To His Excellency, Henry B. Cleaves, Governor, and the Honorable Executive Council:

In compliance with the Statutes of the State of Maine, I respectfully submit herewith a detailed account of the receipts and expenditures, and other matters of interest in this department of the State Government, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1895.

TAXATION.

The rate of taxation for the year 1895, was two and one-half mills, and for the year 1896, will be two and one-fourth mills on the dollar, yielding a total revenue of \$813,072.30 for the former, and the sum of \$731,941.70 for the latter year.

Owing to the reduction of one-fourth of a mill in the rate of taxation each year for the years 1895-6, compared with the years 1893-4, the revenue to the State, derived from this source, will be \$108,037.27 less for the past and present years, than the amounts realized for the years 1893-4.

The tax assessed against cities and towns for the year 1894, has been paid in full.

TRUST DEPOSITS.

During the past year, the consolidation of the York Mutual Aid Association, the Kennebec Mutual Life Insurance Company and the Orient Mutual Life Insurance Company, under the name of the Maine Mutual Life Insurance Company, was ratified and made valid by Act of the Legislature approved February 28, 1895, and the securities on deposit in the State Treasury for the benefit and protection of the certificate holders in said companies, were transferred to the credit of the Maine Mutual Life Insurance Company, as provided in the Act above referred to.

This Company is now in the hands of a Receiver, but the securities, amounting at par value to the sum of \$11,600.00, and as specifically described in Table No. 9 showing the liabilities of the State, are still on deposit in this office, subject to the order of the Court.

The Provident Aid Society went into the hands of a Receiver on October 24, 1895, and the securities then on deposit in this office for the benefit and protection of its certificate holders, were turned over on order of the Court, to said Receiver, on November 19, 1895. The securities so transferred, consisted of the following coupon bonds :

The Peoples Insurance Company of Lewiston went into the hands of a Receiver on December 6, 1895, and the securities then on deposit in this office for the benefit and protection of its certificate holders, consisting of Municipal Security Company coupon bonds of the par value of \$400.00, were turned over to said Receiver, by order of the Court, on December 18, 1895.

The Home Casualty Company, with a cash deposit of \$792.38, and the Sick, Accident and Mortuary Bureau, with a cash deposit of \$547.95, have also gone into the hands of Receivers the past year, and the deposits were turned over to said Receivers, on order of the Court.

To His Excellency, the Governor, and the Executive Council of the State of Maine:

The undersigned, your committee appointed under authority of Section 71, Chapter 2 of the Revised Statutes, to examine the accounts of the Treasurer of State for the year ending December 31, 1895, would respectfully report that they have carefully examined said accounts and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in his report. A correct voucher was found on file for each disbursement.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the fiscal year, January 1, 1895, was \$458,195.85.

The receipts from various sources for the year 1895, were \$1,533,700.15, making a total of \$1,991,896. The expenditures for the year have been \$1,701,655.30, leaving a balance in the treasury on December 31, 1895 of \$290,240.70.

The bonded indebtedness of the State, January 1, 1896, was \$2,353,000, as follows: \$2,084,000 bearing 3 per cent interest; \$150,000 bearing 4 per cent interest; \$118,300 bearing 5 per cent interest, \$700 due October 1, 1889, and not presented for payment. No temporary loan exists.

There has been paid during the past year \$50,000 on the bonded indebtedness, as follows: Registered bond numbered 210 for \$5,000, and registered bond numbered 414 for \$28,000 of the reissue loan of June 1864. and registered bond numbered 416 for \$17,000 of the reissue loan of October 1, 1869.

Your committee January 23, 1896, in the presence of the State Treasurer, F. M. Simpson, destroyed by burning \$50,000 of registered bonds. Also \$10,000 of registered bonds for which new registered bonds has been issued.

We have certified to the amount of each bond destroyed.

We have verified all trust deposits, a list of which appears in the treasurer's report.

We find the books and accounts neatly and systematically kept, which greatly facilitates the work of the committee. We feel that the citizens of the State of Maine may well be proud of their efficient treasurer, F. M. Simpson, and his competent corps of clerks. We take this opportunity to thank them for their courtesy and assistance.
