



REPORT.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine:

In compliance with the laws of the State, I submit to your distinguished consideration a brief report of the Maine State Library for the years 1897 and 1898.

During this period the library has received as a permanent addition 4,752 volumes, a catalogued list of which will be found in this report. It will be seen that the donations to the library are diminishing yearly, but that this loss is made good by the increase of exchanges.

The accessions by purchase are also somewhat less in number than during the preceding two years, the fund of the library being less and many of the books purchased having a greater cost per volume.

The appropriations for the past two years have not been found sufficient to meet the increased wants and necessities of the library. Not only has there been a persistent demand for many books which we are unable to purchase on account of lack of funds, but there has been also a rapid increase in the amount of work required of the librarian and his assistant. This demand for more service is likely to increase from year to year. With the near prospect of the establishment of a system of travelling libraries in the State, and with the certainty that the number of free public libraries will double within the next four years, it becomes apparent that the working force of the library should be increased by the constant employment of a second clerk.

LAW REPORTS.

There has been spent for law reports during the past two years about \$4,000, and for the same period about \$3,000 have been expended in the purchase of literary, historical, and scientific works. The balance of the appropriation has been used in pay-

ment for labor, for cataloguing the accessions to the library, and for the purchase of catalogue cards and other material needed in the administration and work of the department. Nearly all of the law books have been purchased to fill broken sets of those publications, and in keeping the various sets of reports, law journals, digests, and statutes, complete and up to date.

The scarcity of the Revised Statutes of Maine, and of Freeman's supplement thereto, has raised the price of these publications beyond a reasonable figure, yet in the administration of the affairs of this department it is found necessary to purchase every year twenty-five or thirty copies of each of these publications, in order to supply the courts and officers of the State with books to replace those worn-out, lost, or destroyed. The sum of not less than \$500 per annum will necessarily be required for the purchase of these books. This fact alone furnishes a strong argument in favor of the early revision and compilation of the Statutes of this State.

FREE PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

The number of free public libraries, during the past two years, has increased in about the same proportion as during the years of 1895 and 1896, but there has been a rapid increase in the number of library associations that have sprung up in almost every town and village along our coasts and in some of the interior parts of the State. A large number of these associations have expressed a determination to work for the establishment of free libraries in their several localities. Many of them were organized with that expressed purpose; and we may reasonably expect that within the next ten years the number of free public libraries will become so great that a town in the State which has not such a library will be a rare exception.

An inspection of the list of libraries in the State, found in this report, will disclose the fact that we are well on the road towards free public libraries. It is safe to say that there are to-day in this State not less than three hundred libraries which are ministering to the intellectual needs and requirements of the communities where they are established.

Great encouragement to the library movement in this State, is afforded by the gifts that have been bestowed on favored towns by the benevolence of public spirited and progressive citizens, and by former residents of those towns now living in distant states. Notable cases of this kind are found at Dover, Corinna, Southport, Ellsworth, and several other towns. The amount of these donations during the past two years, if fully computed, would prove to be not less than \$200,000.

Gifts of this nature cannot fail to meet the expectations of the donor by effecting great good and by honorably perpetuating his name. No institution of learning in the State of Maine has brought so great return at so little cost as has the free public library. It has proved itself to be from three to five times as useful as any library of equal size in which a tax or fee is charged for the books. Any system of libraries tending to exclude the poorer part of the community from its benefits, is, like all selfish enterprises, quite likely to prove of little benefit to mankind

VILLAGE AND BRANCH LIBRARIES.

Under the law of 1897, incorporated villages were authorized to establish libraries within their limits and to tax the inhabitants for that purpose in the same manner as towns. A town where a free library had been established, was authorized to establish branch libraries in other parts of its limits to the end that all the people could have a freer access to the books. It is somewhat disappointing that so few libraries in the State have seen fit to avail themselves of this privilege, and that no incorporated village has yet established a free library. Branch libraries could be used with beneficial effect in country towns containing two or more villages or centers. From the main library in a city, books could easily and cheaply be sent to delivery stations in the outskirts where literature and good reading are most needed. Such branches could also be used with effect for the benefit of pupils in our high and grammar schools, to which weekly or monthly remittances of suitable books could be made, subject to exchange as often as necessary.

It is evident that the law in regard to the loaning of books from the State library should be made more liberal, and that duplicate copies of valuable publications should be kept on file for loaning purposes only. The law in reference to free libraries should also be changed, authorizing cities and towns to raise the same amount for the use of associate libraries, as by law can now be raised for the libraries maintained wholly by a city or town.

DISTRIBUTION OF DOCUMENTS.

This department has been somewhat embarrassed as to its duty in the distribution of public documents and of department reports. We often have applications for these reports from distant parts of the country and from institutions of learning where there are no publications which can be given in exchange. The distribution of these reports and of the resolves and decisions of the court entails a large amount of labor and the expenditure of quite a sum for transportation. It would be eminently proper that an appropriation for the distribution of documents devolving upon this department should be made, distinct from the general appropriation for transportation.

If it be the duty of the State to print at a large expense the reports of its departments, it is equally its duty to see that such reports are properly distributed, and to the parties, persons, or institutions for which they are designed. In many instances it is manifestly impossible to do this, unless the mail or express charges are prepaid.

STEWART LIBRARY BUILDING, CORINNA, ME.

This building was conveyed to the town as a gift and dedicated with impressive ceremonies September 1, 1898.

Among the early settlers at Corinna, were the Rev. David Stewart, a Baptist minister, familiarly known as Elder Stewart, and Eliza Merrick, his wife. Both were teachers in their younger days and ever took a great interest in educational as well as religious matters. Their lives were spent in promoting the morals and enlarging the minds of the community where, beloved and respected by all, they lived and labored to a good old age.

The surviving children of this worthy couple, Hon. David D. Stewart of St. Albans, Me., Mrs. Elizabeth Winchester of Corinna, Me., and Levi M. Stewart of Minneapolis, Minn., have shown their affection and their desire to perpetuate the memory of such parents by the erection and furnishing of this building and library, and by the offering of it as a gift to the town of Corinna in which they all were born.

The building has a light, high basement thoroughly drained. The first floor contains a selectmen's room with a large vault, four offices, the rental of which is intended to help maintain the building, and also four rooms designed for the purposes of the library and reading room. All these are furnished with modern furniture and appliances, and the library proper contains at present 3,000 volumes.

The second floor is devoted to a large hall the size of the entire building. This room has been provided with a stage, drop curtain, and four pieces of excellent scenery, also with dressing rooms, light fixtures, and about five hundred opera chairs. Seven hundred persons can be comfortably seated here, if necessary. The entire structure is heated by steam and lighted by electricity. The exterior is rendered imposing by a tall tower containing a clock and surmounted by a weather vane. The

grounds are finely graded and although the shape of the lot is somewhat peculiar, it has a good elevation and has been so treated as to produce a most pleasing effect.

The building was constructed under the supervision of P. H. Coombs, civil engineer, of Bangor, Me. Its net cost is not yet computed, but is probably about \$60,000.

LIBRARY LAWS OF MAINE.

CHAPTER 233—PUBLIC LAWS, 1897.

An Act authorizing the establishment of Free Libraries in villages, and of branch libraries in towns and cities.

Section 1. Any incorporated village within this state located in a town where no free library exists, is hereby authorized and empowered to establish a library within its limits for the free use of all of its inhabitants; and to levy and assess a corporate tax and to appropriate therefrom for the foundation and commencement of such library, a sum not exceeding two dollars, and, for its maintenance and increase annually, a sum not exceeding one dollar per each ratable poll resident within such village corporate limits in the year next preceding. Such library so established and maintained shall be entitled to receive from the state treasury a sum equal to ten per cent of the amount annually raised and appropriated by the village corporation therefor. Village libraries established under this act shall be subject to all the duties and entitled to all the privileges prescribed by the laws relating to free public libraries in towns.

Section. 2. Any town in which there is a free public library is hereby authorized to establish and maintain under the same general management and control, such branches of the same as the convenience and wants of the citizens of said town seem to demand.

(Approved March 17.)

CHAPTER 193-RESOLVES OF 1880.

Resolve concerning the Transportation of Certain Books from the State Library.

Resolved, That the state librarian be and is hereby instructed to forward annually, by express or mail, to the clerks of the various towns and plantations in this State, all books that said towns and plantations are entitled to under the law; and that said librarian be further instructed to notify, by mail, such towns and plantations what books are forwarded, and to what office said books are sent; and a receipt from the express office forwarding the same shall be a sufficient voucher for said librarian; provided that nothing in this resolve shall authorize the State librarian to forward, or procure the printing of, any book or document of a past year which may not be conveniently spared from the library or which may be out of print.

Approved March 16, 1880.

CHAPTER 242—PUBLIC LAWS, 1893.

An Act to amend chapter fifty-five of the Revised Statutes, relating to Free Public Libraries.

Section 1. Section nine of chapter fifty-five of the Revised Statutes is amended by striking out all of said section and inserting the following:

Sect. 9. Any town may establish a free public library therein, for the use of its inhabitants, and provide suitable rooms therefor, under such regulation for its government as the inhabitants from time to time prescribe; and may appropriate, for the foundation and commencement of such library, a sum not exceeding two dollars, and for its maintenance and increase annually, a sum not exceeding one dollar, for each of its ratable polls in the year next preceding.

SECTION 2, CHAPTER 242—PUBLIC LAWS, 1893, AS AMENDED BY CHAPTERS 45 AND 110, PUBLIC LAWS, 1895.

Sect. 2. The municipal officers in any town or city where a free public library is established, shall annually, on the first day of May, certify to the governor and council the amount of money appropriated and expended by said town or city during the preceding year, for the purchase of books and documents for the use and benefit of such free public library, and for the payment of the running expenses thereof; and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall draw a warrant on the State treasurer for the purchase of books for the use of such library, for a sum equal to ten per cent of the amount expended by said town, as certified by its municipal officers.

SECTION 3, CHAPTER 242—PUBLIC LAWS, 1893, AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER III, PUBLIC LAWS, 1895.

'Sect. 3. Any town or city in which there is a library owned or controlled by a corporation or association, may appropriate a sum not exceeding five hundred dollars, and in cities or towns having more than ten thousand inhabitants, a sum not exceeding one thousand dollars yearly, to procure from such library the free use of its books for all the inhabitants of the town or city, under such restrictions and regulations as shall insure the safety and good usage of the books; and such library may then be considered a free public library, and said town or city shall be entitled to the benefits of the preceding section, provided, that any books and documents purchased with said State stipend, and all books and documents donated by the State, shall be and remain the property of said municipality.'

SECTION 4, CHAPTER 242, PUBLIC LAWS, 1893—AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER 53, PUBLIC LAWS, 1895.

Sect. 4. In every town and city where a free public library exists, the State librarian shall transmit to such library all laws, Maine reports, and other documents which the town or city is by law entitled to receive from the State, and the same shall be constantly kept in such library for the use and benefit of all the citizens; and the municipal officers of said town or city shall transfer to said library all the laws, Maine reports, and other documents, heretofore received from the State, and now in custody of any of the officers of said town or city; and the officers of said library, on or before the first day of April of each year, shall send to the State librarian a report containing a list of all books and documents purchased with the State stipend for the preceding year, and of all books and documents received from the State in said library. The aid from the State, hereby provided, shall be withheld from any town or city until the report herein required to be made on or before the first day of April of each year shall have been received by the State librarian. And the same shall also be withheld unless said report shall show that the laws, Maine reports, and other documents furnished to said town or city by the State are kept in said library as required by this act.

SECTION 5, CHAPTER 242, PUBLIC LAWS OF 1893.

Sect. 5. The State librarian is hereby authorized and directed to donate from the Maine State library to any town of less than fifteen hundred inhabitants, and having no free public library owned and controlled by the town, books purchased for that purpose not exceeding fifty per cent in value the books and documents purchased by said town for the purpose of founding a free public library therein; said donation in no case to exceed one hundred dollars.

Sect. 6. No town shall be entitled to the benefits of this provision, until its legal voters, at a regularly called town meeting,

have raised and appropriated not less than one hundred dollars for the purchase of books, and have provided for the care, custody, and distribution of its own books, and those to be donated by the State.

Sect. 7. The librarian or trustees of any free public library may ask the governor and council for advice in regard to the selection of books, and may receive instruction at the State library in cataloguing, and any other matters pertaining to the maintenance or administration of the library.

(Approved March 21, A. D. 1893.)

CHAPTER 271—PUBLIC LAWS, 1893.

An Act to amend chapter six of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, relating to County Law Libraries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Sect. 1. Chapter six of the Public Laws of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-seven as amended by chapter two hundred and twenty-one of the Public Laws of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, is hereby amended so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:
- Sect. I. The treasurer of each county shall pay to the treasurer of the Law Library Association of his county for the use and benefit of the county law library, twenty per cent of all funds actually paid into the county treasury for the violation of any of the provisions of chapter twenty-seven and of section one of chapter seventeen of the Revised Statutes, providing, however, that the sum so paid by the county treasurer shall not exceed five hundred dollars per annum.
 - Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when aproved.

Approved March 28, 1893.

CHAPTER 283—PUBLIC LAWS, 1889.

An Act providing for the Preservation of Local Histories, Financial and other reports of towns, cities, counties, and corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Sect. I. It shall be the duty of the librarian of the State library to collect from time to time and preserve copies of the history of the towns and counties of the State, when published, and all other publications relating to the material, social, and religious progress of the State.
- Sect. 2. Town clerks of the several towns, city clerks of the several cities, and treasurers of the several counties, shall promptly transmit to the librarian of the State library, copies of all reports of said towns, cities, and counties, including all exhibits of town, city, and county expenditures, provided that the provisions of this section shall apply to printed reports only.
- Sect. 3. The directors of all corporations doing business in the State shall transmit to the librarian of the State library, copies of all printed reports, relating to the affairs of said corporations.

Approved March 9, 1889.

CHAPTER 151—PUBLIC LAWS OF 1895.

An Act to secure the preservation of the Maine Reports, the Acts and Resolves, and other publications printed or purchased by the State for distribution to towns and various public officers.

- Sect. 1. All Maine reports, statutes, digests, acts and resolves, and other publications, printed or purchased by the State, and hereafter distributed according to law or custom, to the several towns and plantations within the State, shall be and remain the property of the State, and shall be held in trust by such towns or plantations for the sole use of the inhabitants thereof, and for no other purpose.
- Sect. 2. All such books and publications as may hereafter be furnished by the State, to any state, county or town officer, shall be and remain the property of the State, and shall be held in trust

by said officer, for the sole use of his said office; and at the expiration of his term of office or on his removal therefrom by death, resignation or other cause, such officer, or, if he be dead, his legal representatives, shall turn over to his successor in office all of said books and publications so furnished by the State and shall take receipt therefor.

Sect. 3. All Maine reports, Revised Statutes, Fublic Laws and Digests distributed by the State librarian to the several towns and public officers in said State, shall be plainly marked upon the cover and upon the title page with the following words: 'The property of the State of Maine, not to be sold.' and shall have a registered number conforming to the list to be made by the State librarian. Any town not retaining said volumes, shall not make any requisition upon the State librarian for their replacement, and shall forfeit all claims to be supplied with any further State publications.

Sect. 4. All acts or part of acts, all resolves or parts of resolves, inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Approved March 26.

CHAPTER 11—PUBLIC LAWS, 1887.

An Act authorizing Cities and Towns to accept Legacies, Devises, and Bequests, and to raise Money.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. I. Whenever the municipal officers of any city or town are notified in writing by the executors of any will, or by the trustees created by virtue of the terms thereof, that a devise or bequest has been made upon conditions, by the testator of said will, in behalf of said city or town, the municipal officers of said city or town, shall, within sixty days after said notice to them, call a legal meeting of the inhabitants of said city or town qualified to vote upon said city or town affairs. Said municipal officers shall give public notice in their warrants, of the object of

said meeting, and such other notice as said municipal officers shall deem proper. At such meeting, the said inhabitants shall vote upon the acceptance of said conditional gift, devise, or bequest, and if a majority of the legal voters present, then and there vote to accept said devise or bequest, in accordance with the terms contained in said will, and upon the conditions made by the testator, said municipal officers of said city or town, shall forthwith notify said executors or trustees in writing, of said acceptance by said city or town aforesaid, or the non-acceptance thereof.

Sect. 2. Whenever the executor or trustees, under any will, have fully discharged their duties respecting the payment, delivery or otherwise of any devise or bequest to said city or town, and said city or town have accepted said devise and bequest in accordance with the conditions of said will, as set forth in section one of this chapter, then said city or town shall perpetually comply, and strictly maintain and keep all the conditions and terms contained in said will, by virtue of which said devise or bequest was so made, and any city or town so accepting said gift, devise, or bequest and receiving the same, or enjoying the benefits therefrom, is hereby authorized to raise money to carry into effect the requirements and terms of said will, by virtue of which said gift, devise, or beguest was so accepted and received. The provisions of this chapter shall apply only to gifts, devises, and bequests, given, devised, and bequeathed to cities and towns for educational benevolent, and charitable purposes and objects, or for the care, protection, repair, and improvement of cemeteries owned by said cities or towns.

Sect. 3. This act shal take effect when approved.

Approved February 4, 1887.

CHAPTER 93—PUBLIC LAWS, 1887.

An Act to authorize Cities and Towns to accept Lands and Buildings as a Public Library or Art Gallery.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Any city or town in the State may accept by vote of the people thereof, any land, or land and buildings thereon, to be used as a public library or art gallery, or both combined; also any books, charts, or maps and any funds, the income of which to be used to purchase books, maps, or charts, and keep the same in order.

Approved March 11, 1887.

CHAPTER 55—REVISED STATUTES.

Laws for the Organization of Library Corporations.

- Sect. I. When seven or more persons desire to be incorporated as proprietors of a social, military, literary, scientific, or county law library; as a masonic lodge or chapter of any order or degree; as a lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows; as a division of the Sons of Temperance; as a tent of Rechabites; as a grange of Patrons of Husbandry; as a council of the Sovereigns of Industry; as a relief or benefit association for mutual assistance; as a monument or memorial association; as a society to promote temperance; as a village improvement society; or for any literary, scientific, musical, charitable, educational, social, miliary, agricultural, moral, religious, or benevolent purpose; they may apply in writing to any justice of the peace in the county, who may issue his warrant directed to one of the said applicants, requiring him to call a meeting thereof at such time and place as the justice appoints.
- Sect. 2. Such applicant may call it, by reading the warrant in the presence and hearing of each, or by leaving an attested copy thereof at his last and usual place of abode, at least fourteen days before the day of meeting, or by publishing an attested copy thereof in some newspaper printed in said county, for two weeks successively, the first publication to be at least fourteen days before the day of meeting.

- Sect. 3. When assembled pursuant to the warrant, they may organize themselves into a corporation, adopt a corporate name, and they, their associates, and successors may have continued succession; have a common seal; elect all necessary officers; adopt by-laws, not inconsistent with law, and enforce the same by suitable penalties; have the same rights and be under the same liabilities, as other corporations, in prosecuting and defending suits at law; and enjoy all other rights, privileges, and immunities, of a legal corporation.
- Sect. 4. Such corporation may take and hold by purchase, gift, devise, or bequest, personal or real estate, in all not exceeding in value one hundred thousand dollars, owned at any one time, and may use and dispose thereof only for the purposes for which the corporation was organized.
- Sect. 5. No corporation, organized for charitable or benevolent purposes, shall sue any of its members for dues or contributions of any kind, or be sued by any member for any benefit or sum due him; but all such rights and benefits, dues and liabilities shall be regulated and enforced only in accordance with its bylaws.
