To His Excellency, Llewellyn Powers, Governor, and the Honorable Executive Council:

GENTLEMEN: I have the honor to lay before you, as required by section seventy of chapter two of the Revised Statutes, the annual report of this department, in detail, as shown by the records of this office, for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1899.

REVENUE AND TAXATION.

The gross amount of receipts from all sources for the year just closed, was \$2,140,444.08 and the amount of cash on hand at the beginning of the year, was \$154,723.73, making a total amount of available cash for the year, of \$2,295,167.81.

The disbursements for the year, were \$2,095,645.65, leaving a cash balance on hand at the close of the year, of \$199,522.16, which amount exceeds the cash balance at the close of the year 1898, by \$44,798.43.

The tax assessed against cities, towns and organized plantations for the year 1898, has been paid in full.

For the information of the tax payers of the State, I have prepared and present herewith a table, showing at a glance, the

proportional part and percentage of the State tax paid by each of the three classes, viz: cities, towns and wild lands, and the amount and percentage of the school fund and mill tax received by cities and towns, for the year 1899. Also, the amount and percentage of net tax paid by each of the three classes, and the percentage of tax refunded in school money to the cities and the towns for said year, as follows:

As will be seen by the above table, after the deduction of the school fund and mill tax, the net State tax for the year 1899: paid by cities, is \$228,791.42, by towns, \$116,379.31 and by wild lands, \$45,825.16, which makes an average of \$1.59 1-5 for cities, of 68 4-5 cents for towns and of \$2.75 for wild lands on each \$1,000 of valuation placed upon the property by the State assessors.

No city receives as much school money as it pays State tax, while 237 towns and plantations, or 47 2-5 per cent of the entire number in the State, receive more school money than they pay State tax.

BONDED DEBT.

In the past year the sum of \$50,000 was paid toward the liquidation of the bonded debt and \$69,440 was paid as interest on the same, making the total sum of \$119,440 paid on the principal and as interest on this debt, in the past year.

On January 1, 1890, the bonded debt of the State was \$2,748,800, and at the present time it is \$2,153,000, showing a reduction, in the past ten years, of \$595,800.

The amount of interest paid on this debt in that period was \$767,270. Therefore, in the past ten years, the aggregate sum

paid as interest and toward the liquidation of the bonded debt of the State, was \$1,363,070.

TEMPORARY LOANS.

A temporary loan of \$150,000, as shown by my last report, was outstanding on January 1, 1899, which became payable during the year just closed. Of this loan, \$100,000 fell due March 2nd, and the balance, \$50,000, became due May 12th. These loans were paid at maturity, but in order to meet them and the current expenses of the State, it became necessary to procure further temporary loans to the amount of \$200,000, of which sum, \$100,000 was negotiated March 2, 1899, payable in one year, and the balance, \$100,000, was procured May 12, 1899, on twenty-one months' time. Both loans were placed with the Augusta Savings Bank, Augusta, Maine, and are now outstanding, and bearing interest at the rate of two and three-fourths per cent per annum and three per cent per annum, respectively.

The expenses of the recent war with Spain made it necessary for the last legislature to authorize temporary war loans to meet the obligations caused by this extraordinary demand upon the State treasury, and as authorized by chapters three and seventy-one of the Resolves of 1899, temporary war loans amounting to \$150,000 were negotiated. Of these loans, \$100,000 was placed with E. H. Gay & Co., Boston, Mass., January 23, 1899, payable in one year and bearing interest at two and three-fourths per cent per annum, and \$50,000 with the Augusta Savings Bank, Augusta, Maine, on October 19, 1899, payable in two years and bearing interest at the rate of three and three-fourths per cent per annum.

STATE HOUSE.

*To His Excellency, the Governor, and the Executive Council
of the State of Maine:*

The committee appointed under the authority of section 71, chapter 2 of the Revised Statutes, to examine the accounts of the Treasurer of the State for the fiscal year ending December 31, 1899, would respectfully report that they have carefully examined said accounts, and find the same to correspond with the amounts as stated in his report.

The amount of cash on hand at the commencement of the fiscal year, January 1, 1899, was \$154,723.73.

The receipts from various sources for the year 1899 were \$2,140,444.08, making a total of \$2,295,167.81.

The expenditures for the year have been \$2,095,645.65, leaving a balance in the treasury on December 31, 1899, of \$199,522.16.

The bonded indebtedness of the State January 1, 1899, was \$2,203,000, as follows: \$1,934,000 bearing 3 per cent interest; \$150,000 bearing 4 per cent interest; \$118,300 bearing 5 per cent interest; and \$700 due October 1, 1889, not presented for payment.

Of the above bonded indebtedness, \$50,000 was paid during the year 1899, leaving the amount of the same at the beginning of the fiscal year 1900, \$2,153,000.

A temporary loan of \$100,000 was made January 23, 1899, on one year's time, and one of \$50,000 was made October 19, 1899, on two years' time, both for war purposes. A temporary loan of \$100,000 was made March 2, 1899, on one year's time, and one of \$100,000 May 12, 1899, on twenty-one months' time.

The temporary loan of \$150,000 outstanding January 1, 1899, has been paid.

The committee, in the presence of the State Treasurer, Hon. F. M. Simpson, destroyed by burning six notes of \$25,000 each, representing the temporary loan outstanding January 1, 1899, and registered bond No. 453 for \$33,000, and registered bond No. 452 for \$17,000, and registered bond No. 517 for \$15,000, for which said last mentioned bond, a new bond has been issued; and have certified to the amount of each of said notes and bonds destroyed.

The committee has verified all trust deposits, a list of which appears in the Treasurer's report.

The committee in making the examination, received valuable assistance from the State Treasurer, and C. B. Caldwell and D. W. Emery and M. W. Wiswell, his efficient clerks.
