To the Honorable Governor and Council:

As required by section seventy of chapter two of the Revised Statutes of 1883, I have the honor to submit herewith my annual report of the condition of the State treasury for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1894, the different tabulations being arranged in the following order:

TAXATION.

The rate of taxation for the year 1894, was reduced from 2 3-4 mills on the dollar, to 2 1-2 mills, which makes a reduction of \$78,-471.51 in the amount of State tax assessed. The receipts during 1894 were sufficient to meet all obligations against the State, and in addition, pay the balance of the temporary loan, amounting to \$100,000.00, which matured on the first of October. This satisfactory showing was made possible by the wise recommendations of His Excellency, Governor Cleaves, and the careful and economical appropriations made by the Legislature of 1893. The tax rate of 2 1-2 mills will, I am sure, be amply sufficient for the year 1895, and if no unusual appropriations are made by this Legislature, the tax for 1896 can be assessed on a still lower basis.

The only towns delinquent on their 1893 tax are Dayton, \$428.04; West Bath, \$296.73.

TRUST DEPOSITS.

Since my last report, the securities then on deposit by the Maine Mutual Accident Association, amounting at par value to \$2,300.00, and the cash deposited by the Home Protective Legion, amounting to \$278.00, have been delivered, on order of the Court, to Receivers appointed for said companies.

The name of the Golden Rule Relief Association has been changed to "Peoples' Insurance Company," and that of the York Mutual Aid Association, to "Maine Mutual Life Insurance Company," and their deposits appear in this report under the new names.

CONCLUSION.

Being about to sever my connection with the State Treasury, having completed the constitutional limit of six years as treasurer of the State, I cannot refrain from calling attention to the volume of business done in this department during those six years, and contrasting the financial condition of the State on January 1, 1895 with its condition on January 1, 1889.

I find that during my administration, the financial transactions of this office have been larger than for any similar number of years, with the exception of the war period, since its existence, the receipts being \$13,474,630.88, while the sum of \$13,288,718.44 has been paid out.

The bonded indebtedness of the State on the first day of January 1889 was \$3,967,900.00 with an annual interest account of \$238,074.00. Towards the redemption of this debt, the treasury was in possession of a sinking fund, amounting at par value to \$965,296.33, which I sold during the year 1889 and applied the proceeds in partial payment of the debt, the remainder being paid by the issuance of new State bonds, bearing interest at the rate of three per cent per annum, which I sold to bankers in New York, a portion bringing three and one-half per cent, and others, three per cent premium, which, with the yearly payments since made on this new loan, has reduced the bonded debt to \$2,403,000.00, carrying with it an interest payment of only \$75,935.00.

In transmitting this, my last report, to your Honorable body, I take the opportunity to acknowledge my sincere thanks to your Excellency and the members of the Executive Council, the heads of the different departments and all others connected with the State Government, for the many acts of kindness and good feeling which have existed between us, during the years that we have been associated together.

In conclusion, I desire to especially acknowledge my appreciation of, and obligations to chief clerk, Charles B. Caldwell, clerks Lyman S. Fogler and Daniel W. Emery, for their faithful and diligent performance of all duties, during my term of office.

STATE OF MAINE.

STATE HOUSE,
Augusta, February 5, 1895. }

To His Excellency, the Governor, and the Executive Council of the State of Maine:

The undersigned, your committee appointed under authority of Section 71, Chapter 2 of the Revised Statutes, to examine the accounts of the Treasurer of State for the year ending December 31, 1894, would respectfully report that they have carefully examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in his report. A correct voucher was on file for each disbursement. All books, records and accounts of the department, have been neatly and systematically kept.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the fiscal year, January 1, 1894, was \$335,716.64.

The receipts from various sources for the year 1894, were \$1,650,972.37, making a total of \$1,986,689.01. The expenditures for the year have been \$1,528, 493.16 leaving a balance of cash on hand at the close of the fiscal year, December 31, 1894, of \$458,195.85.

The bonded indebtedness of the State, January 1, 1895, was \$2,403,000, all bearing three per cent interest, except \$50,000 of bonds issued to Maine Insane Hospital under the provisions of Chapter 70, Resolves of 1887, at four per cent, and \$100,000 of bonds issued to Agricultural College under

the provisions of Chapter 105, Resolves of 1887, at four per cent, and \$118,300 of bonds issued to Agricultural College under the provisions of Chapter 226, Resolves of 1889, at five per cent, and \$700 of bonds due since October 1, 1889 and not presented for payment, which bear no interest.

The aggregate of State bonds bearing three per cent interest is \$2,134,000.

No temporary loans exist.

During the past year, there has been paid by the State, \$50,000 on the bonded indebtedness, and \$100,000 balance in full of the temporary loan.

In the retirement of General Beal, by constitutional limitation, the State loses a most valuable officer and he may well be proud of his record during the six years of his official life as State Treasurer.

The Committee, January 30th, 1895, destroyed by burning in the presence of the then State Treasurer General Beal, all Registered Bonds received and cancelled by him during the year 1894, and for which new Registered Bonds were issued, amounting to the sum of \$124,000.

And in accordance with Section 10, Chapter 308 of the Public Laws of 1889, they have destroyed in like manner all State of Maine Bonds and Notes redeemed during the year 1894 by the State, amounting to the sum of \$150,000. They have also destroyed in like manner, one coupon redeemed by said State, amounting to \$15.

Our certificate, showing the number and amount of each and every bond, coupon and note destroyed, is on file in the office of the Treasurer.

We have verified all trust deposits, a list of which appears in the Treasurer's Report.

The Committee desire to express their thanks to General George L. Beal and the efficient clerks of the Treasurer's Office, Charles B. Caldwell, Lyman S. Fogler and Daniel W.

Emery, for affording us every facility necessary to the discharge of our duty.
