To the Governor and Council of the State of Maine:

I herewith submit my report of the business of this office for the two years ending November 31, 1898.

HOMICIDES.

State *vs.* James B. Holt. This was the only case formerly capital which was pending at the time I entered upon the duties of this office. The indictment was returned by the grand jury for Androscoggin county at the September term of the supreme judicial court, 1896. The defendant was indicted for the murder of his infant child, eight months old, on the 21st day of May, 1896. The court was notified that a plea of insanity would be made, and the defendant was ordered by the court into the care of the superintendent of the insane hospital for detention and observation, as provided by law. The report of the superintendent of the insane hospital was such as to satisfy me that the plea of insanity would not excuse the homicide. The trial was entered upon February 8, 1897, and closed February 12. The plea of insanity was urged as the only ground of defence and a large amount of expert testimony was offered by defendant's counsel; and the jury took the case and after deliberating on the same seventeen hours, were unable to agree, it being understood that eleven were for conviction of murder and one for acquittal. At the following term of court, the defendant withdrew his plea of not guilty and entered a plea of guilty of manslaughter. The crime seemed to have been committed without motive, and its unnaturalness, connected with the admitted weak mind of the defendant, seemed to justify the acceptance of this plea, which

was accepted on the part of the State, and the defendant was sentenced to ten years' imprisonment at hard labor in the State's Prison. Hon. Jesse M. Libby of Mechanic Falls, conducted the defense with great ability, and I was ably assisted in the prosecution by the county attorney, Hon. W. H. Judkins of Lewiston.

State vs. Daniel P. Murphy and Dennis Leo Murphy. On the night of June 6, 1898, Dennis Murphy was living with his family, consisting of wife and four sons at Mars Hill, Aroostook county, Maine. His residence consisted of a small house with two rooms on the ground floor. His two youngest children had gone to bed in the second story. His wife was in the kitchen, and Mr. Murphy had retired in the room adjoining, when his two oldest sons, Dennis Leo and Daniel Patrick, returned from a neighbor's house, and commenced to partake of an evening meal which the mother had prepared for them. During the meal, an altercation occurred in which the father in the adjoining room took part. After some talk, Daniel Patrick entered the room in which his father was, and met him near the door. Whereupon, a conflict ensued, and Dennis Leo soon followed into the room, and, as he claimed, tried to separate his father and brother, which afterward seemed to be probable. Whereupon his brother, Daniel P., retired to the adjoining room, seized an axe, and returning, struck his father a deadly blow in the back, plunging the axe nearly to the hilt, and nearly severing the backbone; and, not satisfied with this, after the father had fallen to the floor, cut off both feet near the ankle joint. Both of these sons were indicted for murder at the October term of the supreme judicial court held at Houlton, and the case came on for trial at the same term. Both defendants were tried together. Great doubt existed from the beginning in the mind of the county attorney, as it did in my own, as to any probable cause of holding Dennis Leo Murphy for trial; but as great excitement existed in Aroostook county, resulting from the brutality of the murder, and some uncertainty as to the character of certain evidence which it was expected might be produced at the trial, I thought it best not to discharge the defendant, Dennis Leo Murphy, until the evidence fully disclosed the facts in the case. But after a complete hearing, I became satisfied that there was no evidence that this defendant was in any way responsible for the homicide, and in my closing argument, asked the jury to return a verdict of

not guilty as to Dennis Leo Murphy. With equal certainty I became satisfied during the progress of the trial that the brother, Daniel Patrick Murphy, was guilty of one of the most brutal murders that had occurred in the history of the State, and I asked the jury to convict him accordingly, which they very promptly did, returning a verdict of guilty of murder in the second degree in less than a half hour, after the case was submitted to them. The counsel for defendant filed a motion for a new trial, which was heard before the presiding justice, and a new trial denied. Whereupon an appeal was taken, which is now pending before the law court. The defense was very ably conducted by the Hon. Don A. H. Powers of Houlton, who appeared as counsel for Daniel Patrick Murphy, and Eugene Holmes, Esq., of Caribou, who appeared as counsel for Dennis Leo Murphy. I was ably assisted in conducting the prosecution by the county attorney, Wallace R. Lumbert, Esq., of Caribou.

State vs. Paul Peters. The grand jury of Piscataquis county returned an indictment at the October term, 1898, against Paul Peters of Kineo for the murder of John Smart at Kineo, August 27, 1898. As I was engaged in the trial of the Murphy case at Houlton, in October, the trial of this case was postponed until November 17, to which time the October term of court was adjourned for the express purpose of the trial of this case. The evidence disclosed that there was bad blood existing between the defendant, Paul Peters, and John Smart prior to the homicide, and that on the day of the homicide both men had been drinking, and that on that day prior to the homicide, they had been engaged in scuffling and fighting at the guide house at Kineo. The plea of self-defense was set up by the defendant as an excuse for the homicide. The evidence was somewhat conflicting, although the burden of the State was clearly made out which showed that after the altercation between the defendant and Smart on the day of the homicide, the defendant had ample time for his anger to cool, and that instead of cooling he prepared himself with a revolver and made threats to different parties in substance that he should kill Peters if he gave him provocation. Some two hours later, the defendant Peters returned to the guide house for his supper, and

entering the office proceeded to the wash stand, and was engaged in preparation for supper. Whereupon Smart, who was sitting in the room, having heard of Peter's threats to kill him, and being in at least a semi-drunken condition, went up to Peters and asked him if this was a fact. As to just what occurred in the wash room, which was partially obscured by a partition from the sight of the witnesses, no one knows except Peters. But an altercation arose, and Peters was seen to jump back away from Smart and draw a revolver and shoot at him, which shooting resulted fatally. Both Peters and Smart bore rather a hard reputation as to their habits of drinking and fighting. The case excited a great deal of interest on account of the great desire of the law abiding citizens of Piscataquis to see the law enforced in such a manner, especially among the guiding fraternity and in the back woods, that the reckless use of firearms should not be regarded in any other than as a serious matter. At the close of a three days' trial the jury returned a verdict of manslaughter, which degree of crime at least was justified by the evidence in the case; and the verdict was followed by a sentence of five years' imprisonment at hard labor. The defense was most ingeniously and persistently and ably conducted by the Hon. J. B. Peaks of Dover and Henry Hudson, Esq., of Guilford; and I wish to compliment the County Attorney, C. W. Hayes, for the very thorough manner in which he had prepared the case for the State. No piece of evidence of importance had been overlooked, and no necessary witnesses had he failed to summon; and the very clear manner in which he opened the case and the ability with which he assisted in the examination of the witnesses, are also entitled to commendation.

State *vs.* Rose E. White. Kennebec county was shocked by the killing of Everett White by the discharge of a revolver on the 14th day of June, 1898. White and his wife, Rose E., were alone together in a room at their home at Togus at the time of the shooting, and the State claimed that it was intentionally done by the wife. The wife had just completed a sentence in Kennebec jail for other offences, and her husband had recently been confined there for drunkenness. At the time of the shooting, both White and his wife were supposed to be more or less under the influence of liquor. Some altercation had arisen during the

day on account of the arrest of the wife for alleged illegal selling of liquor, and they had come to blows in their quarrel, and the wife had made some threats that she proposed to get rid of her husband, which led to the belief that the killing was a willful murder. A defense was set up that White killed himself, but the circumstances surrounding the murder showed otherwise. Before being arrested the defendant undertook to manufacture a story, and to induce some witnesses who were in the adjoining room at the time of the shooting, to sustain her in it by their evidence, which led to stronger belief that the shooting was not accidental or suicide. An indictment for murder was returned at the September term of the superior court for Kennebec county, and by special provision of the statute was tried at the October term of the supreme judicial court. The case was ably conducted by County Attorney George W. Heselton of Gardiner, without my assistance as I was at the time engaged in some other important business. Mr. Heselton had made himself very familiar with the facts of the case, and conducted the trial with great skill and ability. While the evidence was conflicting, it seemed to lead to but one of two conclusions,—that either the defendant, Rose E. White, was guilty of wilful murder, or her husband had committed suicide as she claimed; and much to the surprise of the prosecuting officers the jury returned a verdict of manslaughter. The defense was conducted by E. W. Whitehouse, Esq., of Augusta. At the same term of court the defendant was sentenced to five years' imprisonment in the State's prison.

EMBEZZLEMENT.

State vs. Michael Foster. Early in December, 1897, the suspicion of the bank examiner was aroused as to the conduct of the treasurer of the Lubec Savings Bank, and as to the condition and solvency of that institution. This was followed by some extra investigation of the books and affairs of the bank, which led to the conclusion that its treasurer had been stealing the bank's funds for a long series of years, and of the insolvency of the bank, also that the treasurer was unable to restore the amount he had stolen. This the bank examiner reported to me, as required by law; but before doing so, on his petition, the affairs of the bank had been placed by the supreme judicial court in the hands of Gen. S. D. Leavitt of Eastport, as receiver. On

consultation with Gen. Leavitt it became evident that a careful examination of the books and affairs of the bank was necessary before proceeding to indict the treasurer. Whereupon I placed the books and affairs of the bank in the hands of two competent experts, John O. Rice of Portland, and R. E. Attwood, treasurer of the Lewiston Trust and Safe Deposit Company of Lewiston; and their report confirmed the examination of the bank examiner, showing that Foster had been guilty of embezzlement at different times of the funds of the depositors of the bank, running back as far as 1885. This he succeeded in covering up and concealing from the different bank examiners during this period of time, by a double system of bookkeeping, one which made the liabilities of the bank correspond with the assets that he had to show, and another, which was the true condition of the bank, showing the liabilities largely in excess of the resources. Fortunately the bank examiner had been able to get possession of the books of both systems of bookkeeping, so the proof to establish the facts was conclusive. From the report of the experts I was able to draw an indictment against Mr. Foster which was presented to the grand jury of Washington county at the June term in 1898. Foster and his friends had employed very able counsel, but after the indictments were returned and examined by them, his friends deemed it best for him to plead *nolo contendere*, and place himself at the mercy of the court. Mr. Foster is an old man and in poor health. It was thought by his friends that he would probably not live many years, and should he be sent to prison his health is such that his life would last but a short time, and in consideration of his friends making an effort to restore to the depositors of the bank as far as possible what he had stolen, his case was continued for sentence by Mr. Justice Haskell, who was sitting as justice at the term of court at which his plea was entered. What further disposition may be made of this case depends entirely upon the motion of the county attorney, and the discretion of the court. The extreme age and poor health of Mr. Foster, notwithstanding the seriousness of his crime, would seem to justify the course that has been taken.

CORONER'S INQUESTS.

Under the statute making it the duty of the attorney general to make useful suggestions in his report, my predecessor in office, Mr. Powers, in his report of 1893-4, suggests the repeal of chapter 296 of the Public Laws of 1887, which requires that evidence of all witnesses taken at an inquest shall, within ten days after the delivery of the verdict to the coroner, be filed by the coroner with the clerk of courts for the county in which said inquest was held, and remain open for public inspection; and with his suggestion that this is a stumbling block to the administration of justice, I fully concur. Certainly it has been found a stumbling block to the prosecution and a means of extraordinary usefulness to the defense in preparing for trial, and I agree with my predecessor that it does not aid in the establishment of the truth, and I wish to renew his suggestion that this provision of the statute, especially that of filing a copy of the evidence with the clerk of courts and having it left open for public inspection be repealed; and I am inclined to go further than this and to suggest what by some will doubtless be called a rank innovation; viz: that the law providing for coroner's inquests be repealed *in toto*, and that something more simple and less expensive be enacted in its place. The law as it now stands, chapter 139 of the Revised Statutes, as amended, provides that coroners "shall hold inquests on all bodies of such persons *only as appear, or are supposed, to have come to their death by violence, and not when it is believed that their death was caused by casualty.*" But the practice has come to be to hold a coroner's inquest in nearly every case of death by accident. By this means large bills are made for the county to pay, the value of the result obtained in no measure warranting the expense. Another practice has arisen, especially in cases of death by accident, for coroner's juries to append to their verdicts a statement as to whether or not in their judgment the corporation in whose employ the person killed was at the time of his death, is or is not responsible for the death, or that the death was or was not caused by the carelessness of some employer,—an attempt on the part of the coroner's jury to try a damage suit, and to try it *ex parte*. These results are generally brought about by the way the juries are made up, and the juries are generally

made up for this purpose, either to condemn or exonerate some person of carelessness in connection with the death. Such inquiry and such verdicts were never contemplated by the statute providing for coroner's inquests. They have no force to bind anyone to anything. The most they can do is to unfairly prejudice the public mind in one way or the other, either for or against some person or corporation. Such practice I consider most reprehensible. Therefore, I would respectfully suggest that the legislature be asked to inquire into the matter, and to devise some system for ascertaining the facts in case of death by violence, so that the evidence in such a case may be in some manner perpetuated until further development and determination before some proper tribunal, whose jurisdiction and authority shall be competent to render judgment upon the facts of the case. A board of inquiry of one or more physicians, regularly admitted to practice, and when deemed necessary providing for the presence of the county attorney, or sheriff of the county, or city marshal, or other proper officers, with the authority to summon witnesses and examine them and reduce the examination to writing, if necessary, would be a far superior system than the coroner's inquest as at present conducted, and would tend much more to the establishment of the truth, and be very much more economical.

And the provision of the law, chapter 51, section 65, Revised Statutes, providing that notice shall be given to county attorneys in case of fatal accident on railroads, and that a coroner shall be immediately called upon to hold inquest upon the body of him whose death has been so caused, to my mind has no practical use whatever. The most that can be done at such inquests is to obtain evidence in the interests of the deceased's representatives or of the railroad company, which may be used in a damage suit for the benefit of either one side or the other, and certainly this can all be done by the parties in interest as well as by the county attorney, and thereby relieve these poorly paid officials from what is many times an inconvenient, burdensome and useless task, and also relieve the county treasuries, which to-day are burdened with coroner's bills, from a large expenditure.

DETECTIVE WORK.

My attention has been called in several instances during the past two years to the matter of detective work, particularly in cases of homicide; and without casting any reflections upon any one whether in an official or private capacity, I have been led to the conclusion that it would be much better if a fund could be placed at the disposal of the attorney general with authority to employ detectives in such cases as in his judgment he deems expedient. Detective work ordinarily, should enjoin secrecy. Under the present system of employment of detectives, especially when done by private parties or upon offers of reward, or by citizens' committees, the work is made practically worthless for lack of secrecy. In some instances, I have noticed that the public, by means of the newspapers, has been as fully informed of what was going on as were the officers of the law. This was no more the fault of the detectives employed, than it was the fault of those employing them, and I should not say that it was anybody's fault, only the fault of the system. But I most earnestly recommend that the legislature make an appropriation to be at the disposal of the attorney general for the purpose of employing detectives, or in any other way obtaining evidence for the detection of crime. This would relieve the several county treasuries of some expense which they are now bearing, and on the whole, will not add anything to the general burden of the taxpayer. It will simply be a different method or system of expending money for detective work, which I think will produce better results. The attorney general, in the expenditure of this money, will naturally consult the county attorney, who will be interested in the case in which it is to be expended, so there will be no possible chance for friction to arise between the State's prosecuting officers in the county and the attorney general's office.

CAPITAL PUNISHMENT.

During the past two years I have had frequent inquiries as to the effect of the repeal of the law of capital punishment on the amount of homicide in this State. This has led me to make some investigations, the result of which I think it is proper for me to make a part of this report, as many of these inquiries are from our own citizens.

When Maine became a state, the crimes of treason, murder, arson, rape, burglary and robbery from the person by violence, were punishable with death by hanging. In 1829, the penalty for burglary, rape and robbery was reduced to imprisonment for life. In 1837, the law was changed so that murderers convicted and sentenced to be hung, should be confined in State's prison a year and a day before execution, and the executive was to issue his warrant ordering the execution, but not until a full record of the proceedings had been submitted to him. In 1844, the law was again changed, requiring that all persons under sentence of death should be confined at hard labor in the State's prison until the sentence was carried into effect. The discretion left with the executive by the law of 1837, was followed by a strong public sentiment against the death penalty, and there was no execution in this State for nearly thirty years. This condition of affairs led the Governor, in 1867, in his annual message, to suggest the abolition of the death penalty, or a change of the law so that the governor should be obliged to issue his warrant within some fixed time. In 1869, the law was passed requiring the governor and council to review the findings of the court in case of conviction and sentence of death and commute pardon or cause the prisoner to be executed after a certain length of time from the date of the original sentence. In 1870 and 1874, the governor entered another protest against this law of 1869, claiming it to be unconstitutional as it imposed judicial functions upon the executive department. In 1875, the law of 1869 was amended requiring the governor to issue his warrant within fifteen months from date of sentence. In 1876, the death penalty was altogether abolished. In 1883, the death penalty for murder alone was re-established. In 1885, it being evident by the unusual number of cold-blooded murders during the two years previous, that the re-establishment of the death penalty had not afforded the protection anticipated, the governor in his message recommended its abolishment. This became a matter of contention before the legislature, and it remained a matter of general discussion in the State until 1887, when the death penalty was again abolished; and I think it may now safely be said that the sentiment in favor of the abolition of capital punishment in Maine is such that it is not likely again to be re-established.

I have made a careful examination of the reports of the attorney generals relative to the crime of homicide for a period of a quarter of a century past with the following result, which it seems to me may be as good an answer to this general inquiry as can be ascertained from statistics. These statistics show, what I have found to be a fact by a further examination of the attorney generals' reports, and what I think will be found from a careful investigation of the crime of homicide within our State from earliest times, that the commission of this crime is not very much affected by the law providing the punishment for it. In some years there will be very few cases, and in other years many, as will be noticed from the statistics given below. If there is any argument to be deduced from this investigation, to my mind it sustains the position that when a person commits the crime of homicide, either premeditated or in the heat of passion, and especially as the result of an attempt to commit another crime, the question of the results of such acts is but little thought of, and the murderer little expects being brought to justice and sentence when the crime is committed.
