report.

An idea seems to have been more or less prevalent that it is the duty of this office to give official opinions to any town officer of every town and plantation in the State as to any and all matters arising in the discharge of his official duties. During the past two years several hundred applications of this kind have been made to me. I have uniformly declined to give such opinions. To attempt to do otherwise would leave no time for the discharge of the more important duties of this office, and be of no practical public benefit, as the matters have been those with which the counsel of the several municipalities are entirely competent to deal.

CIVIL CASES.

State of Maine *vs.* Grand Trunk Railway Company of Canada. Writ of error. I attended the Circuit Court of Appeals for the First Circuit in April, 1893, for the purpose of arguing this case, but by agreement with defendant's counsel, Hon. A. A. Strout, it was continued to the October term upon his representation that the defendant intended to avail itself of

the provisions of Chapter 641 of the Private and Special Laws of 1893. On May 1, 1893, this suit, and the suit in the District Court, and all claims against said company for uncollected taxes, were settled by the payment into the State treasury of \$182,797.01, under the provisions of said act, thus ending eleven years of litigation most advantageously for the State.

CRIMINAL CASES.

Bela Noyes was tried at the October term in 1893 in Washington county for the murder of John Edgar, at Danforth, in July of that year. The evidence at the trial developed mitigating circumstances, and the jury found a verdict of manslaughter. The prisoner was sentenced by Judge Libby to two years in the State prison. Hon. George M. Hanson and Hon. A. McNichol, conducted the defense, and the county attorney, Fred I. Campbell, Esq., assisted in the prosecution.

August M. Prawda was tried at the January term 1894 of the Superior Court in Cumberland for the murder of his wife's mother, Waldberg Meyer, at Cumberland on December 10, 1893. The evidence, while purely circumstantial, was clear and convincing, and after a nine days' trial the jury found a verdict of murder in the first degree. The prisoner was sentenced by Judge Bonney to imprisonment at hard labor for life. Hon. George M. Seiders, Fred E. Chase, Esq., and George H. Allen, Esq., acted as counsel for the defense, and Charles A. True, the county attorney, carefully prepared the case and assisted me in its trial.

Abner Thorne was indicted for the murder of Harrison A. Whitman at Paris on November 17, 1893, and tried at the March term 1894, in Oxford. The State claimed that the crime was murder in the second degree, and the jury so found. The prisoner was sentenced by Judge Foster to imprisonment in the State Prison for life. Hon. James S. Wright and Hon. George D. Bisbee conducted the defense. The county attorney, Eugene F. Smith, assisted in the prosecution.

Clara E. Getchell was indicted for the murder of her husband on December 9, 1893, and tried at Augusta in May, 1894, before Judge Wiswell. On account of sickness I was unable to be present at the trial. The county attorney, Hon. L. T. Carleton, ably managed the case for the prosecution, and the prisoner was defended by Hon. Herbert M. Heath and Frank E. Southard, Esq. After a trial lasting eleven days the jury found a verdict of guilty of murder in the first degree. The prisoner's counsel moved for a new trial on the ground that the verdict was against evidence, and the case will be argued at the May term of the Law Court.

Melvin Bessey was tried at the August term, 1894, in Sagadahoc, for the murder of his wife at Bowdoinham in July of that year. The defense was insanity. Verdict, murder in the first degree. The prisoner was sentenced by Judge Walton to imprisonment at hard labor for life. Hon. Simon S. Brown was counsel for the defense. Charles D. Newell, Esq., the county attorney, assisted me in the prosecution.

Thomas Laskey was indicted at the October term, 1894, for the murder of Michael Hayden, at Eastport, on September 8th of that year. Before proceeding to the trial I entered a nol. pros. as to the allegation of malice, feeling convinced that the evidence would not warrant a verdict of murder. One witness of the Government testified to seeing the accused strike the fatal blow, but he had made previous contradictory statements. The jury did not believe him, and rendered a verdict of acquittal. This and the Prawda case show that direct testimony is not always as convincing as circumstantial evidence. Hon. A. McNichol defended the prisoner, and Fred I. Campbell, Esq., the county attorney, assisted in the prosecution.

John Baptiste Ouilette was tried at Farmington in November, 1894, for the murder of Damose Thibideau, at Jay, in September of that year. The prisoner was intoxicated at the time he committed the crime. The jury, after being out eight hours, brought in a verdict of manslaughter, and the

prisoner was sentenced by Judge Strout to three years in the State Prison. The county attorney, George L. Rogers, Esq., assisted me in the prosecution. Hon. Frank L. Noble and J. Chabot, Esq., were counsel for the respondent.

In the trial of these causes, feeling the responsibility which rests upon a prosecuting officer, I have endeavored to present the case of the prosecution fairly, seeking no conviction from motives of personal pride or professional triumph, and with a full sense of my duty to the prisoner as well as to the State.

It is made by statute the duty of the attorney general to make "any useful suggestions."

I would respectfully "suggest" the repeal of chapter 296 of the Public Laws of 1887, which requires that the evidence of all the witnesses taken at any inquest shall within ten days after the delivery of the verdict to the coroner be filed by the coroner with the clerk of courts for the county in which said inquest was held, and there remain open for public inspection. In my judgment it is a stumbling block in the administration of justice. It gives the accused notice of all the evidence against him, and affords him extraordinary and unnecessary facilities to get up a defence; to skillfully confess, evade, or deny the testimony of the different witnesses as the exigencies of his case may require. In practice it does not aid in establishing the truth.
